Craig Stripling

A Milestone

The Levere Memorial Foundation passed an important and historic mark this fall when it named Craig Stripling, Texas '68 (*Rho*), as Founder Member 1000. His total contribution of \$1,000 brought the total amount raised by the Founder Member program since its inception in 1928 to \$1,000,000.

Stripling, 38, lives in Nacogdoches, Texas, with his wife Wendy, where he is a partner with the law firm of Stripling and Sutton and prosecutor for The Municipal Court of the City of Nacogdoches. He is a member of the Texas Bar Association, the Federal Bar Association, the National Society of Sons of the American Revolution and other prestigious groups. He is also licensed to practice in the Supreme Court of the United States of America.

Prior to graduating with a bachelor of arts degree from the University of Texas, he served the Texas Rho chapter as Eminent Deputy Archon, house manager, twice as state rush chairman, and attended Leadership School. He received his law degree from the South Texas College of Law in 1974. He said he considered it a particular privilege and rare pleasure to become Founder Member 1000 because this year represents the 100th birthday of his collegiate chapter, Texas Rho.

FROM THE EDITOR

CLOSING A CHAPTER IS AND NEVER has been a duty relished by the fraternity. It is a hard reality that has had to be faced since our founding, and closures will regrettably continue as long as the fraternity maintains its high standards which have helped it grow and prosper.

For brothers and alumni of a chapter that is threatened with or experiences, such a death, nothing can sooth the anger, frustration and sorrow that follows it. Many times, alumni are shocked not so much by the action itself, but by the reasons for which the chapter was closed; most of them never had any idea that anything was wrong. The problem is, many of the chapter's undergraduates never really knew either. This year the

National Office was forced to close two collegiate chapters at the University of Texas and Louisiana State University. While the closures are temporary punitive measures that hurt are admittedly painful, the long term effects can only benefit the chapter's life. Reorganizations and revivals have always strived to retain the inherent excellence of a chapter's spirit while flushing out the failures. This issue contains an article that tells the story of four chapters who went through the humiliating experience of having their charter taken back; but who returned, most within only two to three years, brighter than ever.

Being one that never likes to say good-bye, I would rather say thank you to the fraternity for giving me the op-

portunity to serve it through the editorship of this magazine.

Throughout the past year and a half, I have had the pleasure of working for and with some very fine men on the Supreme Council and the National Staff. I especially thank Ken Tracey, who gave me a job out of college, and with it the freedom to do what I thought was best for the magazine. *The Record* is a priceless tool that this fraternity must use to draw together its members, and it has been a privilege to be a part of it.

THE PHOENIX IS NOT ONE OF THE sacred symbols of Sigma Alpha Epsilon for nothing. Throughout SAE's history, it has exemplified the fraternity's immortal spirit to thrive in the face of adversity. The aftermath of the Civil War provided the first test of SAE's strength — out of the literal ashes of the South, we flourished and became greater than we had been before. The same things are happening a century later on campuses around the country. Some chapters have their houses burned to the ground and rebuilt, as did the chapter at Tulane University in 1982 and at the Universities of Kansas and Toledo in 1984. But other chapters can suffer a long death that takes years to take its toll, and years to bring the chapter back to life. Most times, it is not the destruction of the house, but a fatal blow to the spirit.

In the past two years, Sigma Alpha Epsilon has brought back to life several chapters that had suffered defeat years before. Our revivals at the University of Connecticut, Gettysburg College, the College of William and Mary and Miami University in Ohio are proof that when the fraternity suspends a chapter's charter, it always has the intention of giving it back.

Most of us who come from thriving chapters of SAE could not have imagined what it would have felt like to have our charter taken away from us, nor what it would feel like to pledge a newly reorganized chapter. It takes a lot of courage. It takes courage from the local alumni who commit themselves to bringing such a chapter back to life, and it takes courage for a pledge to commit himself to a chapter that does not support itself or him with a grand house, traditions of excellence and intramural trophies, but with the sincere devotion of its newly found members.

A revived chapter comes up against a lot of obstacles. Every phase of the chapter's operations have to be planned, nothing can be left to tradition. Many times, the old traditions are what closed the chapter in the first place, so the chapter has to make a fresh start. Rush, community and university relations, campus involvement, social calendars, intramurals — all must be pursued with an extra amount of effort under the scrutinizing eyes of the university, the student body, other greeks, and yes, even other chapters and the National

Office of SAE. It is a mixed blessing, but often times it proves to be the one factor in making the chapter stronger than it was before.

The stories of the four chapters brought back to life have a few things in common. Two of the chapters — Virginia Kappa at William and Mary and Pennsylvania Delta at Gettysburg College — were old chapters with rich histories founded before and in the wake of the Civil War. The other two, Connecticut Beta at the University of Connecticut and Ohio Tau at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, were founded much later, but still had seen many years as thriving and vibrant groups. Virginia

Kappa and Connecticut Beta suffered from the malaise that hit a lot of chapters during the late sixties and early seventies; apathy and disinterest in greek life on college campuses that had grown out of the anti-establishment attitude of the protest era. Connecticut Beta lapsed in 1970 and Virginia Kappa lingered on until 1977 when it fizzled out with just seven members left. Ohio Tau and Pennsylvania Delta were victims of a different ailment, the death of the spirit. Both chapters were closed for disciplinary problems brought on by either hazing or drug and alcohol abuse. They had the members but not the substance of a fraternity.

Gettysburg



The Pennsylvania Delta chapter at Gettysburg College is of special significance in the history of the fraternity. It was founded in 1883 while the pain of Reconstruction and the Civil War were still being felt in the South. It was the first chapter founded north of the Mason-Dixon line, which boasted proudly that Sigma Alpha Epsilon was a southern fraternity, founded on the basics of southern values and tradition. Nonetheless, Pennsylvania Delta was established in the small college only a mile or two from the haunting battlefield where so many men lost their lives. It was a thriving chapter until disciplinary and hazing problems forced its closure in 1979. Part of the problem, said Past Eminent Supreme Archon Richard Generelly, who served on the Supreme Council at the time, was that having 35 members of the Gettysburg football team

in the chapter had created an unbalanced atmosphere not conducive to good fraternity life.

But it was never assumed that the Gettysburg chapter would never be re-established. Strong local alumni support, exemplified by the presence of a 32-member house corporation, guaranteed that soon the chapter would be back on campus in their old Victorian home. The chapter received its charter back in April of 1983.

Barry Schianno, Gettysburg '85, was in one of the first pledge classes in the revived chapter. He said that although the chapter had ceased to exist officially for almost four years, there still remained a tight bond between other ΣAEs on campus and local alumni that was clearly evident to men going through rush. "The other houses were more like social clubs. This was something special. They were just as close without a house," he said. A year after he pledged, the chapter's home at 31 West Lincoln Avenue was returned to the brothers to live in, but not without a lot of work to be done to make it livable again.

"The school had let the house get run down, and we didn't know how to do anything," Schianno said. "We went from eating in the cafeteria to feeding 30 guys three times a day." He said that the close brotherhood that existed in the chapter was the only way the members got things running again. "The closeness is the only way we got through it," he

said, "Without a guy picking up another guy's job, understanding that he had a big exam the next day, we never would have done it."

Alumni raised over \$8,000 the first year to open up the house, and each one of the house corporation co-signed for a few thousand dollars each on a \$25,000 loan from the National Endowment Fund of ΣAE.

The one thing that was missing from the chapter was a knowledge of The Ritual. Since all of the members who had had any knowledge of the initiation procedures were gone, the brothers were left with having only two initiation ceremonies (or "brotherizations" as they are called at Gettysburg). The task of keeping The Ritual in the chapter is one that Schianno said is a top priority.

Pennsylvania Delta is thriving again, having risen above the ashes of its past but not forgetting from where it came.

William & Mary



The Virginia Kappa chapter at the College of William and Mary in Williamsburg, Virginia is the sixth oldest chapter in ΣAE, originally founded on December 12, 1857. In 1860 it was named the fraternity's Grand Chapter, a distinction which only lasted a few years until the chapter died during the Civil War. College buildings were burned by Union troops, and William and Mary struggled through the remainder of the 19th century. Virginia Kappa, though, was installed again in 1925 from men who comprised a local fraternity.

The chapter lasted until 1977, when the Supreme Council closed the chapter for lack of membership. It was one of many chapters that suffered from the membership decline all across the country in the late sixties and early seventies. Largely through the efforts of former Education and Leadership Consultant Dan Barnett, Georgia Tech '81 (Phi), and Bob Dutro, Miami '59 (Ohio Tau), Virginia Kappa was revived in 1982 with a

group of eight men as the first pledge class.

"The toughest part for me," said Dutro, Director of Development for William and Mary and Province Gamma Archon, "was the first rush party," which was put on by a group of local alumni who had been out of the practice of rush for a few years and didn't quite know what to do to attract pledges, or "shakes." "We had the worst band," he remembered, putting his hand over his eyes. He said that a large amount of help in the first few rush parties came from other Virginia ΣAE chapters at nearby Randolph Macon College (*Alpha*) in Ashland and the University of Richmond (*Tau*) who sent brothers down to rush.

Today the chapter has over 30 members and is making great strides toward making an impact on campus. The one big struggle which remains is to secure housing. Right now the chapter is without a house and brothers are spread all over campus, which makes for a difficult time trying to organize events and making sure everyone makes it to chapter meetings. Dutro said that last year the college assured the chapter that it would have on-campus housing for this school year, but then reneged on the promise after it realized that the chapter was just shy of 37 members. The college did give them office space, though, and next year looks better as far as housing is concerned. "We all thought we were going to have a place to call home and it didn't work out that way," said Dutro, the chapter's advisor. "I think, though, that we'll have a group that's even stronger because of that." Next year's pledges won't pick the house because of an imposing residence, but a strong showing of

brotherhood.

Dutro said that the first group of pledges in 1982 weren't really sure if they wanted to take the chance on joining a "new" fraternity on campus. They were understandably cautious, but once they

made the decision, they committed themselves thoroughly to the cause of the chapter. "We're where we are today because of those first eight," he said.

Connecticut

Rather isolated, the University of Connecticut is nestled in the hills of the northwestern part of the state, far away from anything resembling an urban environment (although Hartford is half an hour away). Its soccer team is to Connecticut what football is to Nebraska; it's a small school with a lot of spirit. The same can be said for the ΣAE chapter there. From 1970 to 1983, ΣAE didn't exist at Connecticut. But a group of six undergraduates gathered their best friends and revived the Connecticut Beta chapter in September 1983.

The chapter was originally founded in 1943 and lasted until 1970. The chapter was strong on campus, but its move to another house off campus in 1970 proved to be a mistake. Eminent Supreme Recorder Kenneth Tracey, who was the chapter's Education and Leadership Consultant at the time, recalled that the chapter's isolation from campus created apathy which caused membership and the quality of chapter life to go down considerably.

Today the chapter has 25 active members and seven pledges, a healthy number for a chapter without a house

from which to rush. Mark Newcity, Connecticut '85, echoed the brothers at Virginia Kappa when he said, "We have to offer them (the rushees) something more than a house." The members are also lacking a house for their alumni to return to on football weekends, although they do show up at tail-gate parties

around the stadium. One member said that the alumni were very happy that the chapter was back on campus, but "they were sad too because there wasn't any place to come and just have a cup of coffee." Brothers admit that alumni support and interest is going to be vital for their success in obtaining a house and in rush.

Without their house, the brothers have to extend twice the effort to organize meetings and events. The lack of a central meeting place has forced the group to be extremely flexible in their schedules, something that the officers accept without grumbling. If there is one thing to be said for this group of brothers, it is their cheerful adaption to a pretty adverse situation. Because UConn is a school where students go home on weekends quite a bit, parties are hard to organize, and campus life is not what it is at a school of larger size and notoriety. Their strong brotherhood is all they have had to sustain them through their first year. They do have several campus leaders and notable athletes in the chapter who have helped spread the name of ΣAE around campus.

Miami

Ohio Tau was founded at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio on October 4, 1919. Joe Walt wrote in his book, *The Era of Levere, 1910-1930*, that no other college was as well known for its association with greek-letter societies than Miami University, founded in 1809. It was a rich place to plant a chapter for Sigma Alpha Epsilon, and Ohio Tau flourished for a long time until a general chapter decline occurred in the seventies. The chapter's charter was placed in receivership with a group of alumni in 1981 in response to that decline, due most of all to drug abuse and general indifference to the principles of the fraternity.

By the fall of 1982, it was evident that the chapter was priding itself on its negative attitude; strangely proud of the fact that it was anti-greek, period.

The National Office then received a call from nine sophomores from Miami who had gone through rush, seen the SAE house, and had been tremendously disappointed. Some of them were legacies, others just interested in joining a strong national organization, and they wanted to pledge the chapter and change it for the better. The National Staff was so impressed by this show of initiative that it sent three men down to Miami to investigate and see what could be done.

On December 5, 1982, then Director of Chapter Development David Arendt, along with E & L Consultants Clyde Shores and Stan Strom traveled to Oxford to interview the nine men. The

group had already established on paper a new set of by-laws and organization for the chapter that was waiting to be applied to Ohio Tau. Arendt, Strom and Shores then had a confrontation with the active chapter and presented them with an ultimatum; sign a behavioral contract and promise to change the atmosphere of the chapter, accept these new members, or cease to be active members. After most of the 49 members were interviewed, only six agreed to sign the contract and welcome the changes that would be brought about by the admittance of the other nine interested students. It was a swift, aggressive move, but one that has worked.

Since that time, the house has been totally renovated, the chapter's size is up to 95 men, and the brothers there won the Chapter Achievement Award in 1984. They were also nominated to receive the Chapter Housing Award and the John Baugh Award for Outstanding Pledge Programming. Now Director of Chapter Development Stan Strom said, "They are undisputedly the top fraternity on campus." E & L Consultant Scott Haggard, who visited the chapter this semester, said that it was the best chapter he had visited since he began working for the National Office in July of this year.

This fall, the National Office suspended the charter of the Texas Rho chapter at the University of Texas at Austin for hazing. It is by no means the end of that chapter. With hope, it will flourish again as these chapters have after a brief sleep to rejuvenate its spirit. We can all learn something from their examples. ■

Texas Rho Suspended by Supreme Council

The Texas Rho chapter of Sigma Alpha Epsilon located at the University of Texas was suspended on December 3, 1984 for hazing violations.

The chapter was found guilty of violating the National Laws of SAE and the anti-hazing statutes of the University of Texas and the State of Texas after a series of incidents which had been brought to the attention of local authorities and the National Office.

It was not the first time the chapter had been accused of hazing violations. Texas Rho was placed on probation with the National Office in 1981 for hazing abuses which caused a pledge to suffer injury after calisthenics. After giving evidence that it sought improvement, the chapter was taken off probation in June, 1983.


Under the terms of the present suspension, the chapter forfeits all rights and privileges of an active chapter of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity. This includes the right to pledge and initiate members, display or wear any SAE insignia, badge or other regalia, and hold no functions, events or meetings under the auspices of the fraternity.

It was recommended by the National Staff that the former undergraduate members of Texas Rho work with alumni and members of the National Staff to reform the pledge program and all other deficiencies in order to petition the Supreme Council to reinstate the charter.

The suspension of the charter has shown once again how the fraternity cannot and will not tolerate hazing activities. Hazing still remains a blemish on fraternity life along with alcohol and drug abuse — it can serve no positive or constructive purpose within a chapter. Hazing is completely contradictory to the ideals and practices of a gentleman, an archaic display of false manhood, and most important, it is illegal.

Hazing is identified in the National Laws of Sigma Alpha Epsilon in Sections 67 and 69 under pledge education and initiation activities. ■

1984: a year took on the familiarity of 1776, 1941 or 2001, courtesy of Mr. George Orwell and his nightmarish book on the predicted state of the human condition. But now it is over and it has turned out to be a rather typical year for most people; and typically successful for Sigma Alpha Epsilon.

On the chapter level, success is most often measured by rush results, intramural trophies, having all the bills paid and a home in which to live. On a national level, much of the same criteria are used, but they are helped met by one greater quality. Tradition. One of the most important reasons for ΣAE's continued success is the presence of the traditions of strength, commitment and loyalty of its members. Our fraternity has endured for more than 128 years, and the older it gets, the firmer the foundation it has for continued growth and stability.

And ΣAE is growing. We presently have 190 active chapters in the United States, the highest in our history. They are all chapters who have met and surpassed the fraternity's minimum stand-

ards requirement and are thriving organizations on their campuses. As of December 1, 1984, 194,521 men have been initiated into ΣAE since our founding in 1856, which includes the 3,908 young men who became active brothers during the 1983-84 fiscal year (July 1, 1983 to June 30, 1984).

We have also made an attempt to re-establish ourselves on campuses where we have been forced to suspend the chapter's charter. In September of 1983, the Connecticut Beta chapter at the University of Connecticut was re-installed after a 13 year absence, and the South Carolina Phi chapter was once again reactivated in Greenville, South Carolina from men at Furman University. Two other chapters were recently re-organized and will be awarded their charters in the next two years; the old New York Delta chapter at Syracuse University and the Wisconsin Phi chapter at Beloit College. We also plan to re-organize our previously active chapters at the University of Mas-

sachusetts, Texas Christian University, and Marshall University in West Virginia.

Besides taking care of our old chapters, we have established ourselves at new campuses in the past year as well. Two new chapters were chartered in April of 1984 at California Polytechnic State University at San Luis Obispo (named California Tau), and at Alma College (Michigan Delta-Tau) in Michigan. New colonies were founded in October at the University of Santa Clara and the University of California at San Diego. In December, all active chapters and alumni associations voted favorably to accept the colony at the University of La Verne in California as a chartered group. It will be installed in January, 1985.

The average size of our chapters rose to 74 members in 1984, a 12% increase over last year's figure. In August, 592 delegates from 158 chapters and 5 colonies attended the Leadership School, a significant increase from the number of brothers who attended in 1983. To ac-

commodate this increase in membership, the National Office has modified its membership records system to effectively monitor pledge and initiation rates for each chapter.

On local levels, our chapters were making a difference on their campuses and in their communities through their charitable activities. Chapters across the country collectively raised over \$100,000 for the Muscular Dystrophy Association, and over \$75,000 for the Easter Seal Society. Add to those figures the thousands of pints of blood donated at local blood drives, the many hours spent with handicapped and underprivileged children, food drives, and other local charities that are consistently helped by ΣAE chapters; and they are to be commended for making an effort to

continued to serve its vital role in the life of the fraternity through alumni commissions, chapter advisors, house corporations, and alumni associations. In January, a new Director of Alumni Services and Housing will join the National Staff to provide the needed services to alumni groups throughout the country. Financial support has flourished as well as that of our volunteers. This year alumni contributed more than \$400,000 to The Levere Memorial Foundation to help support the fraternity.

Our national leadership has fulfilled its role through the Supreme Council's guidance of our finances and presence at chapter celebrations, and the work of the

many committees which guide the different courses of ΣAE. Our committees on extension, the Ritual, national laws, alumni services, alcohol awareness, housing and others have provided needed sound advice. We thank their members and their chairmen for their tireless efforts.

The healthy state of our brotherhood depends on the combined efforts of undergraduates and alumni; active brothers who continue tradition and make ΣAE the very best fraternity on their campuses, and alumni for their guidance and support. At the close of 1984 we can pause and give ourselves congratulations for fulfilling our obligations to each other with enthusiastic fraternity.

have a positive impact in their communities. Chapters also made a greater effort this year to report their achievements in *The Record*.

With all of these achievements, there were also some problems which still demand the attention of everyone who is concerned with the welfare of our members. Alcohol abuse still plagues many chapters. More incidents of hazing, property damage and poor neighbor relations can be traced directly to alcohol abuse than any other source. ΣAE is approaching the problem educationally through the chapter consultant visitation program and the alcohol clinics now sponsored by the ΣAE Leadership Foundation and the National Interfraternity Conference, but sometimes swift action is needed. Thirteen chapters are now on a "hazing watch" by the National Office and will be closely monitored throughout the coming year. With hope, the social campaign against drunk driving and other forms of alcohol abuse will continue and have a positive effect on our members.

Our alumni involvement and support

The National Office, the service headquarters for Sigma Alpha Epsilon, is staffed by about 30 people who work full or part-time to support our members with the variety of services ΣAE offers and to preserve our heritage at The Levere Memorial Temple. The following is a report of their operations.



Alumni Services & Housing

The alumni services department was formed in 1982 to assist with the development of local alumni associations, house corporations, and services for regional alumni volunteers. Filling the position of Director of Alumni Services and Chapter Housing in January 1985 was John L. T. Edwards, Idaho '84 (Alpha). John was alumni chairman at Idaho Alpha for two years and also served as pledge educator and rush chairman.


As his title states, his duties will be divided into two areas. In the area of housing, he will be the liaison to the Permanent Committee on Chapter Housing, maintain a system of identifying and helping weak house corporations, and guide the award programs for house corporations and chapter house maintenance. Future plans include manuals for house corporations and house managers.

His alumni concerns will include being the liaison to the Committee on Alumni Services, work with the Director of Communications on alumni news for *The Record*, develop training programs for alumni associations and assist chapters with alumni relations programs. Several publications will be produced by this department, including manuals for alumni relations and alumni associations. The director will also promote Founders Day activities to assure the greatest possible local alumni involvement and interest.



Chapter Development

Stan C. Strom, Arizona State '82 (Beta), joined the National Staff in 1982 as an Education and Leadership Consultant and now serves as Director of Chapter Development, a post he has held since 1983. He has overall responsibility for providing programs and services to the 190 collegiate chapters, most visible of which is the consultant visitation program. Assisting Stan in this effort to remain in constant contact with our chapters are five Education and Leadership Consultants. They are Michael T. Fahrbach, Bowling Green State '83 (Ohio Kappa), Glenn "Woody" Wood and F. Keene Miller, both Emory '83 (Georgia Epsilon), Wade R. Quinn and R. Scott Haggard, both from Texas Tech '84 (Alpha).

With the increase from four to five consultants this year, the average number of chapters assigned to each dropped from around 48 to 38, improving the quality of service each will be able to provide. Provinces are assigned in the following manner: Michael Fahrbach (Lambda, Kappa, Eta, Phi and Psi), Woody Wood (Alpha, Nu, Chi, Upsilon and Sigma), Keene Miller (Gamma, Iota, Theta, Zeta and Tau), Wade Quinn (Epsilon, Omicron, Pi, Omega and Rho), and Scott Haggard (Nu-Epsilon, Xi, Delta, Mu and Beta).

As in past years, emphasis in chapter development has been focused on im-

proving weaker chapters with the assistance of a chapter evaluation system that places immediate priority on chapters that demand extra guidance and development. Computerization of chapter reports and profiles has made statistical information and evaluations more readily available to the E & L consultants.

The Financial Management Manual, published last fall, will hopefully assist chapter treasurers with more efficient management techniques.

This year there will be a concerted effort to make sure that all chapters will attend and be able to vote at the 1985 Convention in Atlanta in June. The 50th Leadership School will be held in August, and all chapters will be encouraged, if not convinced, to attend. Award applications will be promoted so that



more chapters become involved in the selection process. The fraternity's management manuals will be consolidated into one notebook for chapters, and position statements on topics such as alcohol abuse and other concerns will be distributed.

Extension

The extension division of the chapter development department was extremely busy this year installing new chapters and colonies. Grant Gier, Nebraska '84 (Lambda-Pi), replaced Ken Johnson as Extension Director in June of 1984. Before Ken's departure from the staff he oversaw two additional chapter installations and one colony organization. The

two most recent chapters installed into ΣAE were at Alma College in Alma,

Michigan (Michigan Delta-Tau) and California Polytechnic State University at San Luis Obispo, California (California Tau).

Two existing colonies are currently waiting to gain chapter status. The colony at the University of Nevada — Las Vegas will petition the national fraternity at the Atlanta Convention next summer for their charter. The University of La Verne colony will be installed as a chapter on January 19, 1985. Two new colonies were established this fall at the University of California at San Diego in La Jolla, California, and at the University of Santa Clara in Santa Clara, California. A re-organization of the old New York Delta chapter at Syracuse University in New York took place in October 1984, as well as at Beloit College in Wisconsin (the old Wisconsin Phi chapter). Mark Michaels, a transfer initiate from Case-Western Reserve University in Cincinnati is the leader of the colony at Syracuse. New York Delta's alumni are extremely excited about this new group and feel that the members have shown evidence of lasting strength with good leadership.

The Extension Advisory Committee, consisting of George Ilse, Joseph Walt, Ken Tracey and Clint Smith will meet in January at the installation of the University of La Verne colony to target other institutions for colonization and monitor the progress of our existing colonies. Grant Gier, counsel and secretary to the committee, is in constant contact with these colonies to assure their progress to becoming full-fledged chapters.

The extension policy of SAE states that the fraternity seeks to affiliate with strong local fraternities or establish our own groups at strong academic institutions, if sufficient alumni support exists in the area to help in the organization. A prospective colony has to meet a set of rigid criteria before they can be approved to receive a charter, usually met in a range of six months to three years. The goal for the extension division for the next 18 months is to charter all of our existing colonies (currently 6) and establish six new colonies, while keeping close contact with newly installed chapters.



Communications

The most visible product of the communications department at the National Office is *The Record*, produced by Mark Smith, Kansas '83 (Alpha), Director of Communications since June of 1983. *The Record* was published on a timely seasonal basis this year, and its editorial content became more diversified and improved. Perhaps the most noticeable change in the magazine was the significant increase in chapter news, prompted by a greater effort from the headquarters to encourage chapters to report their events and achievements. This year, a greater effort will be made to reach out to the majority of *The Record*'s readership, our alumni. Nineteen eighty-five will be the "Year of the Alumnus" in the magazine. While there still will be the same amount of space devoted to chapter news, alumni will be featured more often than in the past.

The Director of Communications is also responsible for the promotion of SAE to its members and the general public. This was accomplished this year through the use of press releases to local and school newspapers on campuses and in cities where SAE has a chapter, announcing award winners and other people who have been helped by our programs, such as the SAE Leadership Foundation's summer intern program. Leadership School was promoted on a higher scale this year, which may have been responsible for the over 100 more men who attended in 1984 than in 1983.

With the help of Joe Walt, the fraternity's historian, a new revised edition of *The Phoenix* was published in the fall. Mr. Walt has been a tremendous help to this department through his articles in *The Record* and his updating of our membership statistics in this annual report issue. It is a painstaking process keeping track of almost 4,000 new initiates each year, but a task which Mr. Walt pursues with pleasure.

This year the communications de-

partment will be busy promoting the 1985 Convention in Atlanta and the 50th Leadership School. There is still a plan to expand the size of *The Record* to include more material from more sources so that its 70,000 regular readers will be better served.



Finance and Administration

Jeffrey S. Arnold, Millikin University '76 (Illinois Delta), joined the National staff in 1983 as Director of Finance and Administration. Jeff came to SAE after holding the position of Vice President of Administration and Operations for the Union National Bank and Trust Company of Elgin, Illinois. Jeff lives in St. Charles, Illinois with his wife Susan, son Barrett and daughter Mary Kathryn.

Besides the responsibility of overseeing the day to day operations of the National Office, Jeff's position requires the accounting and auditing for both the Fraternity and The Levere Memorial Foundation. Banking and investment, membership processing and merchandise, in-house printing, maintenance at The Levere Memorial Temple, plus the consideration of the tax and legal aspects of the fraternity. He also serves as liaison to the Board of Trustees of the National Endowment Fund, which oversees chapter mortgages; the Building Committee of The Levere Memorial Temple, and the Advisory Council of The Levere Memorial Foundation which is responsible for all of the Foundation's investments.

This year the department offered a greater variety of merchandise by using the services of an outside firm. Internal operations were also initiated to provide greater efficiency for our members.

Jeff is assisted by several people whose work is valuable to the operation of the office. Ida Horn joined the staff in January of 1984 as comptroller after more


than 25 years of banking experience. Evelyn Stuckle maintains the accounts receivable and investment sections of the department. Roberta Nelson, an employee of nearly six years, assumed the position of student loan administrator and administrative assistant to Jeff. Sari Hollander, who has worked for ΣAE for seven years, manages membership records and merchandise. Jeff Briggs is

ΣAE's in-house printer, mail clerk and assists Rose Kenna with the housekeeping duties. Linda Mathis and Karen Corrado are the office receptionists and Irene Dedeaux conducts all word processing.

Plans for the 1984-1985 fiscal year include the complete computerization of the finance office in the areas of payroll, accounts receivable and payable, general ledger and student loans. Also the complete revamping of membership services

to provide greater efficiency in processing pledge and active memberships.

The following is a collective financial statement of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity and The Levere Memorial Foundation. Readers should be aware that The Levere Memorial Foundation is the tax-deductible entity which owns The Levere Memorial Temple and the surrounding grounds in Evanston, Illinois. The fraternity owns the office wing of the Temple.



Annual Report of the Levere Memorial Foundation

THE LEVERE MEMORIAL FOUNDATION was founded in 1927 for the sole purposes of erecting and maintaining The Levere Memorial Temple to honor brothers who had served in the armed forces, preserve the relics of our history and to establish and grant scholarships to worthy and needy students. Fifty-seven years later, the foundation is still doing exactly what it set out to do.

Throughout those 57 years, the foundation has been supported completely by the generosity of the many brothers who have contributed annually or remembered the fraternity in their will, establishing endowed scholarships and bequests for a variety of projects. This year the foundation poured more than \$100,000 into maintaining the grand structure of the Temple and continued to help many an undergraduate meet the cost of his education through student loans and scholarships.

Renovations and improvement of the Temple included three major projects undertaken throughout the year. The terrace on the rear of the Temple, the sight of many activities at Leadership

School, was completely rebuilt. The central tower had a structural defect repaired and work will begin soon on the tower room itself. The pipe organ which had provided music at many fraternity ceremonies, weddings and church services, was in desperate need of repair and was replaced with a brand new pipe organ, a gift from past Eminent Supreme Archon Russell P. Heuer, Jr., Pennsylvania '55 (Theta), and his father, Russell P. Heuer, Sr., Pennsylvania '17 (Theta). Now that structural repair has been completed on the building itself, the foundation will go to work in 1985 to renovate the artwork on the Temple's interior, most in need of repair being the fresco murals in the chapel and tower room painted by Johannes Waller in the 1930s.

Eraldo Carugati, the famed illustrator who had served as the artist of the Temple for more than 25 years, retired this year to his native Milan, Italy. The foundation will miss his expertise and devoted service. During his years at ΣAE, Mr. Carugati painted many portraits of distinguished leaders of the

fraternity and helped restore several older and valuable portraits painted by other artists. His last commission before retirement was a portrait of Louis Nippert, son of Alfred K. Nippert, the father of the Temple.

The foundation continued its recognition of academic excellence by presenting several awards to distinguished undergraduate scholars. The Walter B. Jones fund awarded a \$500 scholarship to Michael LeCroy, Duke '84 (North Carolina Nu) for his outstanding academic record and his contribution to the scholastic atmosphere of his chapter as a whole. The Province Zeta Scholarship for Academic Achievement was given to Mark Mathewson, Kansas State '86 (Beta), who was awarded \$1,000 for his scholarship while a pledge at his chapter. He was the first recipient of this award, which he will be eligible to receive for the next three years of his college career.


In addition to these scholarships, the foundation also granted 59 student loans at a low 6% interest to undergraduate and graduate ΣAE students during fiscal 1984. Nineteen Resident Educational

Advisors were provided to various chapters with \$2,000 stipends, and over \$120,000 to assist chapter house library developments through the Library Allocation Program.

The foundation undertook the fraternity's annual giving program, and succeeded in raising over \$400,000 to support its programs. The foundation named 194 Founder Members this year, an incredible increase from previous years due to the attraction of a donor receiving credit on his national fraternity giving record for gifts to his chapter through the chapter house library program.

The foundation is still planning to be able to assist each chapter in acquiring its own computer. The success of the foundation's own computer operation in maintaining membership records, fund-raising and finance could be applied on a chapter level with great results. The overall objective is to facilitate the hands-on computer experience so essential to many brothers' future careers. To assist in career planning, the foundation distributed Career Planning Guides to over 3,000 college juniors.

The foundation's operations are divided into two groups; programming and development, whose directors' reports follow.



Foundation Programs

Jeffrey J. Kinzler, Loyola '83 (Illinois Alpha-Omega), joined the National Staff in April 1984 to manage the alumni support and annual giving programs and to oversee the operation of data processing for the fraternity and The Levere Memorial Foundation. As an undergraduate, Jeff was a charter member of the Loyola chapter and served as Eminent Archon for the chapter's first two years. Recently married, he and his wife Karie live in Chicago.

The data processing side of the foun-

dation's operation is a task requiring the combined efforts of several people. Frances Gillan, Jacqueline Haynes and Dorothy "Bear" Coleman (the senior member of the National Office staff in number of years employed by ΣAE), have all helped to make possible the increased effectiveness and efficiency of the Hewlett-Packard computer system acquired several years ago. As systems manager, Frances oversees and directs the data-processing and maintenance of the computer facilities, housed in the newly renovated fourth floor of the Temple. As assistant to Frances, Jackie performs the bulk of the data-entry, which includes member record updating, address changes, donations and deceased member information. "Bear" assists Jeff with secretarial duties, gift acknowledgements and member level number assignments.

In order to store more information in the computer system, a new disc-drive unit was required to increase data storage space. The increased capabilities of both the computer system and its users allows the staff to be more self-sufficient and rely less on outside data management firms.

The programs offered by The Levere Memorial Foundation continued to prove beneficial to our undergraduates in 1984. Among these, to promote the scholarship of our chapters, the Resident Educational Advisor Program, the Chapter House Library Allocation program, and the chapter scholarship award programs have been enhanced. All chapters have the opportunity to improve their chapter house library by acquiring books and magazines at low cost (20% of retail value) through the foundation. For the first time, monetary awards will be given to the chapters with the most outstanding scholarship and most improved scholarship awards in 1985.



Development

David L. Arendt, Drake '78 (Iowa

Delta), is in his sixth year at the National Office. As Director of Development, Dave is responsible for the administration of endowed scholarships, planned giving in the form of trusts, bequests and life insurance, and capital fund-raising for the foundation. Dave also advises house corporations, on request, on local fund-raising efforts.

In a spirit of brother helping brother, and in reaction to cut-backs in government funding and loans for students, the foundation is attempting to fill the void to ensure access to a quality education for the members of ΣAE. There is currently over \$600,000 in low interest student loans outstanding to graduate and undergraduate ΣAEs. The demand for these loans continues to rise while funds available have diminished.

The Foundation has seven endowed scholarship funds. The income generated from these funds is given to deserving ΣAEs. It is our desire to have at least one endowed scholarship for each chapter. These scholarships can be given on a national basis or designated for specific chapters, provinces, or academic majors. Information on establishing an endowed scholarship is available by contacting Dave Arendt at the National Office.

The fraternity and foundation are very fortunate to have received several generous bequests in the past year.

Past Eminent Supreme Archon James D. Peterson's, Minnesota '57 (Alpha), estate established a \$75,000 endowed scholarship for Minnesota Alpha, \$50,000 for the support of the alcohol education program and other programs of the ΣAE Leadership Foundation, and a \$50,000 gift to The Levere Memorial Foundation establishing the Leadership School Endowment Fund.

A \$50,000 bequest from Florence S. Laurence was received establishing the Phil J. Laurence, Minnesota '15 (Alpha), Endowed Scholarship Fund.

From the estates of Robert, Washington '41 (Missouri Beta), and Amelia Riedell, ΣAE received bequests of \$150,000 which will be used by the National Endowment Fund for chapter house loans.

Col. Francis ImMasche, Kansas State '29 (Beta), bequeathed \$10,000 to the fraternity for a scholarship fund.





Bob Cousins, "Mr. ΣAE"

Dr. Robert L. Cousins, Mercer '24 (*Georgia Psi*), a recipient of every single award ever given by Sigma Alpha Epsilon, died Saturday, December 8, at the age of 80.

Known throughout the country as "Mr. ΣAE," Cousins dedicated himself to developing one of the best rush and alumni affairs programs in the United States. He held every office in Province Epsilon (Georgia and Alabama), and worked as chairman of the Permanent Extension Investigation Committee and as a member of the later Extension Advisory Committee.

Although he was elected as Honorary Eminent Supreme Archon at the Minneapolis Convention in 1967, he evaded the limelight of serving on the Supreme Council in order to contribute more to the fraternity on a regional level. He was the first man to be chosen for the honor from the diligent workers within the fraternity rather than someone from a position of public prominence, as has been the case when electing an Honorary ESA.

"He was the epitome of the spirit of the fraternity and will be sorely missed," said Eminent Supreme Archon John B. Warren, Jr.

Cousins also helped the young people of Georgia through secondary and higher education, both public and private. He served as Associate Director of the Southern Education Foundation for 12 years, chaired the United Negro College Fund, served as a trustee of numerous colleges and was a member of the Mercer University President's Council. He received the coveted President's Award from the Southern Education Foundation and the Distinguished Service Award from the Georgia School Boards, Inc.

Brother Cousins is survived by his wife Dickie, his daughter Catherine and son-in-law C. W. Marlow, Jr., and his grandchildren Daniell, William and Nancy.





PHILADELPHIA EAGLES SPECIAL teams coach Frank Gansz paces around the practice field with a remote and loudspeaker strapped to his belt, placing his field goal team into position.

"All right," he barks, "we've been out here for three and a half hours, playing our asses off! We've got three seconds left

in the game — it's a tie. Make it perfect, Mac. Make it perfect!"

Out from the sidelines comes number eight, Paul McFadden, 1984 graduate of Youngstown State University and member of its Ohio Alpha chapter of Sigma Alpha Epsilon. He coolly pops off three perfect field goals; no big deal. For

McFadden, the coach's scenario had been played out in real life the week before in a game against the Detroit Lions. With four seconds remaining in a 23-23 tie, McFadden kicked a 40-yard field goal that won the game.

This slight 5'11" 165-pound rookie and a twelfth round draft pick has turned out to be a bright spot in the Eagles' lackluster 1984 season. For his efforts against Detroit, he was awarded Pro Football Weekly's Golden Toe Award for the second time this year. During the same game, he kicked the longest field goal in Eagles' history — a 52-yarder. At the beginning of November, he had been successful on 19 of 22 field goal attempts, had not missed an extra point attempt (17 of 17), and was ranked third in the National Football Conference kick-scoring with a team high of 72 points. All this from a rookie who in August didn't even know if he would play a game at all this season.

During training camp last summer, two other kickers were favored to take the place of the recently departed Tony Franklin, who was traded to the New England Patriots last spring. Former University of Hawaii kicker Jim Asmus, a veteran of two previous Eagles' training camps who was beaten out on both occasions by Franklin, and Manny Matsakis, a eighth round draft pick from Capital University in Ohio, certainly had an edge over McFadden in terms of size and experience. But what Gansz and head coach Marion Campbell were looking at was consistency, and McFadden came out the winner. His cool concentration and quiet disposition have served him well since.

He was plucked out of Youngstown State where he hadn't played football until his junior year. Up until then, he had been a soccer standout, and his kicking prowess was noticed by Youngstown State coach Bill Narduzzi. McFadden took the better scholarship opportunity from Narduzzi, played a successful two years at Youngstown, and then waited on that cold day of the draft for his phone to ring. Drafted by the USFL Chicago Blitz in the ninth round, he held out for Philadelphia.

Perhaps his main source of strength and inspiration since his arrival in Philadelphia, besides his own self-confidence and concentration, has been fellow Youngstown state alumnus Ron Jaworski, the 11-year veteran quarter-

back for the Eagles. Jaworski is McFadden's holder and mentor, a relationship that has caught the interest and admiration of the press. McFadden never fails to give Jaworski a lot of the credit for his successful season. "I learn something new from him every time I go out there on the field," he said.

In training camp, Jaworski saved McFadden from two practical jokes regularly inflicted on rookies; a bogus trip to Atlantic City and compulsory "scuba stretching" in the pool at 7 a.m. He did, however, have to sing the Youngstown State fight song to Jaworski one night at dinner. "At training camp," he said, smiling, "you don't know a soul. It's a lot like being a pledge."

Sitting in a screening room below Veteran's Stadium, relaxed and munching on an orange after practice, he tried to still the clamour about his prodigious success. Because of his low profile and friendly manner, his success on the field has captured the sentiments of a lot of sports writers. "Everybody builds it up so much," he said. "When I

go out there, I'm just another guy on the team. Kicking is just another situation offense; and I feel very lucky. I've got the best protection in the business."

AND WHAT OF THE PRESSURES OF kicking in the NFL to make a living? He dismisses the question with, "kicking is such a simple thing. You can drive up and down the street and see little kids kicking footballs through trees." Monday through Saturday, he said, it's a job. But on Sundays when the Eagles play, it's a game. And during those games, one can see McFadden trailing coach Marion Campbell up and down the sidelines, waiting for that moment when there is no second chance.

He downplays his success as a defense against the unpredictable consequences of playing pro football. One of the disadvantages of early success is that "You can't be content, because the minute you get content, you get burned." He said he gets the feeling sometimes that the press is waiting for him to fall. He knows, too, that his job is anything but secure. He

shrugged and said, "I'm a kicker."

His loyalty to ΣAE is unfailing. He was initiated in 1980 just after the Ohio Alpha chapter house burned down and the chapter was anticipating receiving their charter again after a reorganization. They wouldn't let a fire get in the way of tradition, so they initiated McFadden's pledge class in the charred remains of the attic. Later, when playing football at Youngstown State, he never denied the fact that he was an ΣAE, even though the football team was anti-greek in sentiment. McFadden said he just told them they didn't know what they were missing.

As he was leaving the locker room to work on his leg strength in the weight room, he paused and said, "Can I just say one thing? ΣAE at Youngstown is the strongest house on campus — they came from a real hardship with the house burning down, and in a way, it was a good thing for that to happen." He smiled, remembering his days there, and strode back to the weight room. With that kind of class, he can't go wrong. ■

Another One on the Sideline . . .

FROM JULY 14 WHEN THE Philadelphia Eagles begin training camp until the end of the season sometime in December, Chuck Clausen, New Mexico '62 (*Tau*), works seven days a week, averaging about 12 hours a day plus traveling anywhere the Eagles play once a week. He is the head defensive line coach for the Eagles, and he goes through as much emotional upheavals every season as his players do. In fact, at 6'3" and 230 pounds, he could probably hold his own on the field.

He joined the Eagles coaching staff in 1976 while Dick Vermeil was still head coach and the team had gone through 15 straight losing seasons. It wasn't long, though, before Clausen's defense began making its mark in the National Football League. From 1977 to the present, it can boast that it has given up the fewest points of any defense in the league. After going to the playoffs in 1978 for the first time in 18 years, the Eagles went to the Super Bowl against the Oakland Raiders in 1980. That year Clausen was awarded The Highest Effort Award for athletics from the New York City Alumni Association, recognizing him for his professional excellence.

Before going to the pros to coach, Clausen was defensive line coach at Ohio State University under Woody Hayes (not a bad guy at all, he said), and spent a number of years on the high school and college level. He said that the most important thing for a coach to be is a teacher, because a coach has to communicate at a level deeper than just giving orders. "We're in a business," he said, "that has to be mistake-free, and a player has to operate at a pretty high emotional level. I never assume a player knows something just because he heard

me say it."

He thinks that the most important thing for a football player to have equal to physical power or agility is the power of concentration. "I've found that a player with average intelligence with a lot of concentration is a better player than someone who is very bright and has a low level of concentration." This discipline is important, he said, because of the long hours it takes to perfect plays and study the opponents moves and tactics from films. "It's sometimes very tedious and boring," he said.

Although Clausen doesn't get to spend much time with his family during the six months, they are as much into each game as he is. And losing a game is just as tough for him as it is for his players. He said that in the NFL, the teams are close enough in talent that every team has the chance to win every game, but that there is no such thing as playing a perfect one. He doesn't give himself much time to think about the team's losses. "When we lose," he said, "I usually give myself about 24 hours after a ball game, and then I've got to forget about it because I've got to be ready to play the next one." ■

Birmingham-Southern Chapter Stresses All-Rounded Excellence

It is no wonder the members of Alabama Iota are surprised by winning the John O. Moseley Zeal Award two years in a row, the first time since the award was created in 1956 that a chapter has been given it twice.

"Winning the Zeal Award was not really the goal we set. Our goal was to improve the fraternity, not put a plaque on the wall," says Don Shotts, Jr.

"We've always had a strong chapter here," says Chapter President Joel Megginson, "We've been nominated for the Zeal Award for the past three years. It was a surprise when we won the award the first time in 1983. We worked to improve some weak areas without thinking of a second Zeal Award. Winning it the second time was an even bigger surprise."

The chapter's long record of excellence includes winning the Province Epsilon Award four times in the past four years, and several other nominations for the Zeal Award.

What makes Alabama Iota special?

The brothers think it is a combination of several factors.

"I don't think it's just one specific thing," says Megginson. "It is a combination of excellence in several areas, a balancing of interests." At Leadership School, he says, they see many chapters that are strong in academics but weak in pledge programs, or strong in athletics but weak in alumni relations. Alabama Iota tries to strike a balance by being not necessarily the best, but at least good, in all areas.

It's a lesson Megginson, a senior pre-law student, transfers to his own life. While maintaining history and economics grades that have put him in Mortar Board and Omicron Delta Kappa honoraries, he finds time to be president of the Concert Choir as well as Eminent Archon of the chapter.

Members also think the closeness of the chapter is a factor in their success. They like to remember the visit two years ago from E & L Consultant Clyde Shores who asked each member to talk about the person sitting on his right. When they finished, Clyde said he had never

seen another chapter where the members seemed to know each other so well.

Another strength is their relationship with Birmingham-Southern College. Rush activities are very "pro-school" and are meant to help recruiting for the College as well as the fraternity. The pledge program is very constructive, with pledges encouraged to get involved in campus leadership as well as earn high grades.

This emphasis on the well-balanced individual is reflected in the accomplishments of active brothers. The current Student Government Association President, Kevin Alexander, is an SAE along with current leaders of the Triangle Club and College Republicans. The fraternity is well-represented in every campus honorary. In addition, the chapter has regularly won the campus All-Sports Trophy.

Philanthropy plays a big part in fraternity life, according to sophomore Steve Snypes who was philanthropic chairman last year. The chapter hosted Christmas and Easter parties for local needy children and participated in a recent basketball "shoot-a-thon" for the Birmingham Family Violence Project. Last year's annual King Kamehameha party raised \$750 for muscular dystrophy. This year's Hawaiian bash promises to be an even bigger success.

"We pay a lot of attention to ritual," says Eminent Deputy Archon D. Franklin of Birmingham. "We use The Ritual for our weekly meetings and many other chapter events. I think a lot of chapters don't take The Ritual seriously, but I think it makes us stronger."

Butch Shotts, a senior from Huntsville who has been chapter recorder, social chairman, and house manager, says he has noticed people from other chapters at leadership school who are not familiar with The Ritual.

"It adds a lot," he says. "The Ritual is very dramatic."

Despite their chapter's recent accomplishments, these SAEs see ways Alabama Iota is improving all the time. Finance committee member Shannon Smith, an economics major and student

government representative, points to the new house corporation as an example of recent improvement. The chapter paid off the mortgage on their house last spring and is working with the house corporation to finance future improvements.

"The house corporation is also a way to involve alumni more actively in our chapter," Smith says.

Alumni relations is an area where brothers feel they have room to grow. For the past three years they have sponsored an alumni banquet that has grown steadily in size. Last year the event drew about 250 people, more than half of them alumni. Along with the six alumni members of the house corporation, other alumni visit during the occasional reception or other barbeques held for alumni and parents during the spring semester.

"Our alumni involvement is growing," Megginson says, "but we still meet all of our financial responsibilities through active dues rather than alumni monetary support."

Alabama Iota was established in 1878 on the campus of old Southern University in Greensboro, Alabama, making it one of the oldest chapters in continuous existence. When Southern merged with Birmingham College in 1918, Alabama Iota moved to the new location just 55 miles from Sigma Alpha Epsilon's birthplace in Tuscaloosa.

Today the chapter has 55 brothers, 23 pledges, and one social affiliate. Birmingham-Southern College's president is former Honorary Eminent Supreme Archon Dr. Neal R. Berte, Cincinnati '62 (*Ohio Epsilon*). Two college vice presidents, Dr. Robert Moxley, Harvard '66 (*Massachusetts Gamma*) and Mr. George Jenkins, Birmingham-Southern '67, are alumni along with several faculty members and administrators including campus Chaplain Dr. Stewart Jackson, Auburn '71 (*Alabama Alpha-Mu*), and Fine and Performing Arts Chairman Dr. Thomas Gibbs, Birmingham-Southern '64.

From any angle, there is no question that Alabama Iota has something special going for it. Province Epsilon Archon William Dowell says, "From scholarship and leadership to financial affairs and simply getting reports in on time, Birmingham-Southern does things the right way. The chapter truly represents the best of what the fraternity experience is all about."

Virginia Omicron Works With UVA to Restore Its Home

Brothers at the Virginia Omicron chapter of ΣAE at the University of Virginia moved in to a completely restored home this fall as a result of a unique renovation program jointly sponsored by the chapter's house corporation and the university itself.

The University of Virginia took the initiative in the project when it decided to try and improve the physical condition of fraternity row. Since most of the homes in the area of Charlottesville were built at the turn of the century, the entire area was designated an historical landmark, making it possible for the fraternities to accept tax-deductible contributions from interested alumni.

Since the Virginia Omicron house was in such poor condition, it was decided by UVA that it should be the first house restored. The house was sold to the university at fair market value by the Virginia Omicron House Corporation for about \$200,000, which the university's Historic Renovation Committee used for investment until other funds were raised.

The remaining \$100,000 needed to

complete the project was raised from 21 alumni who became limited partners in the venture by buying shares of the house for \$5,000 apiece. With the money raised and plans having been drawn up several years before in anticipation of such a renovation, the remaining work took only three months to complete.

Jim Irvin, Virginia '85, the Eminent Archon, said that the new house has brought back a lot of pride that was missing before in the chapter. "Last year," he said, "nobody took care of the house." The chapter's alumni involvement has also improved. Irving said that at Homecoming two years ago, five alumni showed up at the house. This year, he said, 150 came. Add to that the largest pledge class that Virginia Omicron has taken in four years, and the chapter is well on its way to success.

The brothers at Virginia Omicron were truly blessed with a greater situation; a university that wanted to work with fraternities to get them back on their feet, enthusiastic and committed alumni involvement, and a renewed sense of pride in the chapter.

Virginia Zeta Most Improved

This fall, the **Virginia Polytechnic Institute** in Blacksburg, Virginia, gave its "Most Improved Chapter" award to the ΣAE Virginia Zeta chapter. The award, given each year by the Virginia Tech Interfraternity Council, was presented to the chapter because of its increased membership and strong constructive pledge program, strengthened financial status, increased campus and community activities, major house improvements and improved relations in the greek community.

Kansas Beta Dedicates Memorial

Kelly C. Jackson, Kansas State '85, would have received a degree in geology from **Kansas State University** next spring, had he not been killed in an auto accident in the summer of 1983. His tragic death prompted his brothers at Kansas Beta to erect a memorial to him at the chapter house, which they dedicated during homecoming on October 20. The memorial consists of two cast-iron lions, donated by alumni of the chapter and Kelly's friends. Eminent Archon Mike Morgan, Kansas State '86, wrote, "The death of a man like Kelly

with a quiet kindness and gifted athletic ability, was stunning to the house. We shall never forget the memory of our departed brother."

Community Service Important at Illinois Gamma

This fall, members of the Illinois Gamma chapter at **Northern Illinois University** were involved in two important community service projects. In October they held their first annual blood drive. Nearly forty pints of blood were collected, including a donation from Greg Sparrow, DeKalb's mayor.

Also in October, the chapter volunteered to assist the Sycamore Chamber of Commerce with their annual Pumpkin Fest. They sold t-shirts, directed the runners through a 10,000 meter race and set-up refreshments for the runners following the race. The Chamber of Commerce was so impressed with the chapter's work that they have already invited them back for next year.

Early Morning Sparks Fly at Ohio Nu

Early in the morning of October 13, a fire ripped through the Ohio Nu chapter house at the **University of Toledo**, causing \$75,000 worth of damage but no injuries to the brothers. The fire was caused by a faulty light fixture located in the chapter's library.

Flames destroyed the entire second floor living quarters, causing extensive damage to the brother's personal property, plus destroying all of the chapter's ritual equipment. Renovations will begin soon under the direction of the house corporation. Reported Phillip Long, Toledo '84, the brother's spirit is still high and they plan to come back stronger than ever.

Long Beach State

The brothers at the California Lambda chapter at **California State University at Long Beach** are desperately trying to help Bryant Patterson, Long Beach State '85, who was seriously injured last September by a drunken driver. He suffered a shattered pelvis, a leg broken in six places and a ruptured spleen that have contributed to terribly high hospital bills. Successful Tug-of-War at Cornell

The Alabama Chi chapter at the **University of South Alabama** won best overall participation in the school's annual Greek Week activities. The brothers at South Alabama had the highest percentage of members (89%) of a student organization to donate blood, collecting the largest amount of money for the rock-a-thon, and participated in talent

night. In addition, Arnie Nelson, *South Alabama* '85, was elected "Greek God" by the fraternity and sorority members which added more points to the chapter's total. In sports, ΣAE was dominant in water polo, volleyball, and had a fine season in flag football. The chapter hopes to win the University All-Sports Champion title next year.

Brothers Troy State Pull All-Nighter for MDA

During the Jerry Lewis Labor Day telethon in September, two brothers from the Alabama Epsilon chapter at **Troy State University** manned phones to solicit pledges for 23 straight hours, raising between them over \$546. Bryan Wallace and John Schaper, both *Troy State* '85, stayed by phones set up at the Pinckard Agency in Troy (owned by Ronnie Pinckard, *Troy State* '81) from 11 p.m. Sunday to 8 a.m. Monday. It was the fifth year that ΣAE has been in charge of the drive for the Muscular Dystrophy Association in Troy. Before their leadership, Troy did not participate in the telethon. LEVERE NAMED TO HALL OF FAME – The Fraternity-Sorority Hall of Fame has announced the induction of William C. Levere as the sole honoree for 1984. Brother Levere, who served as ESA from 1902-1906 and ESR from 1912-1927, is the first ΣΑΕ to be named to the "Greek" Hall of Fame, which incidently is located in The Levere Memorial Temple, ΣΑΕ headquarters in Evanston, Illinois.

ATLANTA TO BE CONVENTION HOST – The 129th Anniversary National Convention will be held in Atlanta, Georgia June 15-18, 1985 at the Hyatt Regency Hotel. The Business of the Convention will include consideration of the proposals to amend the National Laws and the election of a new Supreme Council. Ron Doleac, Southern Mississippi '70 (Sigma) and Alden Hess, Mount Union '60, (Ohio Sigma) and Lafayette (Penn Gamma) will square off in the race for Eminent Supreme Chronicler. David A. Poe, Idaho '70 (Alpha) will face Dennis Neider, Drexel '71 (Penn Epsilon) for a seat on the Board of Trustees of the National Endowment Fund. Cities vying to host the 1989 Convention are Cincinnati and Washington, D.C. (The 1987 Convention is to be held in Portland, Oregon.) Full details for the exciting Atlanta Convention will be published in the March 1985 issue of The Phi Alpha.

LEADERSHIP 50 – The first Leadership School was held in 1935. In August we will celebrate 50 years in the Leadership Training field. The ΣΑΕ Leadership School was the first such program to be held by a National Fraternity or Sorority. It is the granddaddy of them all, and just about all Greek National organizations are in the Leadership Development business today. The 50th Leadership School will be held August 4-7, 1985 at The Levere Memorial Temple in Evanston, Illinois. A detailed packet of information and registration forms will be sent to all chapters in February.

NEW CHAPTER AT LaVERNE – Eminent Supreme Archon John Warren installed the California Upsilon Chapter at The University of LaVerne (near Los Angeles) on January 19. The full story will appear in the next issue of The Record.

LOUISIANA CHAPTER CLOSED – After a valiant four year effort the Alumni Commission at Louisiana State University (Epsilon) decided to disband the active chapter. Hazing, destruction of property, and a host of disciplinary problems plagued the chapter for several years.

The Alumni Commission recognizes the importance of re-organizing the chapter soon, pending a favorable environment on campus this spring. The Louisiana Epsilon Chapter, originally chartered in 1867, had over 100 members at the time of the closing in December 1984.

TEXAS CHAPTER SUSPENDED – The Texas Rho Chapter (1884) at the University of Texas was suspended by the Supreme Council on December 3, 1984 for hazing. The Alumni are currently putting together a plan to take control of the Charter and continue to operate until the problem is solved. If the plan is accepted by the Supreme Council the chapter will be allowed to continue to operate under the authority of an alumni commission. The Charter will be returned to the undergraduates and the alumni commission dissolved once it can be demonstrated and verified that the hazing has ceased.

ΣΑΕ IMPOSTER APPREHENDED – Once again, long time ΣΑΕ imposter Fred Postlewaite has been incarcerated. This time he was caught by the brothers of Kentucky Beta at Western Kentucky University in Bowling Green. He had made visits to chapters in Ohio, Indiana, California and Utah since his release from a Utah prison last summer. He faces prosecution for forgery and related crimes in Kentucky and faces extradition to Utah for parole violations. Since 1969, Fred had taken checkbooks, cash, credit cards, jewelry and ΣΑΕ materials from chapters across the country. Fortunately, he has spent most of the intervening years behind bars. Look for Fred again in 3 to 5.


