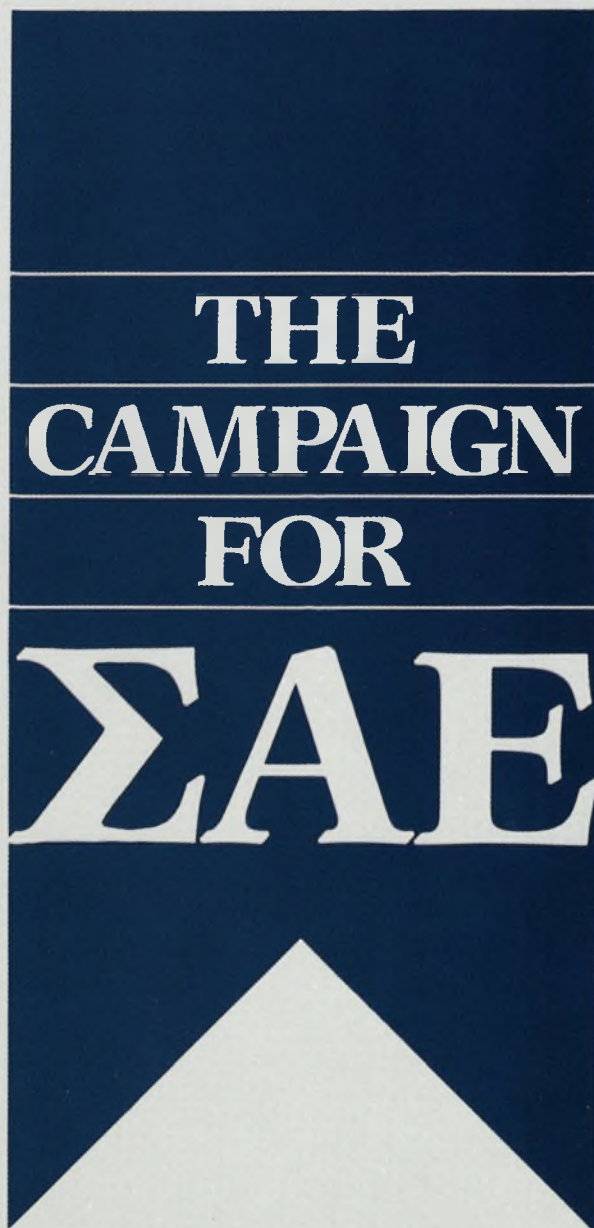

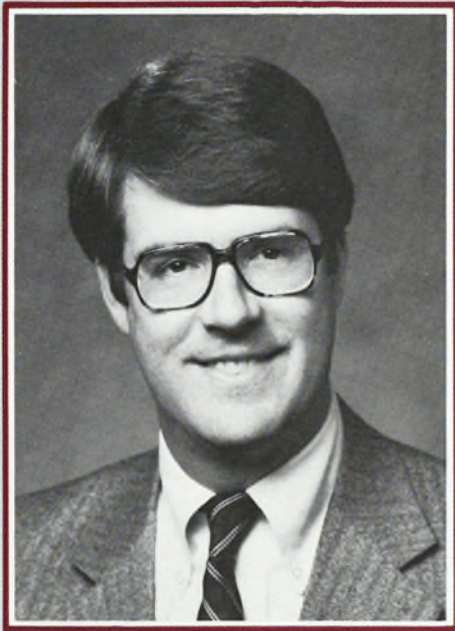

Message from the ESA

The temple, with all its artistic grandeur, is a testament to the standards of excellence held by Judge Nippert and those SAEs who believed in his vision.

The third accomplishment has its roots in the temple itself ... The SAE Leadership School. The establishment of this institution by Brother Moseley, and its perpetual enhancement, is a shining example of Sigma Alpha Epsilon's **tradition of leadership.**

These leaders, who represent a tremendous heritage for all of us, all had the ability to recognize opportunity for increased excellence, made a commitment, acted on that commitment and realized an overwhelming success. That success is based on the belief that **SAE stands for something that is worth preserving.**

In 1985, the Supreme Council of Sigma Alpha Epsilon identified six priorities for this biennium. They are:

- 1.) Strong, healthy chapters and the enhancement of the undergraduate experience
- 2.) Strengthening of our National Fraternity office programs and services
- 3.) Identifying and recognizing alumni and volunteer leadership
- 4.) Promotion of our ideals, traditions, songs and history
- 5.) Prevention of alcohol abuse and any form of hazing
- 6.) Devotion to the next generation of young men who may become SAEs

Overall, we intend to concentrate less on what Sigma Alpha Epsilon is not, and to celebrate more of what we are. We believe that our chapters must always be represented by the finest young men America has to offer. To accomplish that, we must challenge ourselves to seek greater heights and perpetuate SAE's strength of developing young men to lead productive lives across our nation.

In this Annual Report issue of *The Record*, we introduce the most ambitious undertaking ever in the history of our fraternity: **The Campaign for SAE.** This is the most broad-based project we have ever endeavored to accomplish. This capital campaign will succeed with the help of more than just a few brothers ... we all will have the opportunity to participate.

Why is this such an ambitious project?

When our fraternity began, there were just eight undergraduate members. Today we have nearly 14,000 each year. We are currently looking forward to the initiation of our 200,000th member, sometime early in 1986.

We did not begin to function effectively as a national fraternity until we had a national headquarters: The Levere Memorial Temple. Once our "schoolhouse" was built, it was several years before we had the Leadership School. Today, we have nearly 20,000 Leadership School graduates, as well as uncounted thousands of fraternity brothers who have benefitted from the consolidation of services and programs provided by the National Fraternity office.

Today, we are touching more lives than ever before, more than any other fraternity. The Campaign for SAE gives all those who have been touched an opportunity to give something in return, to perpetuate for SAEs who follow the good experience we have had.

The next step is ours. To make a commitment, a personal one, to ensure the future success of our fraternity. Consider the heritage of commitment we have from our predecessors, and the outcome of your own involvement with SAE.

The responsibility, and the opportunity, is now on our shoulders. We must move ahead and make a commitment not to the Campaign for SAE, to the Leadership School or to the Levere Memorial Temple, but a commitment to each of the young men that are and will be SAEs. That commitment is to continue to live up to SAE standards and expectations.

Thank you, and Phi Alpha.

FROM THE EDITOR

1985 was a dramatic year for our related educational foundation, and you'll read all about it in this issue. The foundation trustees announced a \$7.5 million campaign to enlarge the foundation's endowment funds. And after 58 years, its name was changed from The Levere Memorial Foundation to the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation in order to clarify its identity. It was a controversial, wrenching decision.

In addition, its board of trustees was enlarged from six to eleven members. The board had consisted of the members

of the Supreme Council and the Eminent Supreme Recorder, and will simply be increased to include five additional brothers. We welcome to the trustees George Ilse, **Syracuse '49**, Neal Berte, **Cincinnati '62**, and Lindley Bothwell, **Southern California '22**. Two additional members have yet to be named.

Joseph A. Mancini, **Cincinnati '35**, has been named Chairman of the Board Emeritus by the foundation trustees, because of the leadership and inspiration he has provided for decades. Brother Joe,

honorary chairman of the **Campaign for SAE: The Path to Leadership**, kicked off the campaign by merging his private foundation with the SAE Foundation and by further pledging \$1.1 million to the campaign. In appreciation for the time, spirit, energy, and motivation he provides, we dedicate this issue of *The Record* to Joe.

THE CAMPAIGN FOR SAE-

SAE Takes the Lead in the Fraternity World...Again!

"Every organization likes to move forward — and this is our time."

THIS COMMENT WAS MADE A YEAR AGO BY THE FRATERNITY'S Eminent Supreme Recorder Kenneth D. Tracey. Brother Tracey was in New York, accompanied by a small group of Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation trustees, fraternity leaders and staff, gathered from around the country to launch the most ambitious program in SAE history: A \$7.5 million capital campaign in support of undergraduate programs and services.

"Never before in the history of Greek letter organizations has a campaign of this magnitude been attempted," commented Joseph A. Mancini, honorary chairman of the Campaign for SAE and Past Eminent Supreme Archon.

"When successful, the campaign will perpetuate the ideals of SAE well into the twenty-first century," he added.

To emphasize his belief in the need for the campaign, Brother Mancini announced to those present that he was prepared to make a \$1.1 million commitment toward the total goal.

ALMOST TWO YEARS HAD PASSED SINCE THE IDEA WAS first authorized by the foundation's Board of Trustees in 1983. Plans were made and needs were carefully assessed and projected. Results of a nationwide independent feasibility study commissioned in 1984 strongly supported the board's plans. Priority was given to enlisting the key to any successful capital campaign: **Leadership.**

Foundation Trustee David M. Lance, a successful businessman known for his loyalty and integrity, was the unanimous choice for campaign chairman. Lance asked Brother Mancini to serve as honorary chairman. Ten other alumni with impressive service to the fraternity agreed to join the Campaign Steering Committee charged with the task of raising the money.

The case for the campaign is built around a simple financial fact: *The foundation's endowment is not keeping up with growth in average chapter size and increasing requests for service.* The goal of the campaign is to maintain current core programming — doing what SAE has traditionally done best — in addition to imaginative provisions of new impact and scope to benefit the next generation of SAE undergraduates.

The recent 50th Anniversary of the SAE Leadership School gave the campaign added impetus. The Leadership School is the most important and successful program in the history of the fraternity. It was the first of its kind and is now emulated by most national college fraternities. With nearly 20,000 graduates, the school attests to SAE's success in enhancing the undergraduate education of its members.

The Campaign for SAE is as bold and insightful as the vision and founding of the first Leadership School. Designed to strengthen resources crucial to Sigma Alpha Epsilon's future, the campaign presents the challenge of raising \$6 million in new capital while maintaining \$1.5 million in annual giving over the course of the three-year campaign. The Board of Trustees has never considered the alternative of program retrenchment and cutbacks.

At a special program to celebrate the golden anniversary of The Leadership School, The Campaign for SAE was announced to brothers from around the country.

"Brothers, now is *our* time to survey the environment and identify opportunities," announced Chairman Dave Lance. "Our generation must transform those opportunities into challenges, and ultimately, tangible benefits, for future generations."

This campaign is the most ambitious project the fraternity has ever undertaken. Its needs are well conceived, and its success will create permanent endowment and support for the time-tested core programs which contribute immediately and directly to the success of each undergraduate SAE chapter and its individual members.

"Federal cutbacks in education and the need for sound leadership in America — today and tomorrow — place SAE in a unique position," Lance commented later. "We can assist young men in their pursuit of a quality education and provide the opportunities to develop leadership skills which can benefit them their entire lives."

The Campaign for SAE is the boldest, most insightful and ambitious project the fraternity has ever undertaken. It reflects a determination to see to it that SAE brothers of the future will have no reason to envy the past. Every brother will be asked to participate . . .

Brother Lance also announced at the Golden Celebration of the Leadership School that the entire Board of Trustees of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation had pledged participation in the campaign, and that more than \$3 million had already been pledged by Alumni.

Every member of Sigma Alpha Epsilon will be asked to participate, guaranteeing a vibrant future full of new academic, leadership and fellowship possibilities for the young men of SAE. The campaign reflects both satisfaction in the present standing of the fraternity and a determination to see to it that brothers of the future will have no reason to envy the past.

Brother Joe Mancini Makes Largest Commitment Ever to a Fraternity Campaign

Past Eminent Supreme Archon Joseph A. Mancini has pledged \$1.1 million to The Campaign for SAE. This is the largest gift ever pledged by one individual to any fraternity educational foundation.

Joe Mancini is a man who naturally gives — not just of his financial resources, but of his time and his myriad of talents. At 75 years old, he is a counselor to undergraduates and alumni of all ages who seek his wisdom, his wit and his friendship. Although he prefers to discuss what SAE has done and meant to him, his record bespeaks a tradition of devotion and service to the fraternity which spans more than 50 years.

His roots in SAE are humble ones which began with pledging the Ohio Epsilon chapter at the University of Cincinnati in the fall of 1932. He was initiated and later moved into the Ohio Epsilon chapter house, enjoying his new association with the fraternity.

Then the Great Depression forced him to move to more modest quarters. He took two jobs, one in a cafeteria and the other shoveling coal for two apartment houses close to the SAE house.

During that difficult time, many brothers had to leave the fraternity because they could not pay dues. But the leaders at Ohio Epsilon allowed Joe to go “inactive.” They encouraged him to come by the house, but did not permit him a vote in chapter affairs.

“They gave me moral support,” he said recently, “and I will never forget it.”

One of Brother Mancini's favorite stories is of his lifelong friendship with Hank Neloms, who was the houseman for Ohio Epsilon for many years. In the early 1930s, Neloms knew times were tough for the young Mancini, so after evening meals he would hide leftovers in the laundry room which Joe would find after dark. Joe has never forgotten Hank's kindness and believes that giving and sharing with one another is what makes SAE, and life, rewarding.

Neloms was initiated into SAE many years after Joe left the university. Brother Neloms' association with Ohio Epsilon ended when he was tragically killed in an automobile accident.

After graduating from the University of Cincinnati, Brother Mancini moved to the San Francisco Bay area and became involved in the burgeoning real estate market. In the late 1940s, he founded the Brookman Company, named after his son Brooks T. Mancini. The firm is engaged in construction ranging from office buildings and townhouse condominiums to office warehouses and automotive facilities. Later, the B. T. Mancini Company was created and both companies were later organized under the umbrella of Mancini Enterprises, Inc.

The corporation gives Joe the leeway to make creative financing arrangements for the facility needs of firms of all sizes. Building to suit, Mancini Enterprises, Inc. establishes a client's needs, buys land, builds the facility, leases it back to the client and markets the property for sale to the investment community. This system, and other speculative successes, have earned Brother Mancini a reputation for business creativity and savvy.

Active in Boys Club and Rotary Club, Joe is always open to new ideas and willing to share his time, talent and resources.

In 1960 Brother Mancini established the SAE Leadership Foundation and has been its chief benefactor. This foundation, which is now part of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation, was initially founded because Joe wanted to support college students while they were getting an education. This led to the development of the Summer Intern Program. Later, the foundation grew to give financial support to the Alcohol Abuse Prevention Program, the Community Service Award and Leadership School tuition scholarships.

Brother Mancini has served on the Supreme Council, and was the fraternity's Eminent Supreme Archon from 1973 to 1975. He was recently named Chairman of the Board Emeritus of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation Board of Trustees. He has also served as president of the Board of Trustees of the National Endowment Fund of the fraternity, which oversees the investments of the fraternity's assets, and makes loans to local house corporations.

Joe Mancini was named the honorary chairman of The Campaign for SAE as a tribute to his dedication and loyalty.

Perhaps the best description of Joe was given by Louis Nippert, **Cincinnati '28 (Ohio Epsilon)**, at a recent Founders Day. Brother Nippert said, “Joe is a true brother, gentleman and friend.”

The Path to Leadership

The \$7.5 million Campaign for SAE seeks funds for endowments to broaden the focus and impact of the Leadership School and other leadership training and development programs, to meet the demand for educational programming and financial aid, and to ensure the future of the Levere Memorial Temple as a memorial, museum, National Fraternity headquarters and schoolhouse.

The funding priorities of the campaign listed below lend themselves to the campaign's objective of serving every chapter and every undergraduate member. Elsewhere in this issue, you will read about the programs of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation, audiovisual services, computer capabilities within chapters, the Educational and Leadership Consultants program, upkeep of the Levere Memorial Temple, the SAE Leadership School and the training of volunteer leadership. All of these programs and services need to expand in scope and availability to effectively reach the fraternity's undergraduate membership.

In addition, the campaign will endeavor to establish an endowment to sponsor an annual conference (The **SAE Fellowship Program**) for 50 outstanding SAE undergraduates from around the country. The three-day conference would bring together alumni leaders from every sector and from diverse geographic areas, to discuss important National issues with the undergraduates.

THE ANNUAL REPORT: 1985

1985 finds Sigma Alpha Epsilon enjoying good times and thriving in a very successful environment. Fraternities are once again popular on campus. Chapters are large again and providing a quality experience for their members. However, we are in a period of declining college enrollments, especially of those students in the traditional 18-21 age group. We will likely face many challenges through the year 2000, when enrollments will begin to increase again. More on this later.

The leadership of this fraternity believes in our high ideals and is dedicated to helping each chapter provide for the long term needs of their members. As institutions continue to simply train students for specific jobs, the fraternity's traditional role in higher education will

become even more evident. Our challenge is to equip our members for life-long responsibilities. We must develop the total man by surrounding him with friends who help him learn compassion, cooperation, loyalty, and dedication to goals and ideals.

The successful chapter will bring about the cultivation of all that is noble in man's nature and character, and then ΣAEs will go out into society as effective leaders and citizens in their businesses, professions, and communities.

The Campaign for SAE: The Path to Leadership

In order for the fraternity to assist chapters in meeting these and other future challenges, the trustees of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation have announced a \$6 million campaign to

dramatically increase the endowment of the foundation, and enhance our ability to develop leadership for our country.

The response has been overwhelming. So far approximately \$4 million has been pledged by a handful of generous and supportive alumni brothers. We are deeply touched by the faith our key alumni have in the ability of ΣAE to contribute to the leadership development of our undergraduate members. We are confident that we will far exceed our goal. Most alumni are only hearing about the campaign effort for the first time and several have made pledges without even being asked to do so. We are grateful.

Detailed information of the campaign is contained elsewhere in this annual report. Suffice it to say that all alumni will have the opportunity to help with this exciting challenge.

The Supreme Council: The Fraternity's Eminent Leaders, Devotees

The Supreme Council, elected each biennium at the National Convention of the fraternity, constitutes the "board of directors" of the fraternity. These gentlemen are recognized as the leaders of the fraternity, but few brothers realize the amount of time and effort they *volunteer* in order to serve the National Fraternity in this capacity.

Supreme Council members have full-time careers in addition to the work they perform in the name of Sigma Alpha Epsilon. They must attend council meetings and Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation Board of Trustees meetings, requiring travel to many areas of the country. Each council member has designated responsibilities according to the fraternity's National Laws. The council members attend and speak at special events for chapters and provinces, and they attend Leadership School and various functions; *all on their own time*. They receive no compensation for this work, their rewards are of an inspirational nature.

Milestones reached

1985 was a year of special significance for Sigma Alpha Epsilon. We celebrated the 50th anniversary of the Leadership School, and we embarked on an aggressive campaign to bolster our endowment funds, principally to enhance our Leadership Development activities.

Several other milestones were reached in 1985. We now have 192 active chapters, the highest number in our history. With our nine colonies, we are now working with 201 campus groups. Of the nine colonies, four are at sites of former chapters: **Beloit College, Texas Christian University, Syracuse University and Weber State College.** To be a dynamic organization, we must continue to grow. Several new institutions have been targeted for colonization in 1986. Details of our extension activities will be covered later on in this report. We note, with pride, the fine work of Grant Gier, director of Extension.

To continue to be a quality fraternity, we must continue to improve those chapters that fail to live up to the high standards of Σ AE. Several existing chapters have been targeted for reorganization and others have been put on probation or alumni commission. Strong action is needed if Σ AE is to live up to its own expectations as the fraternity that stands for **Standards Above Excellence.**

Although several chapters were placed on alumni commission last year, only two chapters were suspended. Texas Rho at the University of Texas was suspended in December of 1984 for a serious hazing incident. The charter was reinstated in March of 1985 and put into the hands of an alumni commission, which is working with the chapter. Their goal is to make Texas Rho one of the strongest and best chapters within the realm. We are confident that they will succeed.

Louisiana Epsilon at Louisiana State University was suspended in October of 1984 for a series of serious disciplinary infractions. The membership was disbanded and the house closed. A new chapter was organized last spring and the house was re-opened in the fall.

Stan Strom and his staff of Educational & Leadership Consultants have

done outstanding work in the area of chapter development. All 192 chapters received visits last year by our consulting staff. In addition to their direct work with chapters, they revised the Minimum Standards Guidelines and helped to develop position statements on issues facing chapters today such as hazing, alcohol abuse, treatment of legacies, sexual abuse and others.

4,185 new brothers were initiated in fiscal 1985, the highest number in 18 years. The average chapter size reached 74 members, the highest number since the post World War Two era, when returning veterans boosted our numbers dramatically. **This is also the highest number for any fraternity.** As of December 1, 1985, 198,706 brothers had been initiated into the fraternity. We should reach the landmark number 200,000 by February, by far the largest number to be initiated by any fraternity, and over 20,000 more than our closest rival.

Chapter Quality at an all-time high

I can also report that the quality of our chapters is the best it has been in many years. Our undergraduates today are among the most generous and cooperative ever. There are exceptions to be noted as there have always been, but by and large, most chapters today are made up of men of excellent character and deportment. We are extremely proud of our chapters and confident of their ability to continue this trend in years to come. And we are working hard with the chapters that need help and direction. Our staff and hundreds of volunteers across the country are dedicated to making the Σ AE experience a wholesome and healthy one for all of our brothers.

We are particularly proud of the work of the Province Archons in the area of chapter development. Most provinces held outstanding leadership schools in 1985 and reached thousands of Σ AE undergraduates with a leadership training experience.

What's in store for chapters?

Although we initiated 4,185 men last year, the highest in 18 years, over 4,200 men were initiated in 1967 when the

fraternity had 30 less chapters. It must be noted, however, that this number was greatly inflated by the baby boomers. Almost 1,000 more men had been initiated than just two years earlier in 1965. By 1971, the number had returned to slightly less than in the pre-boom years. Now we face declining enrollments in the traditional 18-21 year old student population, predicted to bottom out in 1992. What will this mean to Σ AE?

If fraternities remain popular on college campuses, the enrollment decline will probably have very little effect on Σ AE as a whole. Our chapters will continue to pledge quality students, even in a shrinking market. They will simply take a larger share of the market.

Some chapters may indeed be affected, especially if their host institution suffers or fails to survive. Most major institutions, both public and private, will continue to take all the students they want or need. Sunbelt and West Coast institutions will continue to grow and thrive. The weak private and lower level state schools in the East and Midwest will be affected, some probably quite dramatically. A look at the Σ AE map will show that the fraternity will continue to do well on most campuses where we are represented.

Just as the National Fraternity is building up its endowments, **chapters should be setting aside reserves today during the good times.** Plans should be formulated on how to deal with declining enrollments, especially if the popularity of fraternities wane. Although we are optimistic about the future, it never hurts to look ahead and be ready for any eventuality.

The Typical Undergraduate SAE

A profile of a typical Σ AE undergraduate reveals that he belongs to a strong fraternity chapter of 74 members. He was one of twenty-four pledges, twenty of whom were initiated. His chapter has 800 initiates in its 70-year history and owns its own house which was built 45 years ago, and is worth \$700,000 today. He attends a large public state institution with a powerhouse football program in the farm belt. He will go into business, most likely agricultural

ture-related. His family lives in a suburban area or mid-sized town. He is politically moderate, a registered Republican, and he voted for Reagan. He doesn't smoke cigarettes. He is independent, spirited and enjoys people and a good time. He is popular, confident, responsible and optimistic.

The Year of the Alumnus

1985 was *The Year of the Alumnus*, dedicated to all alumni who have supported ΣAE for the past 129 years. Alumni activity was very high this year. \$497,000 was contributed by alumni to annual giving; our highest total ever and the largest amount ever contributed to any fraternity annual fund.

Over 100 alumni associations reported successful activities in 1985. A national staff position, director of Alumni Services/Chapter Housing, was filled. 24 Chapter Advisors participated in the 50th Anniversary Leadership School Advisors Program. A record number of Alumni Associations sent delegates to the 129th Anniversary National Convention in Atlanta, Georgia, in June.

Our annual report this year is dedicated to our alumni volunteers. We are proud to report on their activities on the pages that follow. These efforts have made ΣAE the best fraternity in America today.

We are grateful for the leadership provided by Peter Cullen, **Indiana '60** (*Gamma*), and Tom Goodale, **Iowa State '62** (*Gamma*), on the ad hoc Committee on Alcohol Education for the past 8 years. This committee has made a significant contribution to the entire fraternity and college world in the area of Alcohol Abuse Prevention Programming. This year the scope of the committee was broadened to include other health problems and we are excited by the goals set by the new ad hoc committee on Men's Health Issues to be chaired by Rev. Robert Hedges, **Drake '51** (*Iowa Delta*).

The National Office

In addition to the Eminent Supreme Recorder, who serves as the chief executive officer of both the fraternity and the foundation, the National Fraternity office is staffed by a very dedicated and loyal group of individuals. The National Fraternity employs 16 other full time employees. In addition, a number of part

time students are employed to help carry out the tasks of the national headquarters operation.

Fraternity functions include: Finance and Administration, Chapter Development and Extension, Alumni Services, and Communications and Public Relations.

Jeff Arnold, **Milliken '76** (*Illinois Delta*), is in charge of the internal functioning of the National Fraternity office and is ably assisted by Membership Administrator Sari Hollander, Administrative Assistant Roberta Nelson, Controller Ida Horn, Accounts Receivables Administrator Evelyn Stuckle, Properties Manager Jeff Briggs, Housekeeper Rose Kenna and part-time Receptionists Karen Corrado and Renee Alston.

Stan Strom, **Arizona State '82** (*Beta*), serves as director of Chapter Development and is assisted by Extension Director Grant Gier, **Nebraska '84** (*Lambda-Pi*), and Educational and Leadership Consultants Steven Brister, **Duke '85** (*North Carolina Nu*), Scott Haggard, **Texas Tech '84** (*Alpha*), Wade Quinn, **Texas Tech '84** (*Alpha*), Stephen O. Plunkett, **Minnesota '85** (*Alpha*), and David C. Schott, **Carnegie-Mellon '85** (*Pennsylvania Phi*). Consultants who served until June of 1985 are Michael Fahrbach, **Bowling Green '83** (*Ohio Kappa*), F. The ΣAE Leadership School: The Best

"The Fiftieth Anniversary Leadership School was extra-special because it was the culmination of a half-century of what we hold most important: Leadership Development," said Ray Artigue, **Arizona State '76 (Beta)**, who served as director of Leadership Training for the National Fraternity from 1980 until the end of the 50th Anniversary Leadership School last summer.

In 1985, the school had the largest attendance ever of 567 delegates, with a record 167 chapters and 10 colonies represented. In addition, 16 chapters which were not represented at the school in 1984 sent delegates to the 50th Anniversary Leadership School.

The 51st Leadership School, which will be held August 3 through 6, 1986, promises to be an opportunity for brothers to develop leadership skills in an atmosphere teaming with brotherhood, fellowship, fraternity traditions, heritage, and fun.

"We are striving for 100 per cent chapter attendance, and we would like each chapter to send their best members. This way, each chapter will receive the most benefit from their delegates' leadership training," said Darrell Gibson, **Ball State '72 (Indiana Zeta)**, who became the fraternity's sixth director of Leadership Training in August.

The 51st Leadership School will provide increased opportunities for interaction between delegates and the alumni leaders of the fraternity. This year's school will also expand the focus on alcohol abuse prevention and chapter computer applications, and will feature an ΣAE talent show.

The Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation staff liaison to the Leadership School Planning Committee is Tom Hume, director of Foundation Programs.

The Levere Memorial Temple: Maintaining Our Schoolhouse

Judge Alfred Kuno Nippert, who spearheaded the drive to build the temple and oversaw every detail of its construction, had an impressive vision. Upon the temple's completion, Judge Nippert said, "The Levere Memorial Temple was built with beauty as its ultimate end, is larger than its physical dimensions and is more alive than the inanimate materials of its construction."

"The members of the Temple Building Committee are well aware of these attributes, and when confronted with upkeep and restoration, find particular truth in the description of the building being larger than its physical dimensions," said Charles Trangsrud, **North Dakota State '59 (Beta)**, chairman of the committee.

In 1985, the Temple Building Committee authorized several maintenance

and repair projects made necessary due to deterioration of the 55-year-old structure. A section of the tower was torn down and reconstructed to correct a masonry defect. Areas of the museum and chapel have suffered water damage, which required extensive tuckpointing and gutter and interior repair.

In August, the plaster ceiling on the second floor of the large office wing collapsed. Fortunately, it happened during a weekend and no employees or visitors were present. The ceiling and adjacent walls had to be replaced.

The anticipated Heritage Fund of the Campaign for ΣAE will provide a permanent endowment to generate the necessary resources to maintain and enhance the Levere Memorial Temple and its possessions. Restoration of water damaged and deteriorating artwork and re-wiring of the electrical system will also be completed when the funds become available.

The Ritual: Enhanced Usage of Sacred Vows

The primary responsibility of the Ritual Committee is to promote and assist with uniform, proper usage of the Ritual. Committee Chairman Q. Todd Dickinson, **Allegheny College '74** (*Pennsylvania Omega*), and the committee have initiated new programs this year designed to assist brothers with uniform standards of Ritual.

"We are organizing a network of ritual counselors to assist chapters with their initiations and Ritual usage," Brother Dickinson explained.

"The committee is also drafting a Ritual Manual similar to manuals for chapter officers.

"We are currently in the process of drafting a new ceremony for colonies," Dickinson added. "The new ceremony will be for use in both the installation of new chapters and their first initiation."

One of the highlights of the committee's work this year was the model initiation ceremony conducted by an "all-star" team during the 50th Anniversary Leadership School. The initiation team featured committee members, fraternity leaders, and for the non-speaking parts, undergraduate delegates to the Leadership School.

Members of the committee were present for installation ceremonies this year at the new California Upsilon and Nevada Beta chapters, at the **University of La Verne** and the **University of Nevada at Las Vegas**.

The Ritual Committee meets each year during Leadership School in the Tower Room of The Levere Memorial Temple. The National Fraternity staff liaison to this committee in 1985 was Wade Quinn, Educational and Leadership Consultant.

Chapter Housing: The Search for Liability Insurance

Insuring fraternity chapters for liability has become one of the most threatening issues the fraternity world faces today. In our litigious society, there are not many, if any, insurance carriers willing to cover fraternities for liability. Sigma Alpha Epsilon is one of numerous national fraternities currently searching for a market for both liability and property coverages.

Dave Covert, **West Florida '73** (*Sigma*), chairman of the Permanent Committee on Chapter Housing, explains that the liability insurance question was the major concern of the committee in 1985. He said, "We have been implementing an insurance program, which thus far includes a \$1 million liability policy, but that is just the beginning. The million dollars could be wiped out if the National Fraternity lost just one or two lawsuits.

As an example of the difficulties the fraternity has encountered with this insurance search, the National Office received these comments from Lloyd's of London in response to a request for underwriting:

"Everyone on this side seems to have some idea of what fraternity/sorority houses are from U.S. films, but unfortunately, this does not always carry over in a good light because in some cases these seem to show student pranks and damage and destruction . . . underwriters asked if you can clearly define what fraternity/sorority houses are and exactly how they operate so that everyone is on the same wavelength."

Lloyd's also asked for loss experience for all chapters from the past five years, values of properties, status of fire and security systems in chapter houses and other information that is only partially available. Covert explained that although the National Fraternity staff has attempted to gather these data over the last year, it is difficult to obtain current and correct information from our 192 chapters.

The Permanent Committee on Chapter Housing is also preparing a manual on house corporation operations. Covert reports that these manuals

will go to each chapter house corporation this winter.

"Other committee business includes working with the Board of Trustees of the fraternity's National Endowment Fund to revamp the loan application house corporations use to procure funds for house maintenance, renovations and new house construction," Brother Covert said.

"We also plan to set up an ad hoc committee to look for alternative methods of financing new house construction and renovation," he said.

NEF Board of Trustees: Lending Money for Chapter House Renovations

The Board of Trustees of the National Endowment Fund of ΣAE Inc. is the group of five alumni brothers who handle the investments of the NEF and who approve applications from ΣAE chapters

for first and second mortgages. The purpose of the National Endowment Fund is to generate income specifically for chapter housing.

In 1985, the Board elected Gordon-Silvie, **Syracuse '50** (*New York Delta*), to serve as its president. Each trustee is elected by the National Convention of the Fraternity and serves a 10-year term. Other trustees on the board are Past ESA Richard Generelly, **George Washington '47** (*Washington City Rho*), Past ESA Russell P. Heuer, Jr., **Pennsylvania '55** (*Theta*), Past ESR Jack Hotaling, **Syracuse '53** (*New York Delta*), and David Poe, **Idaho '70** (*Alpha*).

Since June of 1984, the NEF Board of Trustees has granted mortgage loans totalling \$145,000 to four ΣAE chapters.

"The trustees are all volunteers," Brother Silvie said. "We usually meet two to three times a year. Since we have people coming from around the country, we try to wait to hold meetings until we have received applications for mortgages."

"We're starting to work more closely with the Permanent Committee on Chapter Housing now. Dave Covert, the chairman of that committee, will be coming to our meetings," he added.

Alumni Services: A Big Year for Alumni

"This committee is dedicated to the greater involvement of our alumni," wrote Gary L. Garnand, **Idaho '70** (*Alpha*), chairman of the Permanent Committee on Alumni Services, in a letter to Eminent Supreme Archon Clarke Houston last year.

"The fraternity's increased emphasis on alumni in 1985, ('The Year of the Alumnus') was evident," Garnand recently said. "One of the visible accomplishments in increased alumni involvement was the registration of a record 63 alumni association delegates — 23 more than expected — at the National Convention in Atlanta last June."

In addition to increased efforts to communicate directly with chapter and local alumni associations, the Permanent Committee on Alumni Services has tapped the position of Province Alumni Secretary as the key to an effective alumni association network.

Committee members have contacted every Province Alumni Secretary in the country, giving each a formal "job de-

scription" for the office, and asking them to gather information on every alumni association in their province.

The Permanent Committee on Alumni Services is also working to establish relationships with chapter house corporations which might be interested in forming alumni associations; and to assist (through local alumni associations) with the National Fraternity's extension efforts in areas where there is potential for ΣAE chapters.

Extension: Growth Where There is Strength

Highlighting a successful year of extension efforts in 1985 were chapter installations at the **University of La Verne** in La Verne, California, and the **University of Nevada at Las Vegas**. Cal Upsilon received its charter in January; Nevada Beta received its charter in October (see story in this issue).

There are currently ΣAE colonies at nine campuses across the country, and ΣAE was recently selected to start a new colony at the **University of California at Irvine**. The ΣAE colonies are located at **Beloit College** in Beloit, Wisconsin, **Santa Clara University** (California), the **University of California at San Diego**, the **University of Maryland, Baltimore County**, the **State University of New York at Binghamton**, **Syracuse University** (Syracuse, New York), **Weber State College** (Ogden, Utah), **Winthrop College** (Rock Hill,

South Carolina), and **Texas Christian University** (Fort Worth, Texas).

Chairman of the Extension Advisory Committee George Ilse, **Syracuse '49** (*New York Delta*), said, "Our philosophy has been to try to get into campuses with stronger, tougher entrance requirements. An example of the success in this type of environment is the colony at **SUNY-Binghamton**. This is an extremely strong, competitive school and the academic level is outstanding. Many of the students there could have gone to Ivy League schools. The ΣAE colony there is very active and a good group of men."

The committee also has given strong consideration to urban campuses, such as the **University of Maryland, Baltimore County**.

"**Nevada-Las Vegas** is an urban campus. The school is young, it's growing its own traditions and the new ΣAE chapter is building its own strong traditions now, too. The two positively feed on each other," Brother Ilse commented.

"National Fraternity consultation to the new group at **Texas Christian University** has been made the responsibility of the Extension Advisory Committee. We are doing all we can there to see that a proper chapter is established, with proper alumni involvement. This is a far more demanding and sensitive job than working with most colonies, but we are progressing with it," he said.

The National Fraternity staff liaison to the Extension Advisory Committee is Grant Gier, extension director.

The Advisory Council: Foundation Investments Reviewed

The Advisory Council meets quarterly to review the investment portfolios of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation. Each member of the five-man Advisory Council serves on a voluntary basis for 10 years.

"Several years ago the Advisory Council recognized the desirability of having all investments under continuous professional supervision," said Robert Christensen, **Vanderbilt '55** (*Tennessee*

Nu), chairman of the Council.

"Accordingly," he added, "it decided to shift all individual security holdings into no-load mutual funds. This shifting process has been substantially completed. Our work now consists largely of monitoring the investment performance of the mutual funds currently held, reviewing the investment objectives of the foundation, and considering new mutual funds for possible future investment."

"Last year, we reviewed the purchase of the Chi Omega Rho house next door to the Levere Memorial Temple in Evanston, and helped to raise the necessary funds to complete the transaction," Brother Christensen said.

"The Advisory Council is looking forward to the challenge of investing the fruits of The Campaign for ΣAE," he added.

Men's Health Issues: Many Needs to be Met

The Committee on Men's Health Issues was formed in 1985 to assume the responsibilities of the previous Alcohol Education Committee and to address other critical men's health issues. This committee and its programs are sponsored by the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation.

Father Robert B. Hedges, **Drake '51** (Iowa Delta), chairman of the Committee on Men's Health Issues, has identified several issues to be addressed by the committee. Among them are alcohol abuse, drug abuse and drug dealing (especially cocaine), smoking and dipping, mental health (depression, suicide), AIDS and sexually transmitted diseases, homosexuality, pregnancy, hazing, athletic injuries and nutrition.

"We will be reviewing health issues as they affect the fraternity's existence.

That includes the individual members as well as the 'community' as a whole," Father Bob explained.

"A chapter's reputation and contribution to the academic community are counterproductive if these issues aren't faced squarely within the chapter. We want every undergraduate brother to weigh how we live our lives according to the ideals of ΣAE," Brother Hedges said.

The Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation currently offers audiovisual presentations to chapters on "Young Men's Reproductive Health," "Young Men's Sexual Responsibility," and "Hazing on Trial" by Dave Westol.

One goal of the committee is to develop a videotape library of health topics. This would allow chapters to borrow or buy videotapes for pledge education, chapter retreats, Province Leadership Schools, Interfraternity Council events or other campus seminars.

"Financial support given to the Foundation via The Campaign for ΣAE will make more health-related programs available to our chapters and to others who are interested," Father Bob said.

The Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation staff liaison to the Committee on Men's Health Issues is Tom Hume, director of Foundation Programs.

He has worked with the undergraduate members of North Dakota Beta and Michigan Gamma, in addition to his work with the National Fraternity.

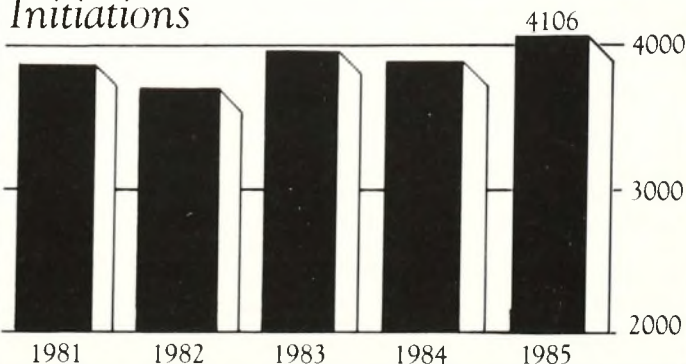

Managing Records and Data Processing is Frances Gillan. Dorothy Coleman serves as the administrative assistant for the Foundation. Secretary to the Executive Director is Elaine Schubert. REA Program: Brothers Develop Innovative Scholastic Programs

The Resident Educational Advisor Program was established by the foundation to give Σ AE chapters tutorial assistance and to heighten awareness of scholarship throughout the fraternity. The program gives an Σ AE graduate student or undergraduate the opportunity to serve as an academic resource to an Σ AE chapter. A Resident Educational Advisor (REA) develops a scholarship program for the chapter he serves and works as a tutor for a minimum of 15 hours per week. In return, the foundation awards him a \$2,000 fellowship and the chapter provides free room and board.

This school year, the foundation is sponsoring 17 Resident Educational Advisors. Heading the REA Program is Tom Goodale, **Iowa State '62 (Gamma)**, who assumed the National Fraternity's Educational Advisor voluntary position last fall. He succeeds Bob Hamrdla, **Stanford '60 (California Alpha)**, who handled the program for 15 years.

"We will continue the work that Bob did in his 15 productive years as the Educational Advisor. We will also strengthen the program. We want to attract the best possible people as REAs, and to make the program as accessible as possible to chapters that need it," Goodale said.

Goodale hopes to initiate the development of new scholarship publications and audiovisual materials designed to assist chapters and individual brothers in the future.

Spotlight: REA Chris Wilson Makes Academic Impact

"When I started as the REA at Tennessee Delta this summer, I set up several goals for the chapter," said Chris Wilson, **Tennessee Tech '86 (Delta)**, a fifth-year mechanical engineering student serving his chapter as Resident Educational Advisor.

"My highest priorities are to improve the pledge scholarship program, improve the chapter's faculty relations, develop incentives for brothers to excel academically, prepare the chapter's library and explore the feasibility of buying a computer for chapter and scholarship uses," Wilson explained.

To help the pledge scholarship program, Chris prepared a series of seminars for pledges. He said a seminar on "Power Learning" presented by a member of the university's counseling service staff was especially beneficial. In addition to 20 Σ AEs, representatives of other fraternities on campus attended the seminar.

Brother Wilson organized a chapter cocktail party for university faculty members in an effort to improve faculty relations. The event was publicized on campus and brothers personally asked faculty members.

"It was great," Chris said. "Forty faculty members attended it, and there was a lot of interaction between the faculty members and the brothers."

Incentives for better grades have been introduced to the pledges of Tennessee Delta as well as the actives. Brother Wilson said that the pledge with the best marks each quarter has his initiation fee paid by the chapter.

"The chapter foots the dues bill of the active brother with the best grades each year, which can be as high as \$700. The chapter also gives members who make the quarterly Dean's List a ten percent reduction in their dues for the following quarter," Chris explained.

"We are the only house on campus with a fraternity library," he said. "Our library is a quiet, well-ventilated attic room. It holds about 18 people."

Brother Wilson reports that he has set up seminars for the chapter on how to prepare for finals, writing resumes and career planning. He hopes the chapter will be able to lease or buy a computer that can be linked up to the university's system early in 1986. He is trying to start an honor society for male Greeks on the campus. He attends IFC meetings and works with the IFC Scholarship Committee at the invitation of the committee chairman.

Chris does all this in addition to serving on his chapter's executive council, tutoring his brothers and his own class work.

What are the results of Chris's efforts so far?

"We have the second highest overall grade point average of the fraternities on campus," Chris said. "Our chapter has a 2.8 average on a 4.0 scale. The university's men's average is 2.4. I think we're doing pretty well."

Walter B. Jones Award: 1985 Recipient Works Hard, Plays Hard

The Walter B. Jones Award for Scholastic Achievement is given each year to a junior or senior brother who not only excels in academics but also has a genuine concern for the academic welfare and success of his fraternity brothers. The award was created in memory of Judge Walter B. Jones, **Auburn '10** (*Alabama Alpha-Mu*), who served as ESA of the fraternity from 1932 to 1934.

In 1985, the \$750 award was presented to Tyler D. Gibb, **Washington State '86** (*Beta*), at the 129th Anniversary National Convention in Atlanta. Upon accepting the award, Gibb said, "I've always believed in work hard/play hard, and you gotta do both. I do believe in scholarship, but I believe in fraternity, too."

Tyler's application for the Walter B. Jones Award supports his "work hard/play hard" theory. In his application essay, "Scholastic Excellence as a Result of Personal Goals," Brother Gibb addresses the importance of gaining an education beyond "obtaining a career-oriented degree." He wrote,

"Through honors programs and extracurricular lectures which cover more liberal topics, I feel that I have worked toward getting more out of college than is required. A university campus is a great source of educational opportunities, both in the classroom and beyond. A motivated student can capture many of these opportunities in his collegiate experience, limited only by the time required for these commitments. It should be stressed to students by advisors, parents and others to receive a broad, liberal education while in college. This gives students a better education, not only for career preparation, but for knowledge and life in general. Any steps in this direction, I feel, can help in achieving scholastic excellence."

In his paper, Tyler discusses the balance of social and scholastic activities the fraternity environment can provide, which is crucial to a balance in life after college years.

"I wanted to be able to do things with the guys in the chapter and not miss an opportunity to be with them," Tyler explained. "But I wanted to do well in school, too. There are guys who go to the

library and those who don't — I want to be both."

And so he is "both." His pre-med advisor, Hans A. Went, Ph.D., wrote in a recommendation for Tyler, "The apparent ease with which he maintains his level of academic achievement . . . while participating extensively in extracurricular activities is truly impressive and is indicative of exceptional efficiency in the budgeting and use of his time for whatever purpose."

With intentions of pursuing a career in bio-mechanical medicine, Brother Gibb has maintained a 3.86 grade average as a premedical student majoring in mechanical engineering. In addition to his rigorous academic schedule, he has served his chapter as Eminent Archon, Eminent Deputy Archon, Eminent Recorder, pledge educator and IFC representative. He has served for three years on the university's Parents' Weekend Committee and was chairman last year. Tyler is also a member of the joint IFC-Panhellenic Social Planning and Review Committee and the Order of Omega, a Greek leadership honorary society.

"I never had any pressure to excel in school, but I always had the attitude of 'why not excel?'," Tyler explained.

"What makes me mad are guys who watch TV all afternoon and then say they can't go to a function. It's not fair to those guys who do go."

Brother Gibb believes that college "is the first time that most students' motivation for scholastic excellence comes from themselves . . . (not) parents, peers or teachers . . . it is entirely up to the student to do his best.

"I believe scholarship is a personal thing. I don't want it to be up to the chapter to make someone do well scholastically," he said.

"As Eminent Archon, I try to make it so that it's not me pulling the chapter

through, but everyone doing their fair share. Apathy frustrates me, but I have to respect their other time commitments, too," he added.

"I always take the time to help others with homework. It's kind of the philosophy of our chapter as a whole — that's why we're so close," Tyler explained.

Library Program: Library Support Helps Chapter Scholarship

The Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation House Library Development Program provides funds to help chapters purchase reference book libraries. The program was established to give chapter houses an area where the atmosphere is conducive to studying, thus making the chapter house the center of support and assistance to our individual members.

Chapters can receive up to \$800 from the foundation to purchase an approved list of reference books. The chapter supplies 20 percent of the cost of the library and the foundation pays the remaining 80 percent with the total book cost not exceeding \$1,000.

More than 135 chapters have benefited from the House Library Development Program over the last 30 years. Through this program, chapters with outdated reference books may update their libraries with new reference books.

Summer Internships: Foundation Grants Go To Research, Treating Sexually Abused Children and Investigating Fraud

It is no surprise to our career-oriented world of today that job interviews typically involve discussions about candidates' internships and work experience instead of their education and grade point average. Many college programs afford credit hours for job-related experience outside the classroom. However, many college internships do not provide income, and most part-time or summer jobs available to students are unrelated to their fields of study.

The Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation overcomes the catch-22 of student work opportunities. The foundation's Summer Intern Program provides financial support so that a student may pursue a personally designed educational experience without sacrificing income. The Summer Intern Program, publicized to

any college student, including ΣAEs, through college and university dean's offices nationwide, requires that a proposed internship benefits other people while also benefiting the student.

Last summer, the foundation sponsored internships for three college students. Julie Gilley of **Hampshire College** in Amherst, Massachusetts, worked with a mental health center in Chicopee, Massachusetts, providing treatment for children who had been sexually abused. Brian Schick, a South Carolina Delta ΣAE at the **University of South Carolina**, assisted the Securities and Exchange Commission with the investigation of a fraud case involving an oil and gas company. **Simpson College** ΣAE (Iowa Sigma) David Harrison researched arterial worm infestations in horses with the **Montana State University** Veterinary Research Lab in Bozeman, Montana. Each intern received \$2,400 for their summer work.

The Campaign for ΣAE will provide a permanent endowment to sponsor undergraduates and graduate students for summer internships in business, government, law, health, and education.

Special Scholarship Funds

The Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation currently provides more than \$600,000 each year for scholarships and student loans. With decreasing federal aid to education, the demand for scholarships and financial aid is increasing — particularly with the disqualification for middle-class parents.

There are many scholarships available to undergraduate ΣAEs, most of them limited to members of certain chapters or

provinces.

New scholarships may be established through the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation to be awarded to a chapter member, a brother within a certain province, or to any ΣAE student. These scholarships may be set up with the name of a brother, a housemother, a chapter, a province, and others.

Persons interested in establishing a scholarship fund to benefit ΣAEs in the future should contact David Arendt, director of Development for the foundation.

ΣAE and His Wife Seek Liver for Baby

Dear Editor:

We learned last summer that our son, Will, who was three months old at the time, has a liver problem called biliary artesia. Will has been hospitalized a total of 17 weeks in his eight months of life. He has had four major surgeries attempting to correct the problem. The result is that Will needs a new liver.

There are specialty hospitals in Dallas and Omaha that will be able to transplant a new liver into Will's body as soon as a suitable liver becomes available. Since Will weighs only 19 pounds, we need a liver from a baby weighing between 10 and 25 pounds, with type O-positive blood.

If any ΣAE knows of a potential liver donor that might have a liver for Will, they should contact the University of Nebraska Medical Center and their regional organ procurement bank, and indicate that they know of Will Bledsoe's need for a liver.

Our doctor tells us that the best thing we can do, not just for Will, but for all people who need organs, is to make the public aware of the need for organs for transplants. If anyone ever knows of a potential donor, they should contact the local or regional organ procurement bank.

We feel the most wonderful gift a family could give is to donate the organs of someone they love to a person in need. It could save someone else's life. Families who want to do this should be sure to tell their family doctor or personal physicians.

Judge Harry Phillips

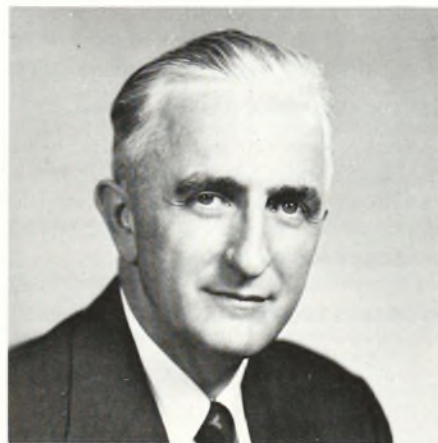
Judge Harry Phillips, **Cumberland '32 (Tennessee Lambda)**, who was appointed by President John F. Kennedy to serve on the Court of Appeals in 1963, died in London, England, on August 3, 1985, after being struck by a motor vehicle. The judge, who was 76, was attending a meeting of the American Bar Association.

Phillips served as an active judge until 1979, giving him the longest tenure as Chief Judge of the Sixth Circuit since the office was created. He had previously served in governmental positions, including Assistant Attorney General of Tennessee, and was in private practice for many years. Brother Phillips was actively involved in many national professional associations and authored several legal papers.

Judge Phillips was "very active in ΣAE," according to chapter brother William Kerr Bassett, **Cumberland '34 (Tennessee Lambda)**. Bassett wrote to *The Record*, "I still remember the delightful party he and his family gave in their home — in the depression-ridden fall of 1930 — for the chapter and its twenty-man pledge class. Just as his efforts in the 1940s prevented the demise of his alma mater, his diligent work in the early 1930s collected enough from delinquent alumni to keep the chapter

financially solvent and avoided the loss of our house."

Brother Phillips is survived by his wife, Virginia, four daughters and seven grandchildren.

“Call it Phi Alpha Financial”

TOM STICKEL TRUSTS TWO THINGS: His instincts and his friends. That's why Stickel, **San Diego State '71 (California Theta)**, hired three fellow Cal Theta ΣAEs to head divisions within his financial services firm, T.C.S. Enterprises.

“It wasn't a predetermined plan to hire ΣAEs as division heads, but more my belief in hiring friends,” explained Stickel. “Building a financial services firm is based on integrity and trust, and you must have employees whom you trust.”

Stickel formed T.C.S. Financial in May of 1983 after resigning as president of the Bank of Southern California. He had founded the bank as Point Loma Savings and Loan and later converted it to a national bank charter.

T.C.S. is described as a supermarket of financial and real estate services. The company employs 401 people in the specialized divisions of mortgage banking, capital management, insurance services, real estate and financial institution consulting.

“Because of the nature of our business, we are adamant about the issue of integrity,” stated the 35-year-old Stickel. “With a friend, its a lot easier to judge their level of integrity. Anyone off the street can submit an impressive resume which tells you little, if anything, about their integrity.”

Stickel, who graduated in business administration, served his chapter as EA, EDA, deputy treasurer and pledge trainer. He is a long time member of the California Theta House Corporation and San Diego Alumni Association.

When Brother Stickel founded Point Loma Savings and Loan in 1978, he was the youngest chief executive officer of a California savings and loan institution at 28. In 1982 he successfully battled the state commissioner of savings and loans to convert the institution to the Bank of Southern California ... a trend-setting move which was the first such conversion in the state and only the third in the nation.

“TOM GAVE UP THE PRESIDENCY OF the bank because he was a little buried and weary of battling the regulators,” said Brad Young, **San Diego State '77 (Cal Theta)**.

As vice president in charge of publications for T.C.S. Capital, Brother Young coordinates the nationwide marketing and distribution of T.C.S.'s two quarterly publications titled “Key Financial Indicators.” One publication is for banks and the other is for savings and loans.

Brad served as EA, pledge trainer and social chairman while an undergraduate at California Theta. He now serves on California Theta's House Corporation, the Interfraternity Council Alumni Association and is an active member of the San Diego Alumni Association.

IN ADDITION TO STICKEL AND YOUNG, the T.C.S. Enterprises team of ΣAEs also includes Rick Jarrett, **San Diego State '72 (Cal Theta)**. A graduate in public administration, Jarrett is president of T.C.S.'s largest division, mortgage banking. While an undergraduate Rick was Eminent Treasurer and pledge trainer. He was also a long time member of the Cal Theta House

Corporation and is currently an active member of the San Diego Alumni Association.

In just over 18 months, Jarrett built from scratch one of the largest and most successful mortgage banking operations in San Diego county, combining traditional programs with state-of-the-art inactive mortgage programs. Jarrett's operation is setting trends in the mortgage industry.

“Working within T.C.S. is a lot like sports,” Jarrett explained. “If you have a teammate doing well, it spurs the other team members to do well. Everybody wants to succeed, and when you have a good day you have brothers to share it with.”

INSURANCE DIVISION PRESIDENT JEFF Byroads **San Diego State '78 (Cal Theta)**, believes that familiarity breeds confidence. Byroads served the chapter as pledge trainer, house manager, Collegiate Council representative and held office in the Interfraternity Council. He is a Past Archon of Province Chi and is currently vice president of the California Theta House Corporation, province extension director, a veteran member of the Leadership School faculty and an active member of the San Diego Alumni Association.

“We knew this company was going to be successful from the outset because we had known each other for over 10 years. We watched each other grow and be

successful," Byroads said. "There was no question that each of us could perform and hold up our respective end of the bargain."

TOM STICKEL DOES NOT CONSIDER himself a workaholic, but he does admit to being a goalaholic. One of his goals for T.C.S. Enterprises is to create a company where virtually all employees are stockholders. More than 50 percent of the stock is owned by employees, and the company's senior management participates in a generous profit incentive program.

"Maybe I'm not a true entrepreneur, because I believe in spreading out the rewards. A true entrepreneur takes all the risk and gets all the reward," Stickel

mused.

Another of Stickel's goals is to have the company foster the entrepreneurial spirit of its division heads. Each division operates as a separate corporation and profit center.

"Because we are all shareholders in the parent corporation, each division is responsible to all the other divisions," said Stickel, who stays out of the day-to-day operation of the divisions. "But it's friendly competition. We're not like sharks competing for something to eat."

Although they have the freedom of entrepreneurs, the T.C.S. Enterprises division heads also benefit from being part of a larger team.

"The sum of the parts is also stronger than the whole," asserted Stickel. "Each

division can stand on its own, but it receives referral business and credibility from being part of the larger entity."

Stickel has no fear that his divisions might break off and form their own companies. "What better scenario could there be for success than to be allowed to maintain your individuality, yet work with friends and be part of a whole?" he asked.

Stickel encourages genuine care and friendship among all employees, but doesn't go in for some so-called management-team-building strategies.

We don't go on retreats, hold hands or hire corporate gurus to build 'friendship.' The friendship we feel is genuine because it has been built over the years," Stickel explained.

Chapters, New Colony Show Dry Rush Success

Alcohol consumption among college students has declined significantly during the past few years. This is an indication that alcohol education programs are working, according to two studies presented recently at a national conference on alcohol use on the college campus.

The studies, conducted in Florida during the Spring Break season, indicate that drinking has fallen off 25 percent among female students since 1981, and 13 percent among males.

Missouri Delta Leads Campus IFC to Dry Rush Day

The brothers of Missouri Delta at Rockhurst College report that they experimented with a dry rush party. They successfully entertained between 150 and 175 people with a barbeque and soft drinks.

"The brothers presented the idea of a "Dry Day" to the Interfraternity Council at Rockhurst," reported P. Scott Hummel of Missouri Delta.

"The IFC in turn mandated that all the fraternities on campus must have a dry rush party.

"We are pleasantly surprised with the outcome of our barbeque," Hummel added.

The brothers at Missouri Delta have also implemented the "Sober Cab" program for their Annual Boxer Rebellion Party. The cab is provided for brothers and guests who have "partied a little too much" and need a ride.

Cal Lambda Overcomes Dry Rush Skepticism

Sometimes chapters develop dry rush programs in an effort to avoid punitive measures from higher authorities. Such was the case last summer with Cal Lambda at California State, Long Beach.

The Cal Lambda chapter had developed a dry rush proposal for the university following an alcohol-related incident. The university stayed a decision of punitive action and gave the chapter a one year probationary period, based on the chapter's plan for dry rush and "good behavior."

"We at Cal Lambda were, to say the least, a little skeptical," wrote Chapter

Member Jade Hays.

"At first we believed that without beer to attract potential pledges to our rush parties, we would not be able to compete with the other fraternities who were planning huge "blowouts."

"With an enrollment of over 30,000 students and without a fraternity row existing on or off campus, our fears were not all too ill-founded!" Hays added.

"Yet with a little creative effort and a lot of enthusiasm our rush ended up being the best on campus. While other fraternities were complaining about damaged chapter halls and the incredible task of meeting rush guests over party noise, we at ΣAE were making a genuine effort to build our brotherhood.

"As a result, we ended the week with 24 pledges out of 24 bids, and we know they are not simply beer-guzzling idiots, but sincere fraternity men," wrote Hays.

"Our future rushes will continue to be dry," he added. "We have proven to ourselves (and to the dismay of the other fraternities) that alcohol is not only an unnecessary catalyst for a rush party, but a deterrent for a successful one."

New UC Irvine Colony Welcomed Due to Dry Rush

The ΣAE Dry Rush concept also won the fraternity the opportunity to colonize on the desirable University of California Irvine campus. The fraternity was bidding for a colony against other national groups.

In an article headlined, **Dry Rush helps win colonization bid for Sigma Alpha Epsilon**, it was revealed that ΣAE was selected because of strong support from local chapters and alumni, and "because of strong leadership programs and the alcohol policy that promotes an awareness to this problem."

In the presentation to Irvine, Grant Gier of the National Fraternity staff stated that all rush functions will be dry. Province Chi Archon Dennis O'Neel told the campus newspaper that "It is not possible to evaluate and select someone if they are half in the bag."

O'Neel added, "We pursued UCI because of the quality of the university. We firmly believe that this will determine the quality of the chapter."

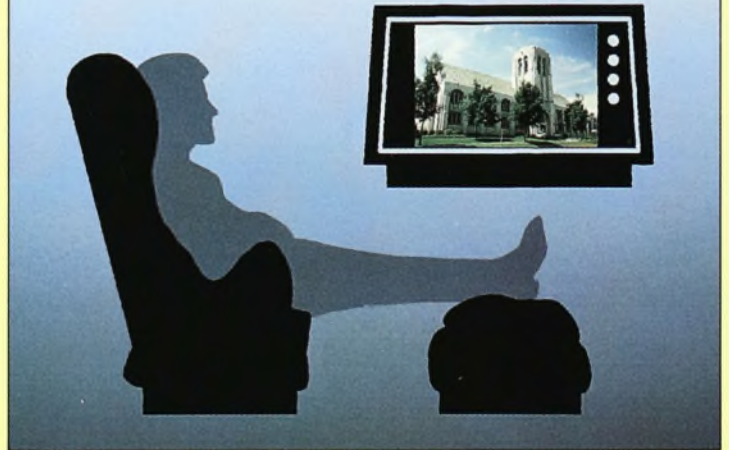
