



The Annual Report

"...a phenomenal year"

THREE ARE THOSE OCCASIONAL years in the history of the best run corporations when the publication of the Annual Report can be an embarrassment if not a downright painful experience for the current Chairman of the Board, to say nothing of the stockholders. As your newly-elected E.S.A., I am most happy to report that this is not one of those years. ΣAE has had a good year, in some respects a phenomenal year, thanks to the loyal and generous support of its alumni. In fiscal 1978-79, annual giving reached an all-time high unsurpassed by the alumni of any other national college social fraternity. As a result of this unprecedented support, we have been able to maintain and even increase National Office services to our chapters and alumni in an inflation-beset economy. Not only has alumni support made it possible for ΣAE to hold its own in the economic sense, but it has enabled us to begin some serious planning for the future of the fraternity between now and the year 2000 A.D.

In August of this year, following the Newport Beach convention, four of the fraternity's six national committees appointed to serve for the 1979-81 biennium met for a full day at The Levere Memorial Temple to begin planning and coordinating their respective jobs. I personally hold to the belief that no volunteer fraternity committee should be

asked to perform without the benefit of at least one meeting face-to-face. The Supreme Council agreed, and, for the first time in a long time — if ever — four of our most important committees met, organized, and were "off and running" within a month of their appointment. We expect some well thought-out proposals for the future at the 1981 Kansas City Convention.

Concern has been expressed that no petitions for an ΣAE charter were presented at the Newport Beach convention, the first time in a long time. This was due in large measure to the new procedures adopted by the 1977 Philadelphia convention governing colonization, plus a reasoned policy based

on experience not to encourage a colony to seek a charter before it is ready. On that note, brothers, get ready; your vote may be called for on petitioning colonies between now and the 1981 convention. The fraternity's Extension Advisory Committee has recently recommended two new colonies to the Supreme Council, and the Council has authorized the employment of a full time Director of Extension. As for those chapters whose charters are now under suspension, we look forward to their return at the earliest possible date.

In the area of chapter housing, chapter officers and their house corporations will begin hearing from ΣAE in the months ahead in a way they've not heard before. Every chapter in the fraternity should be entitled to decent and safe housing equal to or better than the college or university can provide. Look to the National Fraternity to help in every way it can.

Brothers, I admonish you to "read, mark and inwardly digest" this Annual Report. The past year was good. Let's hope fiscal 1979-80 will be as good and even better.

The Leadership School, considered by many to be Sigma Alpha Epsilon's single-most important program, held its forty-fifth session on August 12-15, 1979 at the Levere Memorial Temple and on the campus of Northwestern University in Evanston. A program directed toward the collegiate chapters and the undergraduates, it is a very special - and very personal - experience for each delegate. Therefore, we reasoned, the school's story should be the story of one delegate and of his experience at the school, in his own words.

The story that follows is by Mark L. Foote, a sophomore at the University of Kansas majoring in International Business. He participates on campus as a student senator, a member of the Student Right Committee, and is "Rock Chalk" (Greek musical production contest) co-director for Kansas Alpha.




ARRIVED ON THE NORTHWESTERN campus about ten o'clock on a sunny and warm Sunday morning in August, and was immediately caught up in the spell of the forty-fifth Leadership School. I had been nervously anticipating what might be in store for me, but as I stepped into Bobb Hall (one of three dormitories used for the school) to receive my room assignment, all my doubts and fears faded quickly. In the lounge area of Bobb Hall sat three ΣAEs who were registering delegates into their rooms for the school. They were laughing and joking, asking me where I was from, if I knew this person or that person from my chapter, and, in short, making me feel right at home. They zipped me through my room assignment and all the other necessities, and when I got to my room (having left my key on the check-in table), I turned around to find one of the guys right behind me, dangling the key in my face and proclaiming me number fourteen on the list of delegates trying to break into their rooms. I couldn't help but laugh, and he left me with a reminder to register for the school at the Levere Memorial Temple as soon as possible. Somehow he seemed to know that I had forgotten to register, so as soon as I unpacked, I started out for the Temple.

The walk between Bobb Hall and the Levere Memorial Temple is an experience in itself. First, you walk by the old Sigma Chi house with its square, rough-

cut stone construction and colored tile entryway, and then out to and along Sheridan Road, which is lined with tall, sweeping trees on the right of the walk, and the huge buildings and spacious grounds of the campus on the left. The buildings are designed in various styles of architecture, so that as you walk past them, you can see how the campus has grown and changed with the passing years, while skillfully combining the old structures with modern technology. Some of the buildings are highly ornamental, replete with sculpture and carvings, and the campus has an interesting array of statues and monuments that add to the historical air of the university. Finally, after about six blocks of walking you turn the corner with Sheridan Road and come upon the lions, stone, and stained glass of the Levere Memorial Temple — probably the most endearing monument for ΣAEs around the campus.

Seeing the Temple for the first time was the fulfillment of a dream for me. I had seen all the pictures in my Phoenix and had read all the history therein, but walking past those two bronze lions and reaching out and opening the heavy Temple doors was an experience surpassed only by the tour which took place inside. I went straight upstairs to the museum, registered and picked up all the materials I would need for the school and then went right down to the foyer and waited for the next tour to start. Walking through the Temple was like

reliving all the history of the fraternity in forty minutes. In every corner of the building something interesting revealed itself and filled me with awe and with endless material for thought. For the first time, I realized fully that I was a member of Sigma Alpha Epsilon, and was already a part of the history that surrounded me. For that reason, more than any other, I left the Temple that day with a feeling of security, place, and pride. It was a feeling as enduring as the Temple walls and as loyal as the lions guarding them.

Later that day, the entire group of undergraduates, advisors, and faculty members assembled in Tech Auditorium for the official opening of the school. As we began to file into Tech, I felt slightly nervous, not knowing what to expect from the other guys and what they were expecting from me, but when Bob Hamrdla, the fraternity's educational advisor, started the group singing our songs, I felt right at home. It was amazing to see over 400 brothers from all over the country singing together as if they were a single chapter, and even more amazing to think that we all knew the same songs! As the opening session proceeded, we were introduced to the faculty who would be guiding our activities over the next few days, were formally welcomed by Skip Moore (Director of Leadership Training), and were given a basic idea of how the school would be run. In closing, we sang a few more songs, and from then on, the forty-fifth Leadership School

kept us pretty busy. At 5:30 P.M. we had a buffet dinner at the Temple, at 7:00 P.M. a memorial service was held in the Temple's chapel, at 7:30 was the formal pledging ceremony for the pledge class which everyone attended, and at 8:00 those wanting to be a part of the school's "special interest groups" met in various locations throughout the Temple. These groups comprised one of the extracurricular aspects of the school, and participation was voluntary. In them, you could be a member of the initiation team for the school's initiation ceremony; sing with the "E-Sharps" glee club; be a big brother to one of the pledges; help put together a multimedia presentation for the school's final banquet; or work on the school's newspaper, *The Hustler*. I chose the latter for my group, and was rewarded with a detailed lesson in all areas of newsletter production. Around 9:00 P.M. the groups broke up and we were left to entertain ourselves. I decided to stay around Bobb Hall and do a little work on my *Hustler* assignments, but when the boys started rolling out to the bars, I was forced to go along.

Breakfast the next morning was served at 7:15, and even though I didn't get to bed the night before until 3:00 A.M., I was wide awake and waiting in line at 7:00. In fact, I was so wide awake that I waited in front of the wrong door until 7:45 and almost missed the meal.

After breakfast we attended a brilliant seminar explaining all the symbology of

the SAE insignia, and then an equally interesting presentation on management and leadership. The management presentation was followed by meetings of individual discussion groups. The groups consisted of delegates from similar chapters, so that the topics we addressed were kept relevant to each chapter's problems. Lunch was at noon, and then the same pattern of presentations and discussion groups was used for the rest of the afternoon. Our mornings and afternoons adhered pretty much to this same pattern, but after dinner, a wide range of seminars was offered on all aspects of the fraternity and its operation. Also during the evenings, the special interest groups met and worked on their particular projects. That evening I attended a seminar on rush programming and started forming some concrete answers to the questions I brought to Leadership School: how to improve my chapter's pledge and rush programs. Already I was beginning to see a wide variety of alternatives in carrying out these programs from the way they were being implemented my chapter; but more importantly, I was being shown ideas that could be practical and effective in the chapter.

Still, I was never actually told how the problems in my chapter should be solved. Instead, the faculty acted as mediators during the discussion groups, and the delegates found their own answers through interaction with each other. Thus, the discussions were kept


on a personal level with everyone getting involved, rather than sitting and listening to one person lecture. This is one of the reasons why Leadership School was so important to me. We were there to become leaders, not to watch the leaders of the fraternity in the act of leading. It's true that observation is an important part of any learning process, but so much more important at Leadership School was the chance we were given to exercise our minds through the expression of thoughts and ideas. Also, and in conjunction with the scholastic side of the school, we were learning a special lesson on the many aspects of brotherhood and friendship. Through our songs we reaffirmed our history and the bond of brotherhood among us all. Through our close association with new and different people, we formed new ties of friendship, and through watching the development of the pledges, we relived our own initiation into Sigma Alpha Epsilon.

I was fortunate to remain close to the pledge class and their activities throughout the school. My first assignment for *The Hustler* was to report on pledges' progress and achievements, so I was always watching for any new developments. Therefore, when I arrived at their meeting on Sunday night, I was right on the scene as the pledges got acquainted with one another over a few beers. The next day, I watched the group elect their officers and decide upon their class project, which would be a Leadership School scholarship program. I was also one of the first victims to be cornered into buying a raffle ticket, the proceeds from which went into the scholarship fund.

The Leadership School, though it is greatly concerned with the realization of leadership qualities, is equally interested in sharpening the feelings of brotherhood. To achieve this goal, the entire school's activities center around the pledges. Pledge ship is something every active can relate to; and therefore, it was the common ground (among many) that was chosen to unite us. First, we saw the formal pledging of the brothers-to-be, and in doing so, the actives renewed their own vows of pledge ship. Then, as the pledges fulfilled their requirements for initiation, each active relived this period of his own past. In general, we watched them mature by learning the songs, history, and lore of the fraternity (they were unified enough to beat the actives in a volleyball game), until in the

culminating moments of the school, we all gathered in the Temple chapel for their initiation. Then the initiation team, chosen at the beginning of the school, showed how much work they had put into making the ceremony close to letter-perfect. By the end of the ceremony, there was not a dry eye among the new brothers, and watching two of my own pledge brothers being initiated left me fighting a growing lump in my throat.

By this time the Leadership School was almost finished. The seminars and discussions were recorded in my notebook, and the many new faces and friends were etched in my memory. The last item in the program was a banquet at Evanston's Orrington Hotel.

At the banquet, we saw some of the first fruits borne of the Leadership School experience. I for one helped hand out the third and final edition of *The Hustler*, which summarized the efforts of the people who had volunteered for the staff. Then, the "E-Sharps" glee club sang some well-rehearsed songs, and later during the banquet, the Multi-Media Group put on a slide presentation with music which charted the school from beginning to end. At one point, all the people who participated in some area of the school's functioning were asked to stand. To everyone's surprise, almost half of those at the banquet were on their feet. We were also introduced to the members of the Supreme Council, many of whom we had seen and talked with

during the school, and portraits were unveiled of past ESA Joe Mancini and past ESR Jack Hotaling, recognizing their vital contributions to SAE. The pride and joy which beamed from these two men reinforced for me a statement I had heard earlier in the week: Few things hold a deeper place in a man's heart than Sigma Alpha Epsilon.

Attending the school developed in me feelings and sensitivities toward SAE that will ever be a part of me, but I really cannot begin to represent in words an experience so unique. The school is different to everyone who attends, because the programs are aimed toward the individual. The Northwestern campus is beautiful and the Levere Memorial Temple is beyond compare, and being with so many brothers, expressing your own ideas to members of the Supreme Council and finding out that they listen and they care, and then, after a day of classes and discussion, going out to the fantastic night life of Chicago, made the school a rewarding and memorable experience. It is my sincere belief that every member of Sigma Alpha Epsilon should, at some time in his life, attend the Leadership School. I hope to return next year, because I know there is so much that I missed this last time. But if I don't come back, I still have the many images of the school in my memory.

A final word: Attend. You will never regret having seen your fraternity in its best form. ■

Meet Brother Bothwell

WHAT CAN YOU SAY ABOUT A 78-year-old man that still plays with trains, tinkers with cars, and surfs the shoreline of Waikiki Beach?

If you think this man is crazy, then you had better think again. A more appropriate adjective might be unique, or enthusiastic, or energetic, or sensitive, or perhaps just downright amazing.

His name is Lindley Bothwell and he is a man with a love for life. His story is simple enough to tell. He is obsessed with everything he does. One reason for this might be that Lindley has either started, invented, promoted, or developed everything he has ever become involved with in his life.

He lives on the ranch—an orange grove he grew—that he himself built many years ago in Woodland Hills, just on the outskirts of Los Angeles in the San Fernando Valley. His ranch management business has him shipping citrus fruits all over the world. He has done this almost all his life. His wife Anne says he can't spell the word "retirement."

How does a man his age get around such a large ranch? On his woodburning railroad train, of course, which is the trophy of a train collection that numbers more than one hundred. Says Anne, "All of his little trains led to the big train."

But trains aren't the only things that Bothwell collects. He owns one of the largest private collections of antique cars in the country. He purchased his first car, a Model T, while still in college. Today, he is a member of the Sports Car Club of America, an organization he founded about the time he bought his 1913 Peugeot in 1948. Lindley took this same Peugeot back to the Indianapolis 500 where it won the race in 1913. Only this time he broke the track speed record with his qualifying time. He still travels the country today, serving as steward at sports car races everywhere.

Brother Bothwell was initiated into California Gamma at the University of Southern California in 1922. His decision to pledge Sigma Alpha Epsilon was set the day he helped found the chapter



at USC. He still attends chapter meetings once a week and has served as the chapter's advisor for more than thirty years.

"Lindley is a legend in his own time. He is an inspiration to all of us at Cal Gamma," says John Flynn, USC '79. "To see him active shows all the brothers that SAE is for life, not merely for four years of college."

"Brother Bothwell shows you that there's nothing you can't do in life. He helps kids find their hearts and souls and teaches them to believe in themselves," says Flynn. And Flynn should know; he trained under Bothwell as a member of USC's Yell Squad for three years.

What is the Yell Squad? Flynn claims it is an offshoot of Lindley's very own enthusiasm for the university he attended. He started it when he was a

student, and also is credited with the creation of card stunts, which he developed while a yell leader. Both the Yell Squad and Card Section have been under Bothwell's supervision since they began, and are now a strong Trojan tradition. The card stunt concept has spread and is used by many colleges and universities across the country today. He also coordinates the Song Girls, who serve as the school's cheerleaders, and that group has won more National Championships than the Trojan football team.

It is difficult to explain a fellow as Lindley Bothwell. All his involvements in life paint a picture of what he holds important: his family, his school, his fraternity. All of these things are institutions of the people he holds dear.

The ΣAEs of **Tennessee Nu** at Vanderbilt joined men from five other fraternities on campus to play in the "First Annual Vanderbilt Charity Bowl Football Classic" on April 20, with the proceeds donated to the United States Olympic Committee to help support the American athletes in Lake Placid and in Moscow. The two teams met at Vanderbilt's Dudley Field in equipment furnished by the university's Athletic Department and were given a pep talk by the honorary head coach, Nashville's Mayor Richard Fulton. The fans paid only two dollars a ticket and that entitled them to see the game, drink the free beer provided by Budweiser, receive an official Olympic pin, and attend the Post Game Party the ΣAEs hosted at their chapter house.

Kansas Alpha leads in local service

Shelby Douglas, Kansas '79 (Alpha), reports that chapter goes all out in their community service efforts. The **Kansas Alpha** ΣAEs sponsored a Muscular Dystrophy Olympics even before school started, and the event raised over \$1,300. Throughout the fall they worked for the campus blood drive; ran the 10,000 meter Jayhawk Jog; and initiated what they hope will be an annual affair — the Halloween Party for the Hilltop Nursery.

When the snows fell, and each and every time, the brothers shoveled the walks for neighboring sororities and also provided escort service when the girls were on campus late at night. After the snow melted and they had more free time, the chapter's basketball team went into action at the Phi Delta Theta Easter Seals Tourney. "The real winners," noted Douglas, "were the children who benefited from the proceeds."

At the end of the year, the house ran a ninety-mile relay from Manhattan to Lawrence — the "Dash for Diabetes" with funds donated to the American Diabetes Association.

\$500 award to be given

Judge Walter B. Jones, Auburn '10 (Alabama Alpha-Mu), was Eminent Supreme Archon of the fraternity from 1932-34. In his will he bequeathed \$10,000 to The Levere Memorial Foundation to constitute the principal of a fund to be known as the "Walter B. Jones Scholarship Fund." The income or principal, or both, was to be used in such manner as shall be determined from time to time by the trustees of the Foundation "for the purpose of improving the scholarship of the active members of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity."

He explained, "I have made this provision being deeply conscious of the great importance to our country in these troubled times of our young people attaining the highest standards of education possible, and since I have always taken an especial interest in young men, and particularly those who are members of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity."

The trustees have had considerable difficulty in finding a satisfactory way of handling the bequest. After wrestling with the problem for some time without finding a solution, it has been suggested to the trustees that since the bequest is expressly for the benefit of the active members of the fraternity, the active members may well be the ones best able to suggest how this should be done.

Thus, the trustees are offering a cash

award of \$500 for the best suggestion received from any active brother of the fraternity as to how this fund, the annual income from which is expected to be between \$750 and \$1,000, can best be used to carry out Brother Jones' wishes, namely to improve the scholarship of our active members.

All honorable mention entries will receive a Columbia Encyclopedia or a Webster's Dictionary.

All suggestions:

- 1) Should be concise. Excessive length will detract.
- 2) Should recognize that we are dealing with more than 180 chapters.
- 3) Must be legibly typed, and include your name, chapter, and address.
- 4) Should be received by January 31, 1980. Receipt will not be acknowledged, nor will answers be returned.

5) Will be examined by the trustees or by a committee appointed by them as to which suggestion they regard as most valuable in furthering the improvement of scholarship in the active chapters.

For members not currently receiving all four issues of THE RECORD annually, annual giving contributions must be received by December 15 to insure your receiving the February issue.



Smeltzly named to college baseball Hall of Fame

Hal Smeltzly, Florida Southern '53 (Gamma), Florida Southern's athletic director who served for two decades as the school's baseball coach and built a national-championship calibre program along the way, has been named to the Hall of Fame of the American Association of College Baseball Coaches.

The selection was announced in June by the AACBC Hall of Fame Committee. Smeltzly is scheduled to be inducted during ceremonies January 5 at the New Orleans Hilton Inn.

Smeltzly began his coaching career at Southern in 1957. His teams won six regional titles and three national titles, including consecutive crowns in 1971 and 1972. The other came in 1975, one year before his retirement from active coaching. He was named Division II "Coach of the Year" by the AACBC after the 1972 season.

Smeltzly compiled a career record of 391-166, putting him among the top ten

winningest coaches in the nation. He graduated from Florida Southern in 1953 and played professional baseball with the

old Lakeland Pilots before assuming the duties as head coach at his alma mater. He holds a master's degree from Temple University.

On the international level, Smeltzly coached a Dutch all-star team to a European championship in 1966 and was inducted into the Royal Dutch Sports Hall of Fame the next year. He worked as an assistant coach for teams in the World Amateur Tournament in 1969 and 1970, and he coached the U.S. team to a silver medal in the 1975 Pan-Am Games in Mexico City. This year, he is playing a major role in team selection for the 1979 Pan-Am Games and is currently in Venezuela with the trial squads.

In 1977 the United States Baseball Federation honored Smeltzly with its award for outstanding service to amateur baseball. Earlier this year, he accepted an invitation from the Federation in Italy to travel to Rome as guest lecturer at a teachers' and coaches' clinic.

Neihous, kidnap victim, escapes terrorists

Finally released after being held captive for three and a half years by leftist terrorists in Venezuela, **William F. Niehous**, Miami '53 (Ohio Tau), returned to Toledo where he was reunited with his family.

The forty-eight-year-old ΣΑΕ and former general manager of Owens-Illinois Glass Operations in Venezuela was kidnapped from his home in Caracas on February 27, 1976. Owens-Illinois and the Venezuelan government negotiated with the kidnappers, but when Owens-Illinois agreed to pay for publishing the terrorist groups' manifesto in foreign newspapers, the Venezuelan government broke off the negotiations with the explanation that the manifesto

Gildner receives Murrow Award

Jay Gildner, Minnesota '49 (Alpha), a career Foreign Service Information Officer and presently Director of the United States International Communications Agency's (USICA's) operations in India, received the Edward R. Murrow Award for Excellence in Public Diplomacy during commencement exercises at Tufts University on May 20, 1979.

The award, presented annually by the Murrow Center of Public Diplomacy of the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts, is named in honor of the distinguished radio and television commentator who served in the Kennedy administration as Director of the U.S. Information Agency, USICA's predecessor organization.

Gildner entered the Foreign Service in 1955 after military service in World War II and professional experience in journalism and public relations. His career background includes overseas assignments in Germany, Canada, Iran, Israel, and India. In Washington he served as an Assistant Press Secretary to President John F. Kennedy from 1961 to 1962; USIA Policy Officer from 1962 to 1965; and as Assistant Director of USIA for Europe from 1971 to 1975.

was an offense to their national dignity. That was in 1976 and in the following three years of silence, Niehous was believed dead.

It was only by accident that he was found when police looking for cattle rustlers raided a jungle hut near the Orinoco River about 350 miles from Caracas. Niehous, who was being held there, escaped during the gun battle and hid in the jungle where he was later discovered by an army patrol.

Returning to his Toledo home in time to celebrate his twenty-fifth wedding anniversary, gaunt but remarkably healthy in body and mind, Niehous said that although he despaired, he "never lost (hope) completely."



In 1977 he went to Washington to assume a high echelon position in the Department of Defense where he was responsible for the daily operation of the Pentagon.



THE STATE OF SIGMA ALPHA Epsilon — both as a business organization and as a brotherhood — is sound. Certainly the fraternity has had its problems; but the overall picture for the past year is one of progress and increased strength. Without a doubt the most serious problem for ΣAE, from the chapters to the National Fraternity, has been inflation. Given the continually decreasing value of the dollar, it has been difficult for the National Fraternity to expand — or even maintain — its level of services to its members. But services have been expanded, due to the extremely generous financial support by both alumni and undergraduates.

Annual giving contributions from the alumni sector have never been better. The previous year, in fiscal 1977-78, ΣAE set a new record for any fraternity in alumni contributions, with a record for any fraternity in alumni contributions, with a combined total donated to Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity and to The Levere Memorial Foundation of \$255,551.28. This year, fiscal 1978-79, that record was topped by a full twenty-five percent, an exceptional increase for one year. Combined donations to ΣAE and to LMF totalled \$320,323.

Undergraduates, too, have carried their weight in supporting the National Fraternity. The 1979 National Convention — of which roughly seventy-five percent of the voting delegates were from active chapters — overwhelmingly approved an increase in pledge fees and initiation fees from \$10 and \$95 to \$15 and


\$105, respectively. Despite this increase, we are happy to report that ΣAE is still among the lowest of all college fraternities in terms of undergraduate fees.

Although the business and financial aspects of the fraternity are of vital concern, they certainly don't show the whole picture of the organization, particularly an organization as ΣAE that is still fundamentally concerned with the growth — intellectual, spiritual, moral and social — of its members. Thus, this report will attempt to show the overall picture of the fraternity in all areas.

ΣAE is made up of two distinct entities: Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity, which offers services and programs for undergraduates, active chapters, alumni, and alumni associations; and The Levere Memorial Foundation, which owns and maintains The Levere Memorial Temple, and provides educational assistance to members of ΣAE through student loans, scholarships, fellowships, and various other educational programs. Also associated with the National Fraternity is the S.A.E. Leadership Foundation, a private foundation which offers programs to encourage the growth and development of the individual. Among its programs are the Summer Intern Program for ΣAEs and non-ΣAEs; the Community Service Award; and the Alcohol Education Program.

Therefore, this annual report will chronicle the progress of these three entities: Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity; The Levere Memorial Foundation; and the S.A.E. Leadership Foundation.

The Annual Report 1979



Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity

The National Office

ALL PROGRAMS OF THE Fraternity and of the Foundation are coordinated through the National Office under the day-to-day supervision of the Eminent Supreme Recorder. Kenneth D. Tracey, Eastern New Mexico '70 (Alpha), began his tenure as ESR on August 1, 1978, and in his first year in office, instituted a reorganization of the office to increase its efficiency. The National Office staff consists of some twenty employees, eight of whom are SAEs. The operations of the office are divided into a number of departments, each of which is headed up by a staff member. Departments of the National Office are:

Chapter Development: Clint Smith, Oklahoma '77 (Kappa), is Director of Chapter Development, and has overall responsibility for services and programs for chapters. Most notable among these is the chapter visitation program, implemented through the Educational and Leadership Consultants. Four new consultants began employment on July 1. They are: Dave Arendt, Drake '78 (Iowa Delta); Bob Armstrong, San Diego State '79 (California Theta); Mark Bailey, Valdosta State '79 (Georgia Sigma); and Dan Easter, Central Florida '79 (Epsilon).

Also under the jurisdiction of the Chapter Development department is the fraternity's extension program, charged with the creation and development of new collegiate chapters. Extension progress will be chronicled later in this report.

The Chapter Development department offers a wide array of manuals, flyers, and resource materials dealing with various aspects of successful chapter management. Two new manuals have been published during the past year on the subjects of Alumni Relations and Kitchen Management. Also new is a completely rewritten manual of Rush Skills.

Communications and Alumni Programs: John March, Oklahoma '75 (Kappa), began work February 1 in the newly-created position of Director of Communications/Alumni Programming. On the communications side, John edits THE RECORD and PHI ALPHA, and is responsible for all other National Office publications. He is also responsible for the fraternity's public relations. On the alumni side, John is responsible for coordinating programs and services to alumni associations and to individual alumni.

The creation of this position marks the first time in four years that THE RECORD has been edited from within the National Office; previously it was edited outside the office on a part-time basis.

Finance: Beginning his third year on the staff is Financial Director William D. Hawes. Bill acts as the fraternity's comptroller, and oversees financial operations of both SAE and The Levere Memorial Foundation. He supervises a staff of two full-time bookkeepers.

Office Management: Barbara M. Ford, Office Coordinator and Administrative Assistant, is beginning her fourth year as a member of the staff. She supervises the duties of six clerical staff persons and three maintenance personnel.

To increase the efficiency of the Office of the ESR, the

Supreme Council recently created the position of Administrative Assistant to the ESR. Mike Neidow, Kansas '78 (Alpha), was tapped to fill the post. Mike served last year as E&L Consultant to SAE's northeastern chapters.

Annual Giving and Finance

Fraternity experienced another good year despite soaring inflation. The key to this success was the overwhelming support of our alumni. Without that support SAE would have run a considerable deficit. Our unaudited year-end excess after transfers to endowment totaled \$21,745. SAE has three major sources of income: undergraduate fees, alumni gifts, and investment income.

Undergraduate fees (51.4% of income) reached 101% of the budgeted amount for a total of \$370,720, which was a slight increase over the previous year.

Annual Giving (27% of income) reached a total of \$194,930, or 117% of the budgeted figure and an increase of 15% over the previous year.


Investment and other income (21% of income) reached \$154,991, which was 14% over the budgeted figure and was slightly ahead of the previous year.

The fraternity's expenses for the 1978-79 fiscal year were \$33,055 over budget and \$76,412 more than in fiscal 1977-78. Fortunately our income was significantly more than was

Initiations Five Year Comparison




budgeted due to the dramatic increases in Annual Giving and in investment income. Our expenses were affected by inflation especially on travel, printing costs, and Leadership School room and board costs.

The fraternity's financial position should be aided considerably in fiscal 1979-80 by the recent \$10 increase in the initiation fee and other anticipated increase in the level of alumni giving. Printing and travel costs continue to rise, and we also face an increase in National Office staff salaries to keep pace with the cost of living and to stabilize our staff turnover rate.


We continue to search for ways to bring in revenue. Although minor sources, items such as supplies and gift sales are becoming increasingly important sources of income.

Our future is somewhat uncertain because our rate of growth in terms of income is dropping in relation to the rate of growth of expenses due to high inflation. We may well face the day soon when our services will have to be cut back in order to

balance the budget. We constantly endeavor to increase our efficiency and to cut expenses without decreasing services. We are also becoming more and more dependent upon our alumni for financial support. So far our expectations have been met in this regard.

The Leadership School

THE FORTY-FIFTH LEADERSHIP School was held August 12-15, continuing what is considered by many to be ΣAE's single most important program for undergraduates (see story, page 2). This year's school, held under the direction of Richard L. "Skip" Moore, Texas-El Paso and Eastern New Mexico '66 (Alpha), in his second year as Director of Leadership Training, was attended by some 441 delegates of which 424 were undergraduates and seventeen were chapter advisors. This brings the total to 15,093 of graduates from the school since its inception in 1935. The school, founded by Dr. John O. Moseley, was the first of its kind ever held by a national fraternity and the concept has been picked up by most other major national fraternities.

Condition of the Chapters

THE MAJORITY OF ΣAE'S Collegiate chapters have experienced a good, solid year. As always, however, there have been problems; but we are happy to report the improvement of a number of serious situations. Several chapters have been completely reorganized with the help of the National Office, respective provinces, and local alumni. These chapters include Tennessee Alpha at East Tennessee State; Michigan Gamma at Michigan State; Utah Phi at Utah; Iowa Beta at Iowa; Montana Beta at Montana; and Colorado Chi at Colorado. These chapters had experienced problems such as chapter house fires, serious financial problems, lack of direction, declining membership, and lack of leadership. Some were simply in serious trouble; some were on the verge of extinction. Now, all are making steady progress and the situations are greatly improved.

Some chapters, however, have not fared so well. Three chapters have ceased operations in the past year due to problems with misconduct or declining membership, and their charters are being held by local alumni commissions. These include Arizona Alpha at Arizona; Pennsylvania Delta at Gettysburg; and Massachusetts Gamma at Harvard. These chapters certainly have not been written off, though; the National Office plans to return to these campuses and reorganize the chapters as soon as it is feasible.


In the area of extension, a number of advances have been made. Plans call for the establishment of two new colonies this fall at Towson State in Maryland and at the University of North Carolina at Wilmington.

Existing colonies are also faring well and making good solid progress toward their goals of receiving ΣAE charters. They are: Texas A&M; Troy State in Alabama; College of Charleston in South Carolina; Indiana State at Evansville; and Davis and Elkins in West Virginia.

Three groups have had their colony status revoked within the past year because of unsatisfactory development. They are: Indiana University of Pennsylvania; Murray State in Kentucky; and Eastern Montana at Billings.

A definite boost to the extension program should be realized within the coming year due to recent action taken by the Supreme Council. At their August meeting, the Council authorized the hiring of a full-time Director of Extension. Plans now call for the new director to begin in January.

In one extremely positive note concerning the operations of the chapters, more than thirty groups took part this year in ΣAE's Fight Against Dystrophy (FAD) program. The groups all organized, sponsored, or took part in various fund-raising activities, the proceeds of which were donated to the Muscular Dystrophy Association. On the annual Jerry Lewis Telethon on Labor Day, Charles Devine of Minnesota Alpha presented Jerry with a check for \$80,000 on behalf of these thirty ΣAE undergraduate chapters.



The National Convention

THE BIENNIAL MEETING OF THE Fraternity was held June 17-19, 1979, in Newport Beach, California (see August RECORD for the full convention report). A productive, businesslike meeting, delegates wasted little time on useless controversy, but instead got down to the serious business of planning for ΣAE's future, both short-range and long-range. As already noted, undergraduate fees were increased to insure the fraternity's financial stability for the coming biennium. In addition, a number of committees met and dealt with a number of vital issues affecting the fraternity. As ESA Generelly noted in his message at the beginning of this issue, we are committed to making long-range plans for the fraternity's continued stability, growth, and prosperity.

Awards

ONE OF THE ENDURING traditions of Sigma Alpha Epsilon is to recognize and honor those individuals and groups who have excelled in their service to the fraternity and in enhancing SAE's reputation. Awards and recipients in this past year include:

The Distinguished Service Award: SAE's highest honor, it is given to alumni for a lifetime of service to SAE at any level. Announced at the National Convention, the latest recipients were Raymond C. Dein, Nebraska '32 (Lambda-Pi); Thomas M. L. Gillespie, Miami '49 (Florida Alpha); past ESA Joseph A. Mancini, Cincinnati '35 (Ohio Epsilon); and George E. Monroe, Michigan '28 (Iota-Beta).

The John O. Moseley Award for Fraternity Zeal: Considered the highest award to a chapter, it is given annually at Leadership School to that group that displays all-around excellence but also has that certain indefinable quality of

"zeal." This year's winner was Wyoming Alpha at Wyoming.

The S.A.E. Leadership Foundation Award for Excellence in Community Relations: Given to that chapter with the most outstanding and pervasive community service program. This year's winner was, for the fifth time in ten years, Kentucky Epsilon at Kentucky.

The John H. Baugh, Jr., Award for Outstanding Pledge Programming: Awarded to the chapter with the best all-around program of pledge education, this year's honor went to Illinois Epsilon at Bradley University.

The Rex A. Smith Award for Chapter Efficiency: Given to the chapter with the best record of timely submissions of reports and fees to the National Office. Announced at the convention, the 1979 winner was South Carolina Nu at Clemson.

Also presented at Leadership School are awards for excellence in chapter communications. Categories and winners were: Typeset newsletters, South Dakota Theta; Non-Typeset Newsletters, Iowa Chi; Scrapbooks, Kansas Beta; Magazine/Rush Booklet, Kansas Beta; Poster/Sign/Flyer, Michigan Delta; Slide or Film Presentation, South Dakota Theta; and Tee-Shirts, a three-way tie between Arizona Beta, Oklahoma Kappa, and Ohio Epsilon.

"The Levere Memorial Temple" in honor and memory of William C. Levere and of other members of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity who have served their country on land or sea.

2. To maintain therein a memorial chapel, also a library, reading rooms, museum and art gallery, which shall be open and free to the public for research and study.
3. To preserve documents, archives, war records, relics, pictures, works of art, and related objects for the encouragement of patriotic and historical research, particularly as to the history of education and educational institutions; together with such other facilities as may be necessary or proper to the maintenance of such a memorial.
4. To cherish, maintain, and extend the institutions of American freedom to foster true patriotism and love of country in the youth of the nation, and to promote celebrations on patriotic anniversaries.
5. To establish and grant scholarships and loan funds to worthy and needy students in various colleges, universities, and institutions of learning; and build, equip, and maintain libraries and reading rooms in the various chapters of the fraternity.
6. To receive funds, donations, bequests, endowments, and gifts, both real and personal, for the furtherance of the objects and purposes above set forth.

THE 1978-79 FISCAL YEAR WAS exceptional for the Foundation.

Annual Giving produced \$125,393 in income, which was a 28% increase over the previous year. Dividends and interest from Foundation investments responded well during the year with an increase of \$91,940, or 28% over the previous year.

Expenses have been stable over the past five years. The 1978-79 expenses increased by eight percent which was due to inflation. The Resident Educational Advisor program, an educational service to chapters where an approved individual is trained to assist chapters with scholarship programming, shows an expense of \$31,657 for fourteen tutors, who receive a stipend from the Foundation complemented by room and board provided by the chapter. The Building of Chapter Libraries expense came to \$26,427, which represents contributions by the Foundation for specific chapter study facilities. The Foundation also assists chapters in acquiring books and resource materials for their libraries and a total of \$5,531 was expended in this area.

The Foundation has undertaken a major renovation project for The Levere Memorial Temple which will take two years to complete. The work involves extensive work on the roof and on the Tiffany stained glass windows in the chapel, and painting and other refurbishing. The estimated cost of the project is in excess of \$200,000. These projects will be funded out of the Foundation's endowment funds. Thanks to the very generous support of our alumni, these endowments should be very quickly replenished.

A major innovation in the Foundation's development program has been the appointment of W. Charles Witzleben, Mercer '70 (Georgia Psi), as Development Consultant. Charlie, a professional in the field of development, served on the National Office staff from 1970 to 1973. A number of improvements are in the works and will be implemented in the coming year.

The S.A.E. Leadership Foundation

T

HE S.A.E. LEADERSHIP

foundation was established in 1969 for the purposes of fostering leadership and personal development and growth of ΣAE undergraduates and of college students in general.

The Foundation has three principal programs, and 1978-79 was another productive year for all three. These programs, and their progress for the year, include:

The Summer Intern Program: In the past summer, nine students participated in internships dealing with a broad variety of topics, including work as interns and legislative assistants to various congressmen and governors; work on a pilot orientation program for new international students; directing children's theatre at a Fresh Air Fund camp; work as a student assistant surgical technician; and study on a research project at a university's personnel department. A total of \$5,900 was expended on the program. Interns are allowed to design their own programs, and receive stipends of up to \$1000. Internships are open to all students, not just ΣAEs.

The Community Service Program: Concerned with encouraging the participation of ΣAE chapters in the affairs of their respective communities, the Foundation annually presents its Award for Excellence in Community Relations to that chapter that has, over the past year, had the most outstanding overall program of service to the community. As noted earlier, this year, for the fifth time in the ten years of the award, Kentucky Epsilon at the University of Kentucky won the award. Incidentally, Kentucky Epsilon has been nominated for the award nine out of those ten years. This fall, the award will be presented on the campus, along with a \$1000 check to the university in the name of the chapter.

The Alcohol Education Program: The program, headed by Dr. Tom Goodale, was one of awareness and primary intervention, and was funded by a \$10,000 grant from the Foundation. In the past year, Goodale, Father Bob Hedges, George Hoge, and Gerardo Gonzalez have made presentations in ten of the fraternity's provinces in eleven states. In addition, requests from Kappa Alpha Order, Beta Theta Pi, Kappa Sigma, Phi Delta Theta, and Delta Zeta have resulted in presentations made to their constituencies. This has also resulted in the Universities of Alabama, South Carolina, and Arkansas State asking for the group's assistance.

Communications have also been an important part of the committee's activities. The major article in the February 1979 RECORD, "Alcohol: Uses, Misuses, and Abuses" was written by Dr. Gonzalez, and a brochure entitled "To Whom it May Concern: An Approach to Responsible Drinking" has been published and will be distributed to chapters and interested groups free of charge.

The Foundation has been operating on a \$10,000 per year budget, funded largely with personal gifts from interested brothers. Because of the importance of these issues, the Foundation plans to more than double its budget in the coming year, and seeks the support of other concerned brothers. Top Chapter Awards Given

Sigma Alpha Epsilon's two highest chapter awards — The John O. Moseley Award for Fraternity Zeal and the Award for Excellence in Community Relations — went to chapters this year which embody the highest standards and aspirations of Sigma Alpha Epsilon. Although

the fraternity does not present a "best chapter" award per se, these two chapters certainly represent the best ideals and aspirations of the fraternity and serve as examples and as inspiration to all of SAE's undergraduate chapters.



The John O. Moseley Award for Fraternity Zeal

The John O. Moseley Award for Fraternity Zeal was established to recognize that chapter that is outstanding in its overall operation, but that also possesses that special quality of fraternity zeal. Zeal is difficult to describe, but it is the sort of thing that one recognizes when it exists. Many people associated with **Wyoming Alpha** at the University of Wyoming recognized zeal within that chapter.

The chapter's guiding philosophy is that each member is different and unique, but it is through a sense of lasting friendship and the striving for common goals that a lasting unity is created. The chapter — as a group and as individuals — is actively involved in every phase of campus life, and is recognized as leaders and innovators in that involvement. Brothers participate in varsity athletics, student government, as officers of the IFC, and in many varied campus organizations. Also active in community service, the brothers co-sponsored the local Jerry Lewis Telethon during the past fall semester and organized an Easter egg hunt for a local elementary school in the spring.

Such accomplishments, however, are viewed only as an outgrowth of the overall enthusiasm, spirit, and constant striving for improvement that have earned this chapter the respect and admiration of the university and of their peers.


The Award for Excellence in Community Relations

Kentucky Epsilon at the University of Kentucky has been nominated for the award nine out of ten years it has been given, and has won it five times. Community service is a long-standing tradition with the chapter and is a part of the group's overall philosophy. In the past year, the group sponsored or was involved in twenty projects. Among them:

Manchester Center, an agency for underprivileged youth, involved thirty brothers in capacities ranging from tutoring to coaching.

Christmas party for "Little Brothers" brought forty boys from the Lexington Big Brothers program to the house. The chapter took up a collection from among themselves (over \$500) to buy presents for the boys. The boys came back in small groups throughout the year to play basketball or to share in friendship.

Miscellaneous projects included setting up for the Kentucky Athletic Club's charity bash; sponsoring all-Greek cocktail parties for Muscular Dystrophy and UNICEF; Heart Fund collection; Mattress Marathon for the March of Dimes; fund raising for the Todd Trease Teddy Bear Fund; and participation in many other projects sponsored by other Greek organizations.



Those Who Gave

Sigma Alpha Epsilon again set a new record for any college fraternity in terms of total alumni contributions in 1978-79. This was made possible by more than 13,000 generous brothers who donated to the fraternity's Annual Giving Program. The following listings, organized in the various plateaus of giving, recognize these brothers. Plateaus include: Founder Member, \$1000; Levere Member, \$500; Moseley

ALL THE LATE-BREAKING NEWS FROM 1856 SHERIDAN ROAD

Fall rush has been tremendous for many chapters. Reports received in the National Office reflect many chapters meeting or exceeding their goals. Some top results as of mid-October: Louisiana Epsilon, 48; Mississippi Sigma, 46; Mississippi Gamma, 44; Oklahoma Kappa, 41; Nebraska Lambda-Pi, 37; Texas Rho, 36; Kansas Alpha, 33; Arkansas Alpha-Upsilon, 33; Georgia Sigma, 32; Iowa Gamma, 32; Washington Alpha, 31; and South Carolina Gamma, 30.

Plans are well under way for the fraternity's 125th Anniversary National Convention in Kansas City. The beautiful Crown Center Hotel will host the convention on June 18-20, 1981. The convention will follow a Thursday through Saturday format, when better rates are available, as opposed to the old Sunday through Tuesday format.

On the extension front: Two new colonies will be established this month. Local fraternities to be granted colony status are at the University of North Carolina at Wilmington on November 3, followed by Towson State College in Maryland on November 17. Existing colonies all are making steady progress. Rush results received from most of the colonies are very positive, and mail ballots for the granting of charters seems a likely possibility in some cases. Existing colonies are at the College of Charleston, Davis and Elkins in West Virginia, Indiana State/Evansville, Texas A&M, and Troy State in Alabama.

The Supreme Council will hold its winter meeting in New York City on January 18-20, hosted by the New York City Alumni Association. Members of the Board of Trustees will be in attendance, as well as many undergraduates from Provinces Nu and Alpha. Also meeting in January will be the Leadership School Planning Committee on the weekend of the 12th to begin formulating plans for the 46th Leadership School.

Some Chapters Never Learn Dept.: ESR Ken Tracey was requested to appear on the campus of a large university in late September in conjunction with a disciplinary hearing of one of SAE's old established chapters. The chapter was called on a hazing incident involving the physical abuse of a number of pledges. As a result, the chapter was placed on social probation for a year and was required to make a number of improvements in its pledge program. Failure to do so will result in a number of possible sanctions, including the disbanding of the pledge class, loss of rush privileges for a year, and the restriction of participation in intramurals and other campus activities.



He said that adequate provisions already exist, and objected to the bill's application to "a select class of individuals--students," which he asserted could make the bill unconstitutional.

General Townsend dies

MAJOR GENERAL E. CARTER TOWNSEND, U.S. Army (Ret.), Georgia (Beta), former chief of staff of U.S. forces in Vietnam, died July 2, 1979, in San Francisco. He was sixty-seven.

General Townsend attended Georgia Military Academy and the University of Georgia, where he was commissioned a reserve second lieutenant after ROTC training.

He served with the 36th and 70th Infantry Division during World War II and was assigned to headquarters of the Seventh U.S. Army in Europe after the war.

He later commanded the U.S. Intelligence Command at Fort Holabird, Maryland, and served on the staff of the Secretary of the Army.

Townsend completed his career as plans and operations officer and subsequently as chief of staff for General Creighton Abrams, commander of U.S. forces in Vietnam from 1968 to 1970.

He was twice awarded the Distinguished Service Medal, the Bronze Star, and the Army Commendation Medal. He also held the combat Infantry Badge and Office of the Secretary of the Army and Department of the General Staff badges.

Since retirement, he had been a member of the board of governors of Thomas Aquinas College in Santa Paula, California, and had written a book, "Risks: The Key to Combat Intelligence."

Former joint chiefs Chairman Brown dies

GEORGE S. BROWN, Missouri '40 (Alpha), United States Air Force, died December 5, 1978. Brown left Missouri to enter West Point where he graduated in 1941. After receiving flight training at the Air Corps Flight School he was stationed in England. During the heavy bombing raids over the Ploesti oil fields in Rumania, Brown was credited with leading the survivors safely back.

He served in Korea where he was Deputy Chief of Staff of Operations, Fifth Air Force, and then returned to Washington for service at the Pentagon. There, he was military assistant to three Secretaries of Defense: McElroy, Gates, and McNamara. For four years he held the highest military office, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, until his retirement from active duty shortly before his death.

Young, educator, dies; memorial fund begun

WILL D. YOUNG, Cumberland '20 (Tennessee Lambda), of Dehlonega, Georgia, died July 31, 1979. He was eighty.

Young, a native of Wilson County, Tennessee, in 1920 became Professor of History and Political Science at Cumberland, and, from 1926 to 1939 served as Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences. During his collegiate days, he was a leader in chapter and Province Iota affairs and was longtime advisor to Tennessee Lambda.

After leaving Cumberland, Young was registrar and head of the Social Science department of North Georgia College and was promoted to Dean of that college in 1950, a position he held until his retirement in 1966. Thereafter, he served as head of the Social Science department at Truett McConnell College, Cleveland, Georgia, until 1972. Following his retirement there, the college established a scholarship in his honor.

Alumni of Tennessee Lambda and other friends have begun a drive to establish a "Will D. Young Memorial Fund" at

Cumberland College which will provide an annual award to the outstanding social science graduate who has also contributed to Cumberland's athletic program.

Miller, athletic champion, dies

RALFE D. MILLER, California-Berkeley '29 (Beta), a native Californian and champion for university athletics, died May 5, 1979 at the age of seventy-two in Lafayette, California.

After his graduation he returned to Berkeley as a lecturer in physical education and eventually became supervisor of the department, retiring in 1968. A past title holder of the West Coast Squash Racquet Association, Miller was responsible for establishing the game at the university and for the installation of their courts. Held annually in his honor is the Ralfe D. Miller Invitational Squash Tournament.

Hattersley, retired Sears exec, dies

GORDON B. HATTERSLEY, Pennsylvania '23 (Theta), a retired vice president of Sears, Roebuck & Company, died June 13, 1979, while on vacation in Cambridge, New York. He was seventy-six and lived in Wynnewood, Pennsylvania.

Hattersley joined Sears in Philadelphia in 1924 as an inspector in the mail-order department. Moving up through the ranks, he served as vice president of the store's eastern territory, then headquartered in Philadelphia, from 1946 to 1955. He was later a member of the company's board of directors from 1955 to 1958. He retired in 1961.

Also active with Pennsylvania Theta, Hattersley was a major contributor to the chapter's building drive in 1969. He was also a term trustee of the University of Pennsylvania.

Telford, Illinois physician, dies

E. W. Telford, Northwestern '22 (Illinois Psi-Omega), died at his home in DeKalb, Illinois on March 24, 1979. Telford, seventy-seven, who graduated from Northwestern's Medical School in 1926, had served the DeKalb area as a family physician for forty years.

He left his practice during World War II joining the Army Medical Corps; then again during the Korean War where he was made a division surgeon and honored with two bronze stars from the United States as well as medals from Korea and the Phillipines. He retired from active practice in 1968 after suffering a heart attack.

He was a Fellow of the American and International College of Surgeons and a

member of many professional and service organizations. He received honors from the American Medical Association, Northwestern Medical School, Cook County Hospital, and the Illinois State Medical Society, who, in 1956, named him, "Family Physician of Illinois."

Samuel G. Hibbs

Samuel G. Hibbs, Allegheny '29 (Pennsylvania Omega), died at the age of seventy-two on January 18, 1979. A 1933 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine, Hibbs began private practice in psychiatry thirteen years later in Tampa, Florida, after serving with the Army Medical Corps during World War II. 

IN MEMORIAM

MASSACHUSETTS GAMMA

1893 - 1979†

EDITOR'S NOTE. Massachusetts Gamma at Harvard, one of ΣAE's great old chapters, closed its doors in June 1979 after graduation left the chapter with a zero membership. In recent years the climate at Harvard has been one which has made the existence of a fraternity chapter difficult, and chances for reviving the chapter seem slim.

The eulogy that follows was written by Halford J. Pope, '25, a long-time member of ΣAE's Board of Trustees and one of Mass Gamma's most devoted alumni.

Corporation (Olivetti); Malcolm McNair, '16, professor at Harvard Business School; Gilbert Hood, '20, chairman of Hood Milk Company; Smythe Gambrell, '23, and Charles Gambrell, '25, retired senior vice presidents of major New York banks; and Neil McElroy, '25, former chairman of Procter & Gamble and former Secretary of Defense. Countless other prominent businessmen, doctors, lawyers, and several Rhodes Scholars complete the roster.

During our eighty-six years of existence, our

Kudos in the life of Mass Gamma are especially owing to: P. K. McElroy, '20, was president of the House Corporation (which functioned also as the alumni association) until his death in 1973. He was backed up by trustees with long membership also, including Peter Harwood, '46 (the last president); Lewis Dunton, '34; Richard Gove, '44; Gilbert Hood, '20; Harry Rice, '39; and myself.

I quote from the trustees' 1974 annual giving letter:

"The spirits of Doc Mellus, Lank Smith, Bill Morton and PK McElroy rejoice as they flap their wings up there . . . Your trustees and active members attended PK's memorial service. I quote Rev. Mark:

"Today is All Saints' Day in the Christian church and we are here to celebrate the life of one of the saints, Paul Kinney McElroy. He had a slightly gruff exterior which covered the tenderest of hearts. He was always doing something for others. His laugh, that wry humor, which happily quite often got out of hand (we all loved him for it)

"That we are thriving now is a tribute to PK, our president for twenty-five years, and to Robin Wynne of the new Harvard crop. Kudos go to Ken Tracey from our Evanston staff, who blew the flame to life."

Our financial history was marked by our annual giving campaign, which was conducted for over twenty-five years. The annual contributions from alumni averaged \$1,350 (this before high inflation). "Lank" Smith, '07, got out the trustees' annual giving letter, sent with the chapter newsletter for fifteen years. His inimitable style and wit, his handwritten personal notes on the margin of the appeal letter, fostered good support for the chapter. PK McElroy and myself were co-chairmen of the 1966 Building Fund Drive, which raised \$25,000 to buy the house at 85 Putnam Avenue.

In conclusion, our alumni will recall from our old pledge "poem":


"There stands on Mount Minerva
A weather-beaten oak
Within its heart a charter,
Whose words we often quote . . ."

An appropriate gesture went with each phrase, and woe be to the pledge who missed a single nuance.

Massachusetts Gamma stood like an oak for over eighty years, weathering three wars and sundry membership and financial crises. In the last five years, decay set in and the chapter has toppled. Fond memories remain to many of its alumni, to whom this ode is most addressed.

IT IS WITH DEEP REGRET THAT, AS A member of Massachusetts Gamma at Harvard for fifty-seven years, I write about the demise of our chapter — probably for the last time.

The 1979 edition of *The Phoenix* lists 1,463 alumni of the chapter. In 1965 there were 1,323 initiates, making it the sixth ΣAE chapter in size at that time. In the last fourteen years, however, only 140 members were added, or ten a year average. That tells the story statistically, but the reasons were these:

—The radical student movement in the late 60s and early 70s.

—Inflation. It costs \$9,000 to \$10,000 a year to attend Harvard. Little is left over for fraternity expenses.

—The House system. This adaptation of the Oxford-Cambridge small college system, started in 1935, gave major competition for fraternities. As John Leshy, EA in 1966, wrote in the chapter newsletter:

"We do not live in our house, we do not eat there, and intramural sports and other activities are conducted at the House level. Our present forty-three brothers hail from twenty-three states."

—The three-year rule. Since President Eliot's time in the 80s, freshmen have not been allowed to belong to clubs or fraternities.

—Lack of interest. This has been the final and compelling factor. Present day students are more interested in Harvard's manifold academic, sports, and other activities than in fraternity or club social pursuits. Fewer than ten percent belong to such organizations.

As for some background on Mass Gamma, Harry Bunting founded the chapter in 1893. It has provided ΣAE with an Honorary ESA, Neil McElroy; two ESRs Howard Nash and Edward Virgin; two editors of *THE RECORD*, Herbert Lakin and Dr. Edward Mellus; a president and vice president of the National Board of Trustees, myself and Charles Gambrell, respectively; and two Merit Key winners, "Lank" Smith and Adlai Holler. Many members have become Founder Members and substantial contributors to ΣAE.


Some prominent alumni have been: James Rand, '08, chairman of Remington Rand (Sperry Rand); Leon Stowell, '14, president of Underwood

chapter quarters varied between rented and owned places. After World War I, we had a pillared colonial mansion on Brattle Square. There we set a good table, housed a dozen members, and provided a good ΣAE atmosphere. I still prize a photo of Billy Levere with our chapter officers.

Then, an irresistible offer (apparently) came along to sell the house, and the proceeds were used to build a fine new brick house at 60 Boylston Street (now the Harvard Athletic Association). This turned out to be a serious error because the Harvard House system started in 1935, and in 1941 all but one or two members left for World War II.

For the next fifteen years we rented quarters; then, in 1966, bought a house and renovated it. The chapter peaked at sixty-five members, as the brothers enthusiastically pitched in and fixed up the house, strongly aided by the alumni.

In the late 60s, the radical movement in the colleges and especially at Harvard caused our membership to falter and in 1972 we got down to one member. By 1974, as covered later, we were back up to twenty-seven members with good strong leaders. But in the next five years, the leaders moved on and less responsible, less interested members resulted in a decline to zero membership by June 1979.




