DEMOBILIZATION

. . . Dream'd again the flags of kings, highest born, to flaunt unrival'd?
O hasten, flag of man! O with sure and steady step, passing highest flags of
kings,

Walk supreme to the heavens, mighty symbol—run up above them all,
Flag of stars! thick-sprinkled bunting!

UNDER the flag the many ships are arriving safely home
bearing their thousands of shouting, waving, joyous heroes.
The great army of the greatest republic is returning glory
laden from the fields of France, where it served to turn back forever
the tide which had for four years menaced the entire world with the
doctrine that "might is right." Its martial task is done! Freedom
lives! Justice is preserved!

Soon the great army will cease to be, except as it shall live in the
minds of men who were a part of it and the citizens of the world for
whom it so gloriously fought. Over the broad land its heroes are
scattering, each seeking the peaceful occupation and home which the
freedom of the New World made possible, but which they hastened
to leave when the flag of stars sent forth its call. The vast, won-
derful army is demobilizing. Home its heroes are going with many
tales to tell of the journey to France, of the dark days in the
trenches, of uncertainty, disheartenment, and suffering, but most of
all of the work of unflinching effort; America's effort which made
for victory. The "flag of man" is run up above them all.

But shining out from the "thick-sprinkled bunting," eloquent of
all that is valorous and courageous, are the gold stars, symbolizing

the sacrifice made that this great nation might not perish from the earth. To the service flag of the Σ A E are to be added these symbols for the following:

Capt. Frank Henry Knight, New York Mu, died of pneumonia, October 28, at a base hospital in Portsmouth, England. He was commandant of the Airdrome Hospital at Ft. Junction, England. Before he entered the Medical Corps in May, 1917, he was connected with Kings Co. Hospital, St. Johns Hospital, and the Swedish Hospital, New York.

Thomas W. Brittain, Maine Alpha, was killed in action July 18, in the Argonne Forest.

Lt. Theodore K. Bushnell, New York Alpha, is dead in France, the date and cause of his death being at present unknown. He enlisted in the Officers' Reserve Corps on May 10, 1917, and was assigned to Fort Riley, Kansas. He received a commission August 14 as second lieutenant of infantry, was discharged from the camp, and on the same day enlisted in the National Army. He arrived in France on September 23, and was ordered to the first school of military instruction, being assigned later to Co. B, 2d Machine Gun Corps, regular army. He was in some of the hottest fighting in France, having taken part in the battle of Soissons. The news of Lieutenant Bushnell's death came to his father in a letter from a Red Cross nurse who was with him during his short illness.

The name of Lt. Harris E. Petree, Washington City Rho, is reported among the American aviators who met their death in 1918. In connection with Lieutenant Petree's death the Paris office of the A. R. C., under date of June 18, cabled: "Aviator Merriam Cooper with assistance Red Cross visited regions and reports following: 'Lt. Harris E. Petree, Pilot 139th Aero Squadron, killed September 26. Buried Cemetery de Lut, Southeast Longuyon. Killed combat one hour against seven enemy scout planes. Several opportunities to escape, but returned again and again. Hero of village; made name of American symbol courage and fortitude. Mailing sworn statement of this officer's heroism.'" Lieutenant Petree had a thrilling experience and narrow escape from death while doing his "solo" stunts at Mineola before sailing for France.

Lt. Earl M. Hoisington, Washington Alpha, died at Rosecrans Base Hospital, near San Diego, of pneumonia following an injury which he received in an accident on the aviation field. Hoisington was graduated from Lewis and Clark High School in the class of

1914 and was a student of the University of Washington when he was selected for the Second Officers' Training Camp at Presidio. He was commissioned there and was transferred to the Aviation Corps last January. He was commissioned a flier in May and later was made chief instructor in the training department at Rockwell Field.

Sgt. Stephen G. Sherman, Minnesota Alpha, was killed in action in the battle of Chateau Thierry, June 6, 1918, and was posthumously decorated with the Distinguished Service Cross by General Pershing.

Capt. Albert S. MacDonnell, Texas Rho, died of wounds received on the battlefield in France, December 22, at St. Lezair, the port of debarkation in France. He was severely wounded by a bomb and was sent to a hospital at St. Lezair, from which port he was to have been sent home. MacDonnell entered the First Officers' Training Camp at Leon Springs and was commissioned second lieutenant of the 359th infantry and was stationed at Camp Travis. A little later he was promoted to a first lieutenantcy and named aide to Gen. Wm. H. Johnson. Lieutenant MacDonnell went overseas with the 91st Division, where he was made captain about the time he was wounded.

G. C. Gorham, Washington Alpha, was killed in action in France on October 10. He was a private in Borden Battery, 1st Canadian Machine Gun Brigade. At the time of entering the service he was specializing in forestry, enlisting in a forestry unit in the Canadian forces before the United States entered the war. He later was transferred to a combat unit.

Lt. Rodney Polack, Pennsylvania Alpha-Zeta, Lt. Stewart L. Marlow, Washington City Rho, are reported killed in action and H. E. Wood, Illinois Psi-Omega, was killed in an aviation accident at Kelly Field, Texas. L. B. Faulk, Louisiana Tau-Upsilon, previously reported "missing in action," is now reported killed in action on or about March 25, 1918. William M. Ballew, Illinois Psi-Omega, was lost when the *Tuscania* was torpedoed.

Florida Upsilon has three names to add to its High Honor Roll. Paul L. Willoughby, C. O. T. S., died of influenza December 2, 1918, at Gainesville, Florida. Willoughby was given a military funeral, eight Σ A Es acted as pall-bearers and others constituted a firing squad. Lt. Richard Ray White was killed in action Septem-

ber 12, 1918, and Lt. James A. Johnson was killed in action on October 9, 1918, having been previously reported missing.

Sgt. Dexter W. Ramsey, Kentucky Epsilon, died of pneumonia at Nashville, Tennessee, on Christmas day. He enlisted as a private in the 422d Engineers in December, 1917, became a corporal and then a sergeant, and had been recommended for a commission as lieutenant when the armistice was signed.

Brief and incomplete reports have been received of the death of Lt. Raymond Douthitt, Indiana Alpha, September 19, 1918; Sgt. Ralph A. Branch, Kansas Alpha, September 18, 1918; W. J. Phillips, Louisiana Epsilon; Capt. J. B. Sanford, Louisiana Epsilon; Lt. Clifford Harold Kelley, Nebraska Lambda-Pi; Paul Edward Corriveau, New Hampshire Beta; Joseph Charles Monnier, Ohio Sigma, October 1, 1918; Murray K. Spidle, Ohio Sigma, August 2, 1918; Lt. Jas. Newpher, Pennsylvania Alpha Zeta, killed in action; Merle X. Boyer, Pennsylvania Delta, October 9, 1918; Fred Clarke, Pennsylvania Chi Omicron, October 23, 1918; Harold E. Rowland, Pennsylvania Chi Omicron; Kirk Monroe, Virginia Omicron.

An interesting picture, which will be reproduced in a future issue, has been forwarded by Capt. Benjamin P. Burpee, New Hampshire Alpha, showing six officers confined in the main American prisoner of war camp at Villingen, Baden, Germany. The officers are Lt. Horace P. Wells, Colorado Chi; Lt. W. M. Weaver, Louisiana Epsilon; Capt. Horace Z. Landon, Massachusetts Delta; Capt. Benjamin P. Burpee, New Hampshire Alpha; Capt. W. E. Chickering, Pennsylvania Theta; and Lt. Rowan H. Tucker, Texas Rho.

Maj. Gen. Henry Jervey, Tennessee Omega, Assistant Chief of Staff, the Fraternity's highest ranking officer, has been named by the French Government a commander of the Legion of Honor.

The French War Cross was presented in May to William H. McNaughton, Virginia Omicron, who has driven an ambulance in France since June, 1917, with the Convaive Automobiles, S. S. U. 628. "Swede" Sellers, Tennessee Omega, has been highly commended for conspicuous gallantry under fire and decorated with the Croix de Guerre, and Pilot Walter C. Jepson, U. S. A. Flying Corps, Nevada Alpha, has received a similar decoration.

Charles "Zip" Leshner, Arizona Alpha, is with the Marines in France and has made a wonderful record. He was awarded the

Croix de Guerre for conspicuous gallantry in action and promoted to captain during the last drive. He was wounded in the early part of the summer and again on August 5. The following letter was received by Lesher's father from the brigadier general of the United States Medical Corps: "Dear Mr. Lesher: It gives me great pleasure to be able to write you that your son, Lt. Charles Z. Lesher, was recommended by the Regimental Commander, 6th Regiment Marines, A. E. F., for suitable reward for distinguished service in the face of the enemy because of the conspicuous act of gallantry set after his name: '1st Lt. Charles Z. Lesher, 76th Co., conspicuous in the attack upon and demolition of a formidable machine gun nest in the Bois de Belleau on June 10. Throughout this engagement he showed conspicuous ability and bravery, advancing his platoon under intense enemy machine gun fire, routing the enemy, and capturing guns and prisoners.' "

Maj. Charles P. Wood, New York Alpha, mentioned in the December number as decorated for valor, was commissioned first lieutenant, Engineers' R. C., April 17, 1917, and was ordered to active duty September 2, 1918, assigned to the 30th Engineers on September 19. In October he was promoted to captain and appointed battalion engineer officer. Later he was made regimental adjutant. Wood sailed for France with his organization on December 25 and was with the British Expeditionary forces in Flanders and Picardy from January to March, 1918, and with the American and French from April to August in 1918. In June he took command of Co. C, 30th Engineers, and was with them in their operations at the front during June and July. He was with the French and Americans between St. Mihiel and Pont a Mousson and near Luneville, the company making gas attacks on the enemy as well as doing front line outpost duty. During this period twelve members of this company, including the company commander, were recommended for the Croix de Guerre. He was promoted to major and ordered back to the United States in August, 1918, to organize the Third and Fourth Battalions, 1st Gas Regiment.

Sgt. Edward G. Eichelberger, Pennsylvania Delta, was the first to enlist from the Gettysburg Academy and at that time he was only sixteen years old. He was wounded while in action and cited for distinguished service.

Lt. Roland H. Neel, Alabama Alpha Mu, has already been reported for his distinguished service, but the new accounts must be

recorded. He graduated as second lieutenant in Coast Artillery at Fortress Monroe, Virginia, in August, 1917, and sailed overseas in September of the same year. Shortly after his arrival in France he volunteered for service as an aerial observer and attended wireless and aerial photographic schools in France. After receiving his license as an official observer and serving in that capacity for two or three months with the French army at the front, he was then assigned to the 99th American Aero Squadron with which he won the Distinguished Service Cross. Lt. Neel has had several close calls in air battles, having one fall that smashed his machine and instantly killed his pilot. He was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for extraordinary "heroism in action." At the battle of Frappelle in August, 1918, the cross was presented to him by Maj. Gen. Patrick, head of the Aero Service. He was also active in the great St. Mihiel drive in September, where he was again cited for his daring work. In October, 1918, he was promoted to first lieutenant and transferred to the 7th Army Corps as operation officer, and is now with the 3rd Army of Occupation.

First Lt. Oscar B. Myers, New York Mu, has been awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for heroism in an air battle near Cierges on September 28. He and two other aviators encountered nine German aeroplanes and routed them. Myers brought down one of the Germans by diving at him and crushing him to the ground.

Lt. Henry M. Dennis, Minnesota Alpha, was cited for exceptional leadership and personal bravery in the Dwina campaign. He has been awarded British decorations for gallantry. Dennis attended the Officers' Training School at Fort Sheridan in 1917, and won his commission as second lieutenant. He was then sent to Camp Custer and overseas in 1918. In September he was transferred to Archangel.

Arizona Alpha reports that "Pledge" Ira F. Harbison had the honor of being three days in the service, having been called from college for a contingent leaving there the same day the armistice was signed. "Pledge Harbison feels that he is a veteran." Lt. Jas. A. Long of the Aviation Corps was injured in New York by an aeroplane accident. The machine was demolished and "Tong" was seriously injured, but the last report states that he is convalescing. Lt. Wm. W. Pickerell received the highest rating given at his training camp in France.

August R. Brindley, Alabama Mu, Army War College from October to December, was commissioned lieutenant colonel, J. A., November 15, 1918, and assigned to the office of the Judge Advocate General December 1, 1918. W. C. Agnew, Jr., New York Mu, was with the Field Artillery in France acting as interpreter. Lt. Lawrence Reynolds is on the surgical staff of the A. R. C. Hospital at Neuilly, near Paris. Word has been received that Capt. Samuel S. Froehlich, Pennsylvania Delta, is now convalescent in a hospital in France. "I guess you didn't know I was wounded," writes Froehlich, "but here I am in the hospital after the fuss."

Lt. J. Frank Lindsey, Indiana Gamma, is in France and has seen much active service. He was gassed, and recently a cable was received from him stating that he had been wounded, but no further information is now available. Ward Gilbert and his brother, Ralph, were both stationed at the Great Lakes Training Station. Venice D. Keyser has been with the 334th Field Artillery, France, having received his commission at Chillicothe, Ohio. Lt. Reid McCain has been an observer in the Aeroplane Division, and Virgil Eikenberry has been on detached service, both of them overseas.

Lt. Wm. Y. Smiley, Minnesota Alpha, went to France with the Field Artillery.

Dr. George H. Kress, Ohio Epsilon, who will be remembered as one of last year's commissioners of the Los Angeles Athletic Club, and who has been in the service as the senior surgeon of the University of Southern California, Students' Army Training Corps, has just been mustered out and is again in private practice. He has had a most interesting experience during the last few months. In the University of Southern California S. A. T. C., a total of 919 students were inducted into the U. S. Army. The staff of officers included two colonels and some twenty-five lieutenants, as well as a medical staff of six surgeons. These student soldiers had hardly been inducted into service in September, when the influenza showed itself. At that time the barracks at Exposition Park had not been completed for the Government and there were no hospital facilities. Dr. Kress, as dean of the State University Medical Department at Los Angeles, offered the North Broadway College buildings in this emergency. The government accepted the offer, and over night, as it were, stoves, kitchen, and hospital equipment were put in, with the aid of the American Red Cross. Over 500 soldiers in this unit went

down with the influenza, but the death toll was comparatively low. Some twenty-two women nurses, some thirty soldier war orderlies, and a half dozen lieutenants and surgeons, of which number Dr. Kress was one, contracted the influenza while laboring for their sick fellows.

Albert Woods, Tennessee Omega, is with the Marines in France. It is also reported that Ray Palmer of the same chapter has gone to Germany with the Army of Occupation.

Maj. G. Murrell Alexander, Virginia Theta, writes from France on October 12: "Things happened rapidly. We were not relieved on the tenth as expected, but forces consolidated and everything made ready for a fresh start. On the tenth, at 12:45, I was unlucky enough to get in the way of a piece of shell which struck me in the leg. Was lucky, too, as one piece went clear through about two inches below the knee. A fragment stayed in my leg above the knee. No bones were broken and my knee was not hit. The shelling was so heavy on the paths back of us that it was the next morning before I got to the rear on a litter. Rather a rough trip. Caught an ambulance there and went back several miles, giving me my first glimpse of the rear of a big battle. The road was jammed with a steady stream going each way—troops, trucks, artillery, field kitchens, and numerous other assortments. On each side of the road troops were bivouacked, mostly artillery and the big guns, a continuous line of them were booming away. We finally got back to a town about twenty-five miles in the rear to the evacuation hospital. Had something hot to eat. Had been living off a ~~dim~~ allowance of canned salmon and hard tack, so you know what a treat it was.

"October 14. Have been moved further back to a base hospital. Am very comfortable, getting the most expert attention. Had my wounds stitched up this morning. Only one piece of shrapnel went in behind and above the knee. Will be in the hospital about a week, but it will be a month or six weeks before I get back on active duty."

Frank G. Carrington, Tennessee Nu, is with the 17th R. R. Engineers. Capt. John A. McNaughton, Virginia Omicron, saw active service with the British, having been billeted with them at Ypres. Ensign E. Koch, New York Sigma-Phi, U. S. N. R., was commissioned on June 6, 1918, and was later assigned to duty on the U. S. S. *Northern Pacific* as junior watch officer, and in all has made five trips to France convoying troops. Capt. Earl W. Jennings, Kansas

Alpha, who was stationed at Honolulu, is now with the A. E. F. at Vladivostok.

Wisconsin Phi, with its last report of new names, almost doubled its honor roll, while Massachusetts Delta adds forty-five names, and Nevada Alpha thirty-nine.

North Carolina Theta reports that B. F. Hagood, ensign, U. S. N. R. F., is now the commanding officer of the U. S. S. *Manitou*. Hagood entered the service April 25, 1918. James A. Patillo, Georgia Epsilon, has been with the Y. M. C. A. in France since June. Paul R. Rothery, New Hampshire Alpha, enlisted June 17 with the 14th Engineers and was among the first to leave for France. Capt. Allen Driscoll Rooke is in command of Co. F, 803d Pioneer Infantry, and was at the front when the armistice was signed. Ensign DeWitt S. Stillman, also of New Hampshire Alpha, has been stationed since December 17 at the Navy Yard, Philadelphia. Lt. Herbert Jenness, New Hampshire Beta, is at Camp Meade, Maryland with the 63d Infantry. Col. H. T. Bull, Massachusetts Gamma, has been acting chief of staff at Camp Meade. Corp. Glen H. Mosely, Nebraska Lambda Pi, is with the 484th Aero Squad, France.

North Carolina Theta adds nineteen new names to the Honor Roll. Twenty-eight new names are added by Indiana Alpha.

Maj. T. W. Bancroft, California Alpha, who was a surgeon in New York, gave up his practice and after receiving his commission as major sailed overseas with one of the first mobile hospitals to leave this country.

Henry MacPherson Merriam, California Alpha, was commissioned second lieutenant, C. A., U. S. A., in 1908, served as aide to Gen. Charles King during the Philippine campaign and also through the Pekin campaign, was later aide on the staff of his father, the late Maj. Gen. H. C. Merriam. At the time of the declaration of war with Germany, Major Merriam was stationed at Ft. Casey, Washington. He was promoted to the grade of lieutenant colonel and transferred to the Quartermaster's Department, being made chief quartermaster of the 31st Division (Sunset) under command of Gen. H. Liggett. With this organization he went to France. Later he received the grade of colonel and was promoted to be chief quartermaster of the Fifth Army Corps.

Lt. J. Theodore Morris, Pennsylvania Delta, is perhaps the first man to fly to his home for a Thanksgiving dinner. Lieutenant Morris arrived at Gettysburg at the noon hour on Wednesday before Thanksgiving from Spring Gove. He was driving a Curtiss biplane and gave a most interesting demonstration, attracting the people into the streets to watch him. Lieutenant Morris left Mineola, Long Island, on Tuesday and landed at Spring Grove where he was well acquainted. He arrived there about 4:30 and later in the evening came to Gettysburg to locate a landing place. Returning to Spring Grove on Wednesday morning, he left there after 11:30, giving first an exhibition over that town, and then sailed for Gettysburg, arriving about noon.

Ensign L. A. Hammer, Wisconsin Alpha '17, writes from the Naval Air Station, Pensacola, Florida:

"I called a meeting of all the Σ A Es at this station and we had some turnout. We are well represented by men from the North, West, South, and East; in fact, among the student aviators about seventy-five per cent are fraternity men and the longest per cent of them are Σ A Es. Dr. E. E. Reese, Tennessee Zeta '88, was the host of the evening. He has a wonderful bungalow at "Big Bayou." It is always open to the boys. Among those at the fireside we had officers, student officers, enlisted men, and one marine. These men will soon be commissioned and some will be put on in active duty, while some will stay here and instruct in different kinds of machines. Many of the brothers have come and gone without any of the men getting in touch with them and at present we know of several brothers, but it is impossible to find them in such a large station.

"Among the officers, we have Stickley, instructing on bombing with H. S.—one boat. Wood is piloting the dizzy 't' boats. Student Officer Sparling is now instructing on H sixteens and I am turning out instructors on H ones. I try to give the brothers a dizzy ride in H ones every few days and at present Brothers Doyle and Smith are being made instructors for HS ones. We chase gulls, crows, and now and then we do a nice little hop down the Gulf. O yes! Please send us a few RECORDS as none of the brothers have seen any for some time.

Levere, who is now with the Army of Occupation, writes: "I had a card from Lieutenant Leue from a French seaport. I met

Captain Buck of Texas Rho here yesterday and Lieutenant Ewing of Michigan Iota-Beta today.' I hope you have time to make a note of these names I mention and get them right on your list. For instance, if they have 'Buck,' he is probably still listed as a lieutenant. Our General Jervey is now a major general. Lt. Lauren Foreman, Georgia Epsilon, being an older alumnus, may be a name his chapter has not listed. I suppose by now Illinois Psi-Omega has Capt. George Keefers who is in France; also has seen that David Wallace is a captain and not a lieutenant. I have not seen Eric Dawson since March 10. I think I wrote you he had gone into the army some months ago. I think it is allowable for me to tell you that he is at Havre." And again, in another letter, Billy writes: "Our good friend, Lt. Dick Habbe, was one of these and it seemed good to see him after we had tried and hoped to see each other for so long. Another old friend whom I found here (Habbe is at Neu-wied) is Maj. B. R. Williams, Pennsylvania Omega, who is judge advocate of the Third Division, the division to which I am attached in the Army of Occupation. In his office is Lieutenant Moore, Pennsylvania Chi-Omicron. Another Σ A E who is about sixteen kilometers from here whom I met the other day is Capt. Enoch Ensley, Tennessee Omega. Pvt. Douglas Power (Co. C, 5th Bn., Signal Corps), of Kentucky Epsilon, has just come to town and I am going to try tomorrow to get him detained to assist me in my work. Edwin Ely, New York Sigma Phi, is here with me in 'Y' work."

Perhaps the most interesting event in the rapidly growing history of Σ A E was the initiation held at Tours, France, by Brother Levere in the presence of twenty-eight members of the Fraternity on December 5, 1918. In reference to this initiation and Σ A E interests in France, Brother Hare writes from Paris:

"I have been attempting to write you ever since our initiation meeting at Tours, but have found myself so busy with new matters since the armistice that I have not found time to do it until this moment. I am sure you will recognize that the initiation is epochal in the history of the Fraternity. The next important meeting which we held was upon the occasion of Billy Levere's farewell before joining the Army of Occupation in Germany. I have since had a letter from him, the first I have received from Germany, from which I quote as follows: 'It is now within forty minutes of 1919 and as I can find no evidence of an attempted celebration, I think I will try

and get to bed so that when I pass into the New Year I shall do so unconsciously. I shall never regret 1918. It has been a great year in my life. I shall never regret France but hope that 1919 will see me in America.' Just before Billy left for Germany we arranged a little dinner for him which was highly successful. I enclose herewith a copy of a notice, the substance of which appeared in all of the English papers in Paris:

'The monthly dinner of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Alumni Association in France at the American University Union Wednesday night was in the nature of a farewell dinner to Judge William C. Levere, one of the fraternity's high officials and known to fraternity men all over the United States. Judge Levere, who, as a Y. M. C. A. secretary has endeared himself to every Amex in and around Neufchateau and who is known to them as "Billy," leaves this week for Coblenz to be attached to the Army of Occupation, where he will continue his remarkable work with the "doughboys."

'Officers for the Alumni Association, which has a charter from the general fraternity, were elected for the coming year as follows: President, Russell I. Hare, 39 Boul. Haussmann, Paris; first vice-president, Capt. Hugh H. Tolman, M. T. C.; second vice-president, P. R. Carpenter, Foyer du Soldat; secretary, J. C. Fraser, A. R. C., Hotel Regina. Judge Levere was made honorary president. A large number was present and the occasion will add another chapter to the Fraternity's history, which already has three alumni associations in France and which has conducted one initiation on French soil.'

'Billy was at his best, in his new uniform and equatorial belt. He was then, and always is, as one might say in French, *tout a fait* Σ A E. He thinks Σ A E, dreams Σ A E, and lives it every day.

'This Saturday night we will have another gathering, the regular monthly dinner, and we shall continue to hold them as long as there is one man left in France, and that may be some time for the writer expects to reside here indefinitely.

'This brings up also a question of policy, since I may sooner or later have the honor to alone represent the Fraternity in France. At the present time we have a complete corps of officers and a substantial membership, but the time may come when these soldiers will leave for America. It will be of advantage to know whether there

little concern the result of the investigation into the system prevailing in the Army for subjecting men to court-martial and administering punishment. Lt.-Col. Samuel T. Ansell, for the greater part of the war Acting Judge Advocate General of the Army, has boldly taken the ground—based upon his experience in the office of the Judge Advocate General—that the system is not conducive to justice but that it lends itself easily to arbitrary and unjust action. He asserts, and the records have furnished him a vast array of support, that the enlisted man brought to trial before a military court does not enjoy the protection of *law* but is subject chiefly to the will of the men sitting on the court, or of their superior officers.

So great has been the impression created by the testimony of Ansell that the whole matter has engaged the attention of the Congress, the War Department, the American Bar Association, and the large mass of the public who are anxious that the enlisted men get a square deal when they are brought before a military tribunal.

The Bureau of War Risk Insurance has announced the completion of six forms of policies into which the war time term insurance may be converted, and has published a booklet showing the rates on each of the converted forms. No definite date has been set for inaugurating the conversion campaign. For the present, the great drive is to impress upon the men the desirability of conserving their insurance by the prompt payment of premiums.

The Revenue Act of 1918 expressly exempts from tax “all amounts paid as dues or fees to a fraternal Society, Order or Association operating under the lodge system.”

Fraternity Dues Non-taxable The Internal Revenue Bureau has issued a pamphlet explaining and giving examples of, the operation of the Revenue Act of 1918 as compared with the Revenue Act of 1917, which imposed a tax on dues and fees. This pamphlet is known as “Regulations No. 43 (Revised), Part II, relating to the tax on dues under the Revenue Act of 1918,” and may be secured by writing to the Office of the Commissioner of Internal Revenue, Washington, D. C.



IN MEMORIAM



JAMES A. JOHNSON

Lt. James A. Johnson, Florida Upsilon, was born in Chattanooga, Tennessee, and was killed in action in France on October 9, 1919. He was twenty-six years old, the son of Mrs. Gorda Johnson, 525 Third Street South, Saint Petersburg, Florida.

Lieutenant Johnson, or "Jim," as he was known to his friends in Gainesville, graduated from the College of Agriculture at the University of Florida in 1916 and attended one of the first officers' camps at Fort Oglethorpe, Georgia. He was commissioned in the regular army and sailed for France in April, 1918.

Having been previously reported missing, it was hoped that Lieutenant Johnson would be found in a German prison camp. The news of his death, however, was received from the thick of the fight, where he had been wounded and gassed several times, each time recovering and returning to his company.

HUNTER McCLURE, '10

Lt. Hunter McClure, of the 21st U. S. Engineers, died of disease in France on September 26, 1918.

McClure was born in Rome, Georgia, on December 23, 1887, and came to Cornell after having taken the degree of B. S. in C. E. in 1908 at the Georgia School of Technology. Having spent several summers in engineering work and having many advanced credits, he spent only a year at Cornell and received the degree of C. E. in 1910.

From September, 1909, to September, 1910, he was employed on railroad work, but left it to spend a year as instructor in mechanics in Sibley College. From June, 1911, to March, 1912, he served as draftsman for the American Bridge Company at various plants and in the New York office and then spent a year on railroad work, principally on the construction of the Payette River Bridge for the Idaho Northern Railway.

In March, 1913, he reentered the employ of the American Bridge Company but left in July to take a position as draftsman in the bridge department of the Chesapeake & Ohio Railway, where he designed many new structures and investigated the strength of existing ones. In November, 1914, he entered the division of valuation of the Interstate Commerce Commission and was in charge of a field party at the time of his enlistment in December, 1917. He was commissioned a first lieutenant of engineers at Camp Lee, Virginia.

He leaves his parents, Mr. and Mrs. George H. McClure, of Rome, Georgia.—*Cornell Alumni News*.

JOSEPH NORRIS NEEL, JR.

Macon and middle Georgia were profoundly shocked and deeply grieved when the news came that Lt. Joe Neel, Jr., Georgia Phi and Georgia Beta, had been killed in action on the Western Front. Of all the men who an-

swered America's call, none was more generally loved or more deeply respected than he, and his death cast a pall of gloom over the entire community.

Joseph Norris Neel, Jr., was born in Macon, Georgia, on May 9, 1892, the oldest son of Joseph and Blanch Hall Neel and the brother of Lt. Roland Hall Neel, D. S. C. (Alabama Alpha-Mu). His elementary education was received in the public schools of Macon, and at the age of sixteen years he entered the Georgia School of Technology, where he was initiated by Georgia Phi Chapter of Sigma Alpha Epsilon. After one term at Tech, he went to St. John's Military Academy, Delafield, Wisconsin, from which he was graduated in May, 1911. The following year he attended the University of Georgia and was affiliated with Georgia Beta. Upon leaving the university in the spring of 1912, he returned to Macon and entered into partnership with his father in the large clothing business of Jos. N. Neel Co. Here he was firmly established as one of Macon's leading younger business men when war was declared upon Germany.

From the first Brother Neel felt the need of answering the country's call, and on May 11, 1917, entered the First Officers' Training Camp at Fort McPherson, Georgia. At the conclusion of the course, he was commissioned second lieutenant of Infantry and ordered to Camp Gordon, Georgia, where he was very soon made first lieutenant and assigned to Company E, 327th Infantry, 82nd Division. He remained with this company to the end, and arrived in France with it on his twenty-sixth birthday, May 9, 1918.

The 82nd Division was soon put at the front, and Lieutenant Neel was twice wounded. On July 14 he received a slight wound, from which he recovered, and returned to his old company on August 6; upon his return to the company he was immediately made commanding officer thereof.

On the afternoon of September 13, Companies E and K of the 327th made the daylight raid which was part of the great St. Mihiel Drive, and Lieutenant Neel led Company E into the Hun barrage with all the coolness and precision of dress parade. Masfield's phrase describes it best: "They went like kings in a pageant to the imminent death." At the head of the company which he loved so well, Lieutenant Neel was stricken down, gladly giving his life that truth and justice, religion and honor might not pass from the earth.

On September 15, 1918, he was buried with full military honors in the American cemetery at Pont St. Vincent, and there he sleeps the last long sleep of the brave in a sacred spot which must be forever America.

There are no words which can adequately describe Lieutenant Neel, the soldier and the man, but perhaps the tributes of his brother officers come nearest to it. His colonel wrote of him:

"Lieutenant Neel's loss was felt by all of us, but by none as keenly as myself, for he was a born leader, and his men loved him and would follow him anywhere. He was made of the stuff which has made this country great—the stuff that made green men ready to tackle and whale the Hun on every field fought over in France. He died not in vain, for his memory, like his life, was an inspiration to all his comrades. He helped to make the 327th Infantry by far the best and most efficient and hardest fighting regiment in our Division, and had he lived he would surely have been promoted to captain very soon."

Another officer of the 327th said:

"The entire regiment, all of whom knew him, mourns his loss to his family, his country, and to us, because there never was a nobler or braver soldier; one whom nobody has ever known to shirk any duty or fail in any undertaking."

His life was as beautiful as his death was glorious, and in losing him, his parents lose a devoted son, his Fraternity a noble brother, and his country a hero and a man.

WILLIAM C. TURPIN, JR.

RICHARD RAY WHITE

Lt. Richard Ray White, Florida Upsilon, son of Mr. and Mrs. Geo. C. White of Strake, Florida, was born in Florida, December 11, 1891, and was killed in action September 12, 1918.

Lieutenant White graduated from the University of Florida in 1913 with the degree of A. B. In 1915 he received a diploma from the College of Law at the State University and prior to his enlistment had built up an enviable legal practice in Orlando, Florida. After graduation from the Officers' Training School at Camp Gordon, Georgia, Lieutenant White was sent to France where the fatal bullet found him early on the morning of September 12 leading his men against the hosts of autocracy.

Lieutenant White came of an old and patriotic family. His grandfather, George C. White, Sr., was a soldier in the Confederate Army and his great uncle, Richard Shores, was one of General Jackson's scouts.

Ray White had won a warm place in the hearts of his co-workers both at college and in business. He was one of the founders of the Florida Upsilon Chapter and always an enthusiastic supporter of Sigma Alpha Epsilon.

PAUL L. WILLOUGHBY

Paul Lanius Willoughby, Florida Upsilon, son of Claude L. and Gertrude E. Willoughby, was born in Columbia, Missouri, July 16, 1898, and died in Gainesville, Florida, December 2, 1918. The body was given military burial in the local cemetery. By special permission of the commandant a firing squad of S. A. E. brothers was selected for the occasion and eight S. A. E.'s, four from the S. A. T. C. and four from the Naval Detachment, acted as pallbearers.

The following is an extract from an account of his funeral published in the *Gainesville Sun*:

"He moved with his parents in 1901 to Georgia, attending school at Griffin, Sandersville, and College Park, near Atlanta. He came to Florida in 1912, and finished the work of the grammar and high schools sufficiently to enter the freshman class of the College of Arts and Sciences, University of Florida, in September, 1916. He pursued the work of the freshman and sophomore years and was a junior in the university when he enlisted in the Students' Army Training Corps. On October 16 he was selected for intensive training at the Central Officers' Training School, Camp Gordon, Georgia. Upon the signing of the recent armistice, he requested a transfer back to the university of Florida, and returned to Gainesville November 23. Three days later he was stricken with

influenza, followed by pneumonia of the most rapid and severe type, and on the afternoon of December 2 passed from this life.

“Paul was a leader in his class in school and in college and was a member of the Farr Literary and the Flint Chemical Societies. . . . He became a member of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon fraternity in the spring of 1917, and was much devoted to college fraternity work. . . He was still an enlisted soldier in Government service, and was waiting to be mustered out to continue his education when the great Father called him to an early reward in the better world.”
