# Is Fraternity Life Today Any Different?

## The Way We Were vs. The Way We Are

When we get on the subject of fraternities today, we often start thinking, "When I was in college . . ." Typically, we go to the chapter house at Homecoming, make casual observations, compare what we see to "the good old days," and we resign ourselves to the sad truth that things just aren't as good as they were when we were in school.

We remember the innocent days of old when we were in the house. We think, "the guys aren't the same today. Values aren't the same. There isn't any pride in the fraternity any more. Everything's changed."

Is this true? We decided to investigate. We interviewed several SAE alumni volunteers to get a sense of what fraternity life was all about when they were in school, and to ask them what they observe in their work with undergraduate SAEs today. Then we talked with undergraduates in several chapters.

Overall, their answers are surprising. What follows is not a scientific sociological study. It is, however, a glimpse into fraternity life as it was in the last six decades, and as it is today.

### The Fraternity 'Look'

#### Levi's, pink things & crew cuts

Charlie Preuss started school at the **University of Idaho** in 1919. He usually wore ROTC-issued clothing to class: Britches and puttees which wrapped around the lower legs. A former Province Chi officer, Charlie is the fraternity's Honorary Eminent Supreme Archon.

"At Idaho, it was cold in the winter, so we wore woolen socks and heavy shoes, shirts, sweaters and trousers," Dr. Preuss explained. "I had a sheepskin coat for football games."

"It cost thirty-five dollars for a whole outfit," he added.

During the Depression years, Glen Nygreen, a Washington Alpha brother, was wearing slacks, sweaters, jackets and hats to classes at the **University of Washington** in Seattle. Dr. Nygreen is a Past Eminent Supreme Archon and

Director Emeritus of Leadership Training for the national fraternity.

Levi's were standard fare at **UCLA** in the early 1940s, according to Brother Joe Walt, who pledged at Cal Delta.

"Levi's with the red tag on the back, a white dress shirt with the sleeves rolled up twice, white socks and penny loafers," Dr. Walt said. "Once in a while, we wore slacks, and a crewneck or v-neck sweater, if it was cold."


After the war, Joe attended the **University of Tennessee**, where dress was more conservative. There, brothers wore chino or khaki pants and sometimes sport jackets to class. Today Dr. Walt is the Fraternity Historian, a veteran Leadership School faculty member and a chapter advisor.

Brother Dick Generelly was an undergraduate and law student at **George Washington University** during the 1940s. At Washington City Rho, the brothers were wearing white bucks and sports coats to class. Dick is a Past ESA and serves on the Washington City Rho House Corporation.

The '50s saw the rise and fall of many clothes fads, according to Immediate Past ESA Johnny Warren. When Johnny started at **Emory University** in the mid-50s, "pink was in and out within a year," he said.

"Everything was pink — tie clasps, cuff links, stuff like that," he explained.

"Then white socks went out, and pleated pants went out. One guy in the chapter burned all his pleated pants.

"Then stark color contrasts were in vogue. We mostly wore blue jeans, collared shirts with short sleeves and loafers. For the first time, people wore bermuda shorts to class. One guy in the house even went barefoot to class one time.

"There were a lot of innovative guys at **Georgia Epsilon**," Brother Warren explained.

Another fad that emerged in the 1950s was the crew cut, or flat top.

"I used to take a ruler to the top of my head to be sure the top was as flat as a navy carrier," said Tom Goodale, who pledged at Iowa Gamma at **Iowa State University** in the late 50s.

"We wore primarily polished cotton pants — khakis, button-down shirts and sweaters to class," he said. Other occasions at Iowa Gamma called for a blue blazer with the fraternity insignia on it, and a rep tie.

Clarke Houston pledged SAE at **Colorado State University** in the early 1960s. The rage at Colorado Delta then was "white Levi's (tan/white color), thin-waled corduroy pants, button-down shirts, cardigan or pullover sweaters, barracuda jackets and navy blue or white low-cut tennies, or loafers."

"Madras and stripes were very big, too," Clarke said. He is the fraternity's Eminent Supreme Archon today.

Darrell Gibson enrolled at **Ball State University** in the late 1960s. He saw the complete changeover "from preppie to hippie." Today Gibson serves the fraternity as Director of Leadership Training.

When Darrell was initiated at Indiana Zeta in 1970, no jeans were allowed at dinner; shirts with collars were required.

"By the end, it was 'anything goes' — from preppie to the late '60s look," Brother Gibson explained.

This response gives us confidence in our future as well, and is best illustrated by the story of the four recipients of the Most Improved Chapter Award for 1986.

## Fraternity Life

On the University of Oklahoma campus, Brother John March witnessed at Oklahoma Kappa a wide range of student dress typical of the 1970s.

"We wore Japanese 'flaps,' [thongs] pleated jeans, Izod shirts, button-down shirts and Levi's. Some guys even wore cowboy boots," March recalled. March, a former editor of *The Record*, has served as archon of Province Sigma and as a Leadership School faculty member.

"Certain guys in the house were more hippie-ish. They wore overalls, tie-dyed clothes. Doubleknit went out pretty quickly."

At Drake University during the 70s, Iowa Delta brothers stuck to the more conservative "campus leader" image, recalls Marc Franson. Franson is Province Mu archon and has served on the Leadership School faculty for several years.

"We were more dressy than the norm. While the norm on campus was jeans, we were the 'plaid slacks and cardigan sweater crowd' at Drake," Marc explained.

What are our undergraduate brothers wearing to class today?

**At Idaho:** Levi 501 (button-up) jeans, Nikes and t-shirts; in the winter, sweaters and collared shirts.

**At UCLA:** Levi's, t-shirts and either tennis shoes or thongs. Sometimes a button-down or collared shirt. Hooded sweatshirts and sweatpants are common. For Monday night dinner: Coat, tie and dress shoes.

**At George Washington:** Jeans,

sneakers, oxford or polo shirt; maybe docksiders or chinos.

**At Emory:** Oxford shirts, khaki pants, jeans or shorts whenever possible. L. L. Bean camp moccasins are the rage. Sneakers, loafers or moccasins are common.

**At Iowa State:** Blue jeans, pullover shirt and tennis shoes. In the winter, collared shirt and sweater. Hair: Short and parted on the side.

**At Colorado State:** Really casual; jeans, oxford shirt or t-shirt, tennis shoes or casual shoes. Levi 501 button-up jeans.

## Foods and Beverages

### Hamburgers, pizzas, milk and beer

Going out to eat together has been an SAE pastime for many years. Charlie Preuss said the brothers usually went out for hot dogs and hamburgers in the early 1920s.

During the Depression, "hamburgers were a great thing," said Glen Nygreen. They cost "a nickel apiece, or six for a quarter," he reported.

Hamburgers continued to be a favorite "brother food" through each decade. Joe Walt mentioned that thick malted milk ("outrageously immoral" due to calories) was part of the hamburger meal in the 1940s. Tom Goodale said french fries were in the picture in the early '60s, and Clarke Houston included onion rings and Pepsi Cola.

Johnny Warren said that in the 1950s in Atlanta, everyone went to "May-Jay Diner for hot apple pie, and to Mammy Shanty for fried chicken."

Pizza became standard fraternity cuisine in the late '60s or early '70s. Beer was frequently mentioned as part of the pizza meal, although today's undergraduates seem to prefer the free Coke that Domino's delivers with their pizza.

"I think we keep Domino's in business," said Bob Founds, an Idaho Alpha senior. Washington City Rho brother Gregory Harrington, a junior, also specified Domino's pizza as a chapter favorite.

In Fort Collins, Colorado Delta brothers support "70 percent of the pizza

business in town," estimated Brother Shelby Goldman, a junior. "We probably eat 50 pizzas in a week, in addition to the evening meals served at the house."

At Emory, the house provides yogurt and peanut butter for brothers who want a snack. Senior Charlie Young reported that in addition to pizza and McDonald's fried chicken is still popular at Georgia Epsilon.

Milk machines continue to hold their own in chapter houses nationwide.

Milk machines continue to hold their own in chapter houses nationwide, although the high cost of milk has caused some chapters to limit milk consumption or to use a milk sign-up system.

Drinking alcoholic beverages was not a big part of college life in the 1920s, according to Brother Preuss.

"It was during Prohibition, of course. Boys would occasionally get moonshine whiskey, but we didn't tolerate it very much," he said.

All the other brothers interviewed said beer is and was the most common undergraduate alcoholic drink. Coors was the brand name most often mentioned by undergraduates.

Brother Nygreen said that although some brothers drank beer in the '30s, parties and rush were dry. "Wet rush problems started in the '40s and '50s, with the increased war veteran population on campuses," Dr. Nygreen explained.

In keeping with the veteran influx theory, the SAEs we interviewed said drinking alcoholic beverages became common in fraternities in the 1940s. Mostly beer, and mostly on weekends, at parties.

A few of the alumni brothers said that the more "sophisticated" brothers learned to drink scotch in the 1950s, '60s and '70s.

In the 1960s, brothers were still drinking mostly at social functions. By the early '70s, all the rules changed, and chapter houses were even selling beer in pop machines.

Today studies show that students are drinking less and are more aware of the consequences of alcohol abuse. The new Risk Management Policies in effect for all SAE chapters (see the Annual Report in this issue) contain stringent rules and

guidelines for alcohol use at chapter functions. One policy mandates dry rush for all chapters of the fraternity.

The undergraduates interviewed seemed generally to agree with the need for the new policies, given the threat of liability suits in the current litigious climate.

Brother Tom Goodale feels students today understand alcohol and liability issues. Dr. Goodale, who is the vice chancellor for student affairs at the **University of Denver**, is a nationally recognized authority on the prevention of alcohol and substance abuse by students.

"I think there is a hysteria about the liability and alcohol abuse issue in higher education today. We've tried to rush into quick fixes without looking closely at the kids coming into school," Brother Goodale said.

"Kids today reflect more conservative attitudes. There's not a great deal of opposition among these kids to new alcohol policies. They have high awareness and view alcohol as a big health problem," he added.

"Although the insurance crisis is forcing us to develop policies to protect ourselves, I'm bothered that we're rushing into policy development," Tom explained. "We need a middle ground between policy and letting them grow up."

## SAEs Today

*More experienced, tolerant, worldly*

Most of the alumni we interviewed feel that undergraduate brothers today are basically the same as they were in past decades. The differences are attributable to the age of mass communication and high technology.

Tom Goodale has spent 25 years on five different campuses. He sees both differences and similarities in undergraduates today and in past decades.

"Today, students are more worldly, socially sophisticated and intellectually adapted. I found us less concerned about the world and its future than students are today. They're more altruistic.

"Undergraduate men have more women friends today. I see that as very positive," he said.

Dr. Goodale also sees more physical violence on the campus today. "We need more attention paid to managing emotions," he commented.

According to Brother Goodale, today's SAEs are similar to their brothers before them because they "still drink too much, have hangups about relationships with women, coping with parents, gaining independence and sexuality issues.

"They still work hard and play hard," Brother Goodale said, "but they don't have much time to daydream, or smell the roses. They work to make money, they work with the fraternity and on their personal relationships. We try to make students grow up too quickly."

Dr. Nygreen, a college and university administrator for many decades, said, "In essence, SAE young men are no different today. They are looking for great growth; for a way to a better life of opportunity and cultural expression. The



career orientation has always been there."

College history professor Joe Walt commented on today's young SAEs, "There are so many more similarities than differences.

"Today our undergraduates are no more mature than we were, but they are more experienced. They've had more windows to the world, largely through television. They've seen more of the world than we had," Brother Walt said.

"Their tastes are the same as ours were: Sports as participants and spectators; costume hasn't changed that much; the things they find important are

the same. The fraternity catches hold emotionally and spiritually with certain people just as much today as ever ... that's youthful idealism," Joe said.

"And I don't think they're a bit more materialistic than we were, although they have more," he added.

Johnny Warren, who serves as chapter advisor to Georgia Epsilon at Emory, feels that undergraduates today are no different. "I wonder if they're more tolerant of different kinds of people today," he said.

Dick Generelly said of today's young ΣAEs, "They're serious ... directed. They know what they're looking for and are willing to work for it."

Clarke Houston cited some positive differences he sees in today's young ΣAEs.

"I think they're more sociable toward each other and other ΣAE chapters than we were. They're more open," he said.

"Undergraduates today travel more, spend more time visiting other chapters,

and friends in other parts of the country." He said a growing number of transfer students affiliate with other chapters of the fraternity.

Brother Houston said undergraduate men come to college more informed and more experienced in general. He has observed a decline among undergraduates in social graciousness, which he feels can be attributed largely to changes in the family structure in our society.

Darrell Gibson said young ΣAEs today have to deal with a lot more issues than he did as an undergraduate.

"Date rape, liability ... we had never even heard of cocaine when I went to school," he said.

"The issues they deal with today hit home more. Girls still had [curfew] hours when I first started school. At the end, there was open visitation in the dorms," Brother Gibson added.

"People maybe seem a little more cynical," John March commented. "There's a lot to the 'me decade' of the 1980s. People seem very much driven by career success, [but] our security has been shaken. Look at Watergate, nuclear power plant meltdowns ... the oil business, and what's happened in Texas and Oklahoma with the energy crisis in the '70s, and oil prices today."

"You have to look out for yourself," John said.



Marc Franson said he, too, detects more of a self-centeredness in students today.

"On the other hand," he said, "I see a resurgence of maturity. Some students are willing to turn around and change some of that 'me first, self-gratification' attitude. Things go in cycles."

Despite the surface changes, trends and fads, young college men today are basically no different than they were ten or fifty years ago. Whatever magic there was in the fraternity in 1856 still exists today.

"The fraternity is enriched over the years," said ESA Houston.

"It's become more meaningful. All through the late '60s and everything, the traditions deepened. The fraternity and its meaning proved to be timeless."

"It's every bit as cogent now as it was 20 years ago, and more," he added.

After Leadership School, Shawn and I continued to correspond. One day, it was decided that I would visit him at Tennessee Beta.


The moment I landed in Nashville, I felt the bonds of brotherhood. (Both Shawn and I

## Foundation Provides Three Summer Internships

The Summer Intern Program of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation provides unique educational work experiences for students. Summer internship winners each design their own internship, which enables the intern to learn about a field that interests him or her while being paid.

The internships are publicized through college and university deans' offices, and are available to a maximum of four qualifying students each year. The internships proposed must benefit fellowmen in addition to providing an educational experience. This year, each intern received \$2,500 for their summer work.

**The Campaign for SAE** will provide a permanent endowment to sponsor undergraduates and graduate students for summer internships in health, government, business, law and education.

### Hightower: Dropout Problem

The Summer Intern Program enabled Courteney Ann Hightower to pursue her interest in and commitment to helping dropout-prone students in Chicago public schools. Working under the auspices of the Bureau of Dropout Prevention, Chicago Public Schools, she was involved in a number of projects designed to retain or re-admit such students.

Hightower feels she is an "exception to the rule" because she graduated from Chicago public schools and went on to attend Stanford University. She is currently a senior in political science and sociology at Stanford.

Her self-designed internship began with three weeks of research, which provided an understanding of the nature and complexity of the national dropout problem. She then worked on a daily basis at the Bureau of Dropout Prevention in Chicago, learning about the operation of an agency which addresses a "major metropolitan crisis." She worked with program directors, youth counselors and arbitrators in youth/school disputes.

Courteney prepared and administered a survey for students involved in Chicago dropout prevention programs. With the survey results, she is making recommendations for the Bureau, pinpointing the most productive interventions and potential strategies for combating the dropout problem.

### Perez: Court Schools Evaluated

Michael Perez, a junior at Stanford University majoring in human biology and psychology, spent his summer researching the San Diego Juvenile Court School system and providing needed

services to the Oak Creek Boys Ranch, a foster home for boys from abusive homes.

The Court Schools provide instruction for minors who have had contact with the judicial court system. The students are commonly foster children, abused or delinquent. The purpose of the schools is to guide the minors from a specialized educational system back to public schools.

By collecting data regarding the court school's role, Perez evaluated the efficiency of the San Diego Juvenile Court Schools in transferring students back into the public educational system. His work was essentially a continuation of an internship he established the previous year with the San Diego County Court Schools.

In addition to researching records at the San Diego County Probation Department, Michael spent two days a week as an instructor and counselor at the Oak Creek Boys Ranch. He taught reading skills, spelling, math, physical education and communication skills, in addition to supervising special activities away from the ranch and providing peer counseling.

Perez' research findings have provided organized data for teachers in the system, as well as for a governmental committee charged with analyzing the Court Schools and allocating resources.

## Gwilym: Refugee Assistance

Janet Gwilym's summer internship provided her the opportunity to assist with the Washington Association of Churches (WAC) Resettlement & Job Program, an agency of Church World Service, in Seattle. She is a senior in sociology at Stanford.

Gwilym completed two videotape projects for the Resettlement & Job Program. One video features a series of refugees in several different occupations who were placed by WAC and partner agencies. The videotape, which was developed, taped and edited by Gwilym, is designed to show refugees in job readiness and vocational English programs what to expect in various American occupations and work settings.

The second video program developed by Janet explains the resettlement process a refugee encounters when moving to the United States. This videotape is used in the WAC recruiting and marketing efforts.

Steve Masciocchi, Janet's internship supervisor, wrote, "our program will benefit both in terms of the tools Janet [provided] for our teachers and in assisting our efforts to market our program to the community, especially to potential sponsors."

Recipients of the scholarship are selected for their scholastic achievement as well as their genuine concern for the scholarship of the chapter.

# THE FRATERNITY IN 1986

We are proud to present our annual report on the 1986 SAE Year. This report will provide information on the various awards and recognition given to chapters, alumni associations, and house corporations and to individual undergraduates and alumni. We present information on our financial position, capsule highlights of the SAE year, and the traditional State of the Chapters report.

In general, I can report that Sigma Alpha Epsilon chapters continue to provide a terrific growing and learning experience for their members. The average size chapter stands at 75 members, and so far, declining college enrollments in the traditional 18-21 age group doesn't seem to be affecting our ability to be successful. Fall 1986 rush has gone particularly well for most chapters.

Work continues on improving chapter standards, and the staff and volunteers charged with this responsibility appear to be doing an increasingly effective job. SAE started a new national training program for house corporation officers at the 51st Leadership School with 23 alumni brothers participating in this first workshop. We believe that this program, along with existing training programs for chapter advisors and province officers, will have a far-reaching effect on the quality of chapters in the future.

## 1986: The Year of Risk Management

A crisis was deftly averted by our Supreme Council in September when our insurance carrier threatened not to renew the liability insurance coverage in place for each chapter of the fraternity. The Supreme Council, very wisely, put into effect a set of new policies on the use of alcohol and drugs, hazing, sexual abuse, general chapter discipline and fire and safety standards. As of this writing, all but one chapter or colony has accepted the policies and incorporated them into their chapter by-laws. (See Mandated Policies.)

Chapter officers will be responsible for educating their members as to the content of the new policies and for enforcing them. Chapters that fail to do so face being

dropped from the rolls of Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity. SAE can no longer bear the risk to its assets brought on by irresponsible and sloppy risk management by individual chapters.

Our readers should be assured that the Supreme Council intends to deal with each infraction on an individual basis, and will not arbitrarily suspend charters. If we find it necessary to suspend a charter, the alumni of that chapter may decide to work with the chapter and help them to petition for reinstatement at a future date. In the past, the national fraternity often continued a chapter on its rolls while the chapter worked out its problems. Unfortunately, the current litigious climate precludes our ability to continue that practice.

## Continued Careful Growth: 195 chapters in 1986

Two new chapters were installed in 1986 for a net gain of one chapter, which brings the roster of active chapters to 195, the highest in our history. Five new colonies were installed bringing the total to twelve colonies. No charters were suspended (as of November 1, 1986). See the State of the Chapters chart for statistical information on specific chapters.

Unfortunately, SAE experienced the loss of one chapter in 1986. The chapter at **Oklahoma City University**, Oklahoma Tau, surrendered its charter to the Supreme Council in October due to the fact that only three pledges returned to the campus this fall. The Supreme Council accepted the charter with regret.

## National Finances

To support the programs and services provided to the general fraternity, revenue is generated by Sigma Alpha Epsilon, Inc. and its related Foundation. Among the fraternities across the land, Sigma Alpha Epsilon has the best ratio of revenue from the three traditional revenue sources available, which are undergraduate dues and fees, alumni gifts, and endowment income. SAE receives about one-third of its revenue from each of these sources. Many fraternities draw from 60 to 80 percent of their funding from undergraduate sources.

The financial position of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity, Inc. is quite strong despite the \$20,000 deficit we experienced in fiscal 1986 (July 1, 1985 to June 30, 1986). Fortunately, for several years prior to 1986 we experienced considerable margins of revenue over expense, allowing us to build up a healthy reserve. The deficit in 1986 can be attributed to the expenses encountered as a

result of the collapse of the ceiling in the studio of the National Headquarters in Evanston. The cost of cleanup and repair was close to \$40,000. (See Financial Statement.)

## In Appreciation

An organization is only as good as the people who work for it. We are fortunate to have a very fine national staff and hundreds of volunteer alumni leaders and workers around the country. We thank our Supreme Council, national staff, national committee members, province officers, chapter advisors and house corporation officers for their overwhelming interest, involvement, support, time, talent, personality and hard work. It all adds up to a very dynamic, exciting and quality fraternity. ## FRATERNITY HIGHLIGHTS, 1985-86

- Initiated 4,004 new brothers for a total of 202,811 initiated members since our founding in 1856. Presented badge number 200,000 to Sam Painovich, **Drake '88** (Iowa Delta).
- Installations at **SUNY-Binghamton** (New York Omega) and the **University of Santa Clara** (California Phi) in November 1986 bring the total number of chapters to 195.
- New colonies at the **University of California - Irvine**, **North Texas State**, **Eastern Washington University**, **Millsaps College** in Mississippi and **Yale University** in Connecticut bring the total number of colonies to 12. In addition, there are six interest groups that are awaiting colonization.
- Introduction of the House Corporation Officers Program at the 51st Leadership School for a total of 707 delegates, including 23 house corporation officers, 25 chapter advisors and 25 province officers. In all, a record 170 chapters and 12 colonies sent delegates to the school. Total attendance through 51 schools is 16,835 delegates.
- Publication of "The Gold Book," a comprehensive chapter management resource manual, and a "House Manager's Manual."
- Establishment of a Risk Management System for reducing risk and handling claims and suits as they are reported to the fraternity. System includes arranging for liability insurance coverage for all chapters and colonies. Program also provides resource materials on chapter risk management in the form of written materials, speakers, and videotapes.
- Provided one first mortgage loan of \$60,000 to a chapter and one loan of \$1,500 for the purchase of computer equipment to another chapter, bringing the total amount of loans to \$704,000 provided to 29 chapters of SAE.

# POLICIES OF SIGMA ALPHA EPSILON CHAPTERS

***As Mandated by the Supreme Council on September 12, 1986***

*To be incorporated into all chapter by-laws by October 10, 1986*

## **ALCOHOL AND DRUGS:**

1. The possession, use and/or consumption of *ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES*, while on chapter premises, during an official Fraternity event, or in any situation sponsored or endorsed by Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity, must be in compliance with any and all applicable laws of the state, county, city and university.
2. *SALE OF ALCOHOL* by any chapter of Sigma Alpha Epsilon is strictly forbidden. This is to include any action that can be remotely construed as alcohol sale such as: charging admission to parties, passing the hat, selling empty cups and selling drink tickets.
3. The possession, sale and/or use of any *ILLEGAL DRUGS OR CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES* at any ΣAE house or sponsored event or at any event that would allow a normal observer to view one as associated with the Fraternity is strictly prohibited and will be grounds for the immediate expulsion of those involved.
4. Each member and pledge will be *INSTRUCTED* on the drinking age laws, regulation of sale laws, open container laws and other laws pertinent to chapter's jurisdiction, specifically dramshop liability, implied consent, and host liquor liability. Instruction shall also be provided with the goal of engendering in each member a sense of responsibility toward the welfare of those who consume alcohol, the encouragement of *intervention to prevent* any person from *drinking to excess*, or from engaging in any potentially dangerous activity, including *driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol*. Instruction must also be provided on *emergency procedures* to be employed as a result of alcohol abuse.
5. No "*GRAIN ALCOHOL*." and any such distilled liquor that exceeds 100 proof, or above 50 percent pure grade alcohol per volume, is to be served in any form or mixture during a Fraternity sponsored event, due to the destructive and immediate effects that such high alcohol concentration can cause. Furthermore, any legal use of alcohol will not involve providing *unlimited quantities*, no activity shall encourage *rapid consumption* of alcohol, and no person shall be *forced* for any reason to *consume alcohol*.
6. All *RUSH ACTIVITIES* associated with any chapter of Sigma Alpha Epsilon will be *DRY*. The ideals and concepts on which the Fraternity stands are not dependent on alcohol.
7. *OPEN PARTIES*, meaning those with unrestricted access, and without specific invitation, shall be prohibited.

## **HAZING:**

The Fraternity will not tolerate nor condone any form of hazing. Hazing is to be defined as: (from National Laws, 1985)

Paddling in any form; physical exercises resulting in excessive fatigue or exhaustion; deprivation of normal sleep and rest; any form of corporal or mental punishment; the placing of anyone in actual or simulated peril or jeopardy of health; undignified methods and stunts; either public or private quests; treasure hunts; road trips, late work sessions or any other activities which interfere with scholastic achievement of the pledges.

## **SEXUAL ABUSE:**

The Fraternity will not tolerate nor condone any form of sexually abusive behavior on the part of its members, whether physical, mental or emotional. This is to include any actions that are demeaning to women including but not limited to date rape, gang rape or verbal harassment. Any such actions will be cause for expulsion of individual offenders and/or charter suspension.

## **FIRE AND SAFETY:**

The Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity hereby mandates that no chapter shall be housed in or use the services of a structure which does not meet minimum fire and safety requirements of the community. The chapter will be responsible to provide the national fraternity office by November 15 of each year with a written statement from the local fire inspector proclaiming the chapter or its facilities are safe for habitation or regular use.

## **CHAPTER POLICIES:**

All Chapters of Sigma Alpha Epsilon will *develop policies* on alcohol and drugs, hazing, sexual abuse and conduct unbecoming a true gentleman, and fire health and safety including the use of chapter property and conduct of chapter events and submit copies to the national fraternity office by November 15, 1986.

# THE FOUNDATION IN 1986



We are proud to present our annual report on the 1986 SAE Foundation Year. This report includes information on our financial position, capsule highlights of the Foundation Year, and the listing of donors to the SAE Foundation Annual Campaign. We also present a special message on the progress of the Campaign for SAE: The Path to Leadership. In general, we can easily say that 1986 was a terrific year for the Foundation. Our investments did well, annual giving results were at an all-time high, and the capital campaign results, to date, bode well for the future.

We are especially excited about the plans for the Men's Health Issues Committee chaired by Father Robert Hedges, Drake '51, (*Iowa Delta*). The committee met for the first time last January to begin work on a plan to provide assistance to chapters of Sigma Alpha Epsilon on a broad range of health problems affecting college men. The committee will provide resources such as speakers, written materials and videotape productions. Videotape programs are already available on such topics as

Young Men's Sexual Responsibility, Reproductive Health, Cancer, AIDS, and Legal Liability. Additional tapes are being planned.

The concept of Chapter Leadership School Tuition Endowment Funds was established by a gift of Richard Koella, **Tennessee '49 (Kappa)**, for the benefit of the Tennessee Kappa chapter. Such funds have a minimum funding requirement of \$5,000 before they can begin granting scholarships for

attendance at the national Leadership Schools. Several chapters and alumni associations are now planning to establish such funds. Incidentally, house corporations will be able to borrow from the principal of such funds for the purpose of chapters' house improvements. The interest they pay on the loans will provide scholarships to the Leadership School for their chapter delegates.

## In Appreciation

The Foundation was blessed to have an exceptional staff and volunteer leaders and workers from across the country to give it a highly successful 1986. We thank our trustees, our staff, committee members and all those alumni and friends who assisted the progress of the Foundation with their monetary contributions. Please refer to the Directory in this issue for information on the staff and volunteer leadership of the Foundation.

## FOUNDATION HIGHLIGHTS, 1985-86

- Allocated \$76,787 in Chapter House Library grants to assist in the building or renovation of improved chapter library and/or study facilities.
- Provided an \$80,000 grant in support of the SAE National Leadership School.
- Provided \$7,756 in tuition scholarships to individual delegates to attend the SAE Leadership School.
- Provided \$2,000 grants to Resident Educational Advisors who were sponsored by 12 chapters of Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity.
- Provided 44 new student loans of approximately \$65,000 to undergraduate and graduate student members of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity.
- Received \$527,000 in contributions to set an all-time record for the Annual Giving Program. (See Financial Statement.)
- Received over \$4.2 million in pledges to The Campaign for SAE: The Path to Leadership. (See separate report on The Campaign.)
- Provided \$4,500 in scholarship grants to the outstanding scholars of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity. An additional \$7,000 was awarded by various chapter scholarship funds held in trust by the Foundation. (See Foundation Programs section in this issue.)
- Provided three Summer Intern grants of \$2,500 each. (See Foundation Programs section in this issue.)






**Sellers**





### 'Brother Hero' Stephen Noser

Birmingham-Southern chapter delegates to the 51st Leadership School learned of the heroic death of their brother, Joseph Stephen Noser, Jr. **Birmingham-Southern '87** (*Alabama Iota*), a day before the fraternity's Memorial Service. Brother Noser drowned while trying to rescue a friend in Wales.

Stephen had been in Wales on a weekend outing from Oxford University, where he was studying in a summer program for American students. While he and friends were swimming in a pool below a waterfall, Alabama Iota brother Douglas Lowery was caught by currents and pulled under. Noser went to his aid but was also pulled under. Lowery resurfaced and was hospitalized. Brother Noser's body was found by divers the next day.

Brantley R. Watts, Eminent Archon of Alabama Iota, wrote to *The Record*, "He was a true 'Brother Hero.' He was a very strong leader in our chapter and on campus and his absence is very much apparent this fall."

"There's a profound sense of grief here," said college president Dr. Neal Berte, **Cincinnati '62** (*Ohio Epsilon*), in interviews with newspapers. "He really

personified what this college is all about . . . He sure was a part of the life of this institution."

Brother Noser was a pre-med major. He had been president of the Interfraternity Council and president of Alpha Lambda Delta, a freshman honorary. He had served the chapter as Eminent Treasurer.

An endowed scholarship has been established in Noser's memory. The fund will support students attending the British Studies at Oxford Program. Donations can be sent to P.O. Box A-3, Birmingham, Alabama 35254.

### Hewitt Wheless, World War II Hero

Retired Air Force Lt. Gen. Hewitt T. Wheless, **Texas '38** (*Rho*), a highly decorated World War II bomber pilot, died in September at age 72. For his service during the war in the Pacific, Wheless was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross by President Franklin D. Roosevelt. He also received the Legion of Merit, the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Medal. He retired in 1968 as assistant chief of the Air Force at the Pentagon.

### Bud Reid, Gas Processing Scientist



## New Ernie Pyle Book A 'Must Read'

### Ernie's War

by David Nichols

*Ernie's War* is an astute compilation of columns of the famous World War II correspondent, Ernie Pyle, **Indiana '23 (Gamma)**. In what this reviewer deems as a "must read" for today's younger generation, David Nichols skillfully weaves together a series of columns that tell a vivid story of World War II, in a most unique manner.

Why "must read"? Because the scars of Viet Nam are all too visible, along with equally unpleasant memories of the Korean Conflict. *Ernie's War* speaks of a "popular war," or, at the least, a war in which the American people were united in their effort to win a truly justifiable conflict. The effort was to rid the world of the menace of cruel dictatorship, anti-semitism, and military aggression.

Ernie Pyle's style of using his subject's full name, address and views on "doing his job" were widely acclaimed and formed the basis of his immense popularity. No aloof reporter, Pyle actually lived in the foxholes, burned-out buildings and tents with the real heroes of his stories: the American G.I.s.

War's ugly horrors were touched by humor and pathos that so marked the mood of the country of the time (i.e. "no soldier ever suffered from constipation during an invasion . . .")

Above the grisly view of dead comrades and the constant terror of the "kill or be killed" daily existence, runs the

spirit of optimism, patriotism, and altruism that has not been witnessed since. Nowhere in the writings does one find constant criticism of or challenge to our country's position, so apparent during the major conflicts since. Ernie Pyle reported only what he saw daily from his shoulder-to-shoulder position with the farm boys, grocery clerks, salesmen, and schoolboys turned professional killers. The big political discussions were not considered. It was right that they all should be there doing the job of temporary slaughter, with grim determination to get it won and go home.

Ernie Pyle's life, as with so many of his subjects, was ended by a sniper's bullet while he crouched in a ditch seeking shelter in April of 1945. Two world-shaking events were yet to occur: The explosion of the first atom bomb, and the discovery of the holocaust of Hitler's concentration camps. One does wonder how these things would have altered Pyle's style.

Preceding the collection of columns in *Ernie's War* is a frank biography of the man himself. Many are surprised to learn that Ernie and his wife, Jerry, (whom he married in 1926) were legitimate "bohemians" in their lifestyle — a style not far removed from that of the "hippie" culture. His itch to travel and be involved in the war ran counter to the pressing need of his wife's constant de-

pression. Her unsuccessful attempts at suicide led to many months in mental institutions and were a serious drain on the war correspondent.

Ernie is shown as a Hoosier with relatively humble aspirations. His monetary awards were huge in proportion to his simple way of doing his job. He was venerated by politicians, top military brass as well as his beloved "G.I. Joe," and, of course, the American people.

He left an indelible mark on all who were involved in the horrible event known as World War II.

# MOST IMPROVED CHAPTER AWARD

## Four Chapters Win With Pride

### **LOUISIANA EPSILON**

#### *Chivalry Makes a Comeback*

Perhaps the most impressive improvement story belongs to Louisiana Epsilon, **Louisiana State University**. The chapter, which is the oldest on campus, experienced a severe decline in SAE principles during the late seventies and early eighties. The chapter was placed on probation more times than any other chapter at LSU and members reportedly actually enjoyed their reputation as the campus "Animal House." Despite the efforts of a few members who tried to pull the chapter out of its rut, the Supreme Council was forced to suspend their charter. This led not only to a loss of alumni support, but eventually Louisiana Epsilon was forced to close its doors entirely.

After the closing, the fraternity gave the chapter an opportunity to rebuild itself from scratch. During the 1985 spring semester, the brothers met once a week to plan their return. Those members who had a desire to place the chapter above themselves were invited to help make the dream into a reality.

The first changes began with the chapter's rush program, which was totally revamped. The quality of pledges, not quantity, became a priority. They began looking for members who fit the mold of a "true gentleman." As anticipated, only a small number of bids were given out and accepted. However, they achieved the scholastic and personal excellence they were seeking.

The pledge program also underwent change. "In the past, a pledge was always considered a 'slave' to the actives. This caused a separation of pledges and actives, which led to a conflict within the house," described Outstanding Eminent Archon Award winner Eric La Fleur.

"Today, all work required by pledges is done in conjunction with actives. All hazing has been eliminated. One new activity which was begun this year is pledge dinners. The chapter invites an entire sorority pledge class for dinner at the house, and the SAE actives serve the meal.

Another change that evolved is the brothers' respect for the house itself. After the closing, they had to face rebuilding the house themselves with their own money and time. One wing had been totally destroyed during the period in which the house was closed. Together they replaced windows, rewired the electrical system, rebuilt doors and shelves, painted, and hung new fixtures.

"In the past, the house was always a wreck," continued Brother La Fleur. "After parties, doors and windows had to be replaced. It was difficult to fill the house, as no one wanted to live in those conditions. Now there is a waiting list. Respect exists between people living in the house, and it is now possible to study there."

In addition to helping themselves, Louisiana Epsilon has begun helping others by participating in community projects. The brothers are involved with such activities as the Muscular Dystrophy Marathon, Meals on Wheels, blood drives, and especially the Greater Baton Rouge Canned Food Drive.

Alumni relations is another area that's taken a turn for the better. The publication of an alumni newsletter each semester and an alumni reunion in the fall are both part of the plan to demonstrate that the chapter has improved.

"The chapter members have come to realize that the fraternity is a business and must be run like one," said La Fleur. "The chapter takes pride in their organization. Their files and reporting to the national office, province officers, and to the university are evidence of their desire to maintain order and peak efficiency. They also realize the importance of maintaining records for future use in order to continue good chapter management."

Through their determined efforts, on March 9, 1986 the brothers of Louisiana Epsilon were the proud recipients of their charter from the national fraternity. The brotherhood had done what only they believed they could do. Men of high ideals were bonded together in friendship, as they hammered out the dream of making SAE a positive force once more at Louisiana State University.

## KANSAS ALPHA

### *Exclusion Leads to Excellence*

Although their chapter was not closed, the brothers at Kansas Alpha, **University of Kansas** in Lawrence, were placed on an alumni commission. The university suspended the chapter as a registered student organization at the beginning of the 1985-86 school year for a two-year period as a result of serious infractions of University regulations, including hazing, and a deterioration of the quality of chapter life in general. They were prohibited from participating in I.F.C. events including formal rush and other campus activities such as Homecoming.

The chapter's charter was placed in the hands of an Alumni Commission composed of Kansas Alpha alumni. Along with this dedicated alumni group, the house pulled together and eventually the charter was returned in May of 1986, which was a year ahead of the university's proposed schedule.

Outstanding Eminent Archon Award winner Jim O'Donnell observed, "The

chapter pulled together with the help of the Alumni Commission and took some steps in the right direction. The members realize that this is only the beginning, and it will take a continued effort to put Kansas Alpha back on top where it belongs."

Some of their most notable accomplishments so far have been in scholarship, community service and pledge programming. Scholarship was the primary focus of improvement. Together with positive study incentive programs, determined scholarship chairmen, and old-fashioned hard work by the entire house, the chapter was able to raise its overall grade point average the first semester to 2.72. It rose again in the spring to 2.75, which placed the house eleventh out of 28 houses on campus.

Kansas Alpha has made its mark in the community by participating in blood drives and the American Red Cross "5K Run for Life." Also with the American

Red Cross, the house sponsors "CPR Saturday," an annual event in which the members spend the day teaching the Lawrence area community residents the lifesaving techniques of cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

The pledge program is now a positive reinforcement program in which the pledges are commended for excelling in scholarship and house duties instead of punished for poor grades or lack of dedication. A strict no-hazing policy has been implemented.

"Hazing is a thing of the past," commented one junior. "It was never constructive and served no purpose. The new positive pledge program helps promote brotherhood and unity, the very ideal of our fraternity. Hazing never did that. How can you call someone brother when they spend the whole semester yelling at and demoralizing you?"

Before, many members viewed the alumni commission period as a burden and obstacle. However, the consensus now is that the commission was exactly what the house needed to pull out of the slump it had fallen into and realize its potential. Their rapid, ahead-of-schedule progress is a product of an all-house effort. In the words of Brother O'Donnell, the commission "turned out to be a blessing."

## OREGON ALPHA

### *Out of the Ashes With Alumni Support*

Scholastic achievement and financial stability were the goals attained by Oregon Alpha at **Oregon State University** which led to their receiving the Most Improved Chapter Award. The chapter was placed on probation by the fraternity on January 1, 1985 for being unable to collect a large outstanding debt and for

poor financial management. In one year, they made astonishing progress not only in the area of chapter financing, but in superior scholastic improvement as well. On January 1, 1986 they were deservedly removed from probation.

"Oregon Alpha had traditionally been one of the top fraternities on the Oregon State campus," said Chapter Advisor Dick Thompson. "Although the chapter continued strong showings in rush, community service, intramural sports, and social functions, it was obvious that the chapter no longer believed they were the best house on campus. They were frustrated with their inability to address the financial problems, and they were feeling the effects on their grades, with 'live-outs,' maintenance of the house, and relations with the alumni."

Oregon Alpha's success story began with the complete turnaround of the financial program. With the guidance from their alumni, especially Darrell Carlson, **Oregon State '55** (Alpha), the outstanding \$20,000 balance owed was paid off and today the chapter's bills are paid on time.

A financial system was designed which included monthly written billings and frequent letters to members' parents, both of which made each member's financial obligations clear.

Another phenomenal achievement made by Oregon Alpha was their quick and determined rise to the upper scholastic levels among Oregon State's fraternities. The chapter set its grade point average goal to rank within the top 10 of the 28 fraternities on campus. Not only did the brothers advance from 18th to fifth during the fall of 1985, they then moved to second place in the spring with a GPA of 2.91. Success was breeding success, and the chapter was beginning to regain confidence in themselves.

At a Founder's Day celebration, the chapter was awarded the Province Lambda's Porter Underwood Commitment to Excellence Award in recognition of their improvement over the past year. In an effort to regain their charter, the brothers of Oregon Alpha ended up exceeding the goals they originally set for themselves. Their climb back to the top has been an impressive one.

#### *This Could Be the Start of Something Big*

Kentucky Kappa, at **Centre College** in Danville, has attained several goals in the past year. The most notable accomplishment was the initiation of 26 pledges. Given the fact that a 17-member house more than doubled its size with initiation, on a campus of approximately 800 students, they have clearly shown that they have an extremely successful rush and pledge program.

The list of Kentucky Kappa's achievements is extensive. The chapter earned the Yerkes Cup, which is awarded to the chapter with the highest grade point average among the six fraternities on campus. They have won the award for the fourth year out of five. Ten of the chapter's members were recognized as having made the Dean's List. In addition

to these scholastic awards, the chapter received the Chapter Achievement Award from the national fraternity, and William Jeffrey was recognized as one of the 10 Outstanding Eminent Archons.

The brothers are extremely active in community service projects. They have participated in Special Olympics, St. Jude's Bike-a-Thon, Casino Night for the Leukemia Foundation and various other organizations, including sponsoring dances and a haunted house. The chapter raised over \$2,000 for the Cancer Society with a Jail-a-Thon and assisted a campus sorority with their annual fund-raiser.

In the case of Kentucky Kappa, the catalyst for improvement did not come from the need to regain their charter, but rather to accumulate more members for the survival of the house. Brother Jeffrey reported that they have bigger and better plans for the coming year, such as putting on the first SAE formal in several years. Through their accomplishments and spirit, the brotherhood of Kentucky Kappa has succeeded in building a strong foundation of SAE pride that is sure to continue in the years ahead.

# Daring to be Different

## SUNY-Binghamton Installed As New York Omega

MENTION NEW YORK AND ONE AUTOMATICALLY THINKS OF THE ELECTRIC EXCITEMENT OF NEW YORK CITY, THE CITY THAT NEVER SLEEPS. BUT IF YOU DRIVE FOUR HOURS NORTHWEST TO BINGHAMTON IN UPSTATE NEW YORK, THE ENVIRONMENT, PACE AND MOVEMENT ARE CONTRARY TO THAT OF THE BIG APPLE.

However, the feeling of electric excitement, life and energy exists at the State University of New York in Binghamton, within New York Omega, the newest chapter of Sigma Alpha Epsilon.

On November 1, 1986, after two years of dedicated work as a colony, 63 men were initiated into the fraternity, becoming brothers and charter members of New York Omega.

THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK at Binghamton was founded in 1946 as Triple Cities College (a branch of Syracuse University) and since that time has become one of four university centers in the SUNY system. SUNY Binghamton is located near the Susquehanna River, one mile west of the city of Binghamton.

In 1976, the Board of Trustees of the SUNY system began to permit national Greek organizations on the campuses. In the past two years, the Greek system has exploded from five local fraternities and sororities to a current total of 22, the majority of which are affiliated with national organizations.

In October 1984, a group of friends from one of the local residence halls decided they wanted to find something more than acquaintances during their college experience. Nothing appealed to them that existed on their campus. As an interest group, they took the initiative to contact Grant Gier, extension director at the SAE national office, concerning the possibility of forming a fraternity. With a feeling of commitment and enthusiasm, the group was colonized by SAE in February of 1985.

ON OCTOBER 31, AFTER EIGHTEEN months of zealous work in develop-

ing the colony's programs and brotherhood, 63 colony members anxiously awaited the arrival of Official Family members and brothers from neighboring chapters to begin a weekend of brotherhood and to be installed as SAE's newest chapter.

As most brothers across the country celebrated Halloween, uncertain of what awaited them in the night, the members of the Binghamton colony anxiously gathered for their introductory meeting. In attendance were Eminent Supreme Archon J. Clarke Houston III; Province Nu Archon Dennis Neider; Province Nu officers Dan Gladding, Jim Sakers and Tim Gilroy; Extension Director Brad Cohen; and Assistant Director of Chapter Development Steve Brister.

The purpose of the meeting on Friday was to discuss New York Omega's role in the national organization, in the province and on the campus, as well as the importance of the initiation to be held the following afternoon. After Brother Houston had declared the colony members neophytes, the ritual book was passed around to each colony member who expressed his personal feelings about becoming a member of Sigma Alpha Epsilon. The warmth, caring and friendship that was felt in the room that night was overwhelming. Brother

Houston said it was moments like this that make him "thankful to be alive and to be an SAE."

SATURDAY BEGAN WITH THE INITIATION ceremony which was held at the Holiday Inn Arena in Binghamton. The room, complete with all the SAE ritual equipment, created an atmosphere of a rich and lasting heritage. Alan Hoffman of Pennsylvania Gamma and Clarke Houston presided over the ceremony. Dan Gladding of Maryland Sigma was most impressive as Eminent Preceptor, as was Scott Duvall of Pennsylvania Gamma as Eminent Recorder, and Bill Purnell of Maryland Sigma as Eminent Chronicler. Dean Prager, Maryland Sigma, was Eminent Chaplain while Eric David, Pennsylvania Gamma, and Don Classen, Nebraska Lambda-Pi, performed the roles of Eminent Herald and Eminent Warden respectively. With brothers from all parts of the country present and a moving ceremony, one could not help but feel a sense of pride and joy. The setting was a fitting way to welcome SAE's newest brothers into the fraternity.

The installation banquet was held that evening at the Holiday Inn. There was a feeling of excitement and anticipation in the air, yet a tremendous feel-

ing of accomplishment, too. All the newly initiated brothers and their dates were in attendance, as were local fraternity and sorority presidents, members of the administration and ΣAE brothers from different chapters.

One could not help but notice the tremendous attendance by the parents, too. They shared as much pride that day as did their sons. They knew and appreciated how long and hard their sons had worked to see their dream come true.

**D**ENNIS NEIDER PRESENTED THE CHARTER with the ΣAE flag, pin cushion, feather pen and statue of Minerva on behalf of Province Nu. Frank Courson, Province Nu deputy archon, presented Eminent Archon Mike Polis with violets which had been sent from the "Mother Mu" chapter, Alabama Mu. Brad Cohen presented the chapter with initiation equipment on behalf of the national fraternity, and then pinned Polis with the Eminent Archon's badge.

ESA Houston then presented the chapter with a gavel on behalf of the Supreme Council. Following the presentation of a shingle to each member by Past Extension Director Grant Gier, the chapter gathered on the dance floor in increasing anticipation. Finally, Brother Houston presented the charter to New York Omega amid thunderous applause from the guests and the newly initiated brothers.

Houston commended the members for "daring to be different." He challenged them to continue to be the best they could be and to try and live by the ideals that they had heard during the initiation ceremony that afternoon. He also challenged them to "dare to be different" in the years to come.



## Brother Joe Ching Explores Chinese Architecture

Brother Joe Ching of Missouri Beta at **Washington University** in St. Louis, explored China last summer for six weeks. He and his brother, an Ohio State University medical student, traveled there with their father, who teaches Chinese and calligraphy at Ohio State.

Ching, an architecture student, got the chance to study Chinese architecture by following the work of Mr. Yuan Pei-Huang, a senior architect with the Beijing Building Design Institute. Although Ching had traveled to China before, he says conditions there today are radically different.

"Compared to when I went there in 1978, when there was absolutely nothing Western there, everything's changed. You see billboards for Pepsi, Fanta and Coke. There are commercials on TV that almost look like 1950s American commercials," Ching said.

"The people, the clothing — everything's changed. It's working towards a much more capitalistic American society, sort of."

While in China, Ching took time out from his study of architecture to view the

Great Wall, which he described as "the most impressive thing in all of China.

"When you climb to the top and look at the wall, it's just incredible," Ching said.

"It looks like someone took a gigantic piece of rock string and just kind of dropped it down on the ground, because it

hugs every little crack and crevice in the mountains so tightly. It's a very impressive sight."

Ching said he asked people wherever he went if they knew what "fraternity" meant. Despite westernization, none of the Chinese people with whom he talked were familiar with the concept.
