# Message From The ESA

The 1987-1988 fiscal year was an exciting, record breaking year for Sigma Alpha Epsilon....

During the year, five new ΣAE chapters were installed to give the fraternity a total of 200 active chapters for the first time in its long history. And, thanks to an outstanding performance by the fraternity's Extension Advisory Committee, there are yet another ten strong colonies striving to achieve their ΣAE charters.

During the 1987-1988 school year, a record number of 4,360 new brothers were initiated into the bonds of ΣAE. This surpasses the previous record of 4,267 initiates which was set twenty years ago during the 1967-1968 school year. Since our founding in 1856, ΣAE has initiated well over 210,000 brothers; far more total initiates than any of our peers in the fraternity world.

Annual giving to ΣAE during this past year reached an all-time high as 14,000 brothers contributed almost \$1 million to the fraternity. Thanks to the support of these brothers; as attested by the financial

statements contained in this, our annual report; ΣAE ended the fiscal year in an excellent financial position. This outstanding alumni support permits the fraternity to continue and to expand the exemplary programs and projects which continue to keep ΣAE atop of and a recognized leader in the fraternity world.

Yet another record was set when over 600 young men attended the 52nd annual ΣAE Leadership School held in Evanston in August of 1987. The Leadership School continues to broaden and to improve its curriculum to meet the ever changing needs of today's undergraduates, chapter advisors and house corporation members. The ΣAE Leadership School continues to serve as a model for the

leadership training programs of most of our peers in the fraternity world.

The Leadership School, however, is but one example of the many programs in place which reflects the fraternity's commitment to improving the quality of undergraduate life. Emphasis continues to be placed on those programs which strive to improve chapter housing and to educate our brothers in pledge programming, risk management and today's men's health issues.

During this past year, the national fraternity undertook the task of identifying the ΣAE brothers who lost their lives or who are missing in action in the conflict in Viet Nam. To recognize, to remember and to reflect our

fraternal pride in these brothers and in all of the brave brothers who served their country in this conflict, a Viet Nam memorial, an idea conceived by the Portland, Oregon Alumni Association, was dedicated and placed on permanent display in the Levere Memorial Temple during the 1988 Leadership School.

We can all take considerable pride in the successes achieved by Sigma Alpha Epsilon and in the positive direction being taken and the leadership role being assumed by the fraternity. The past and the continued successes realized by ΣAE are a direct result of the exemplary efforts being put forth by our National Office staff and by the outstanding and concerned brothers who selflessly give of their time, their energy and their resources to the fraternity. The Supreme Council and the fraternity as a whole sincerely thank these loyal and dedicated employees and volunteers who have given ... and continue to give ... so much of themselves to making ΣAE what it is today.

# ...A Definition of Zeal

Each year chapters await the announcement of the John O. Moseley Award for Fraternity Zeal. As the days of Leadership School progress the anticipation of the announcement of the winner escalates. On Wednesday, as the Final Banquet of the School nears its conclusion, the Eminent Supreme Archon rises to the podium. As he begins, "Brothers it is now time to present the award you have all been waiting for," a hush falls over the Grand Ballroom of the Orrington Hotel.

"This year's winner in addition to having their name placed on the award plaque displayed in the foyer of the Temple, will receive a plaque for their chapter house and, for the first time, presented by the Portland Alumni association, a bronze statue of the SAE lion."

... and the 1988 winner of the John O. Moseley Award for Fraternity Zeal ... for the third time during the past six years ... the only chapter to win it three times ... Alabama Iota of Birmingham-Southern College, Birmingham, Alabama.

As you approach this liberal arts institution you cannot help but be struck by the impressive formal entrance and wrought iron fence and gates which surround the campus. As you circle among the various colonial style buildings you feel a warmth and quaintness about this institution founded ironically in 1856.

Once at the house, you will find a chapter that is today ninety men strong and has been in continuous existence since 1878. This is a group of men who cherish the opportunities of the Fraternity. They place great value on communication and the chance they have been given to work together for common goals, those being the success of the chapter and each individual.

You will find an SAE involved in almost every facet of the University, from Student Government to academic honoraries.

Their chapter programs have developed through the years to meet the challenges of the changing campus, Greek system, community and, most importantly, the needs of its members.

Scholarship ranks of the utmost importance, realizing that when you take pride in your education and strive to meet your potential it has a direct influence on the attitude, involvement and dedication of each brother.

Over the course of the past three years alone, Alabama Iota has been at or near the top of their Greek System academically, ranging from a 3.0 to a 3.2 chapter average. They have well-organized incentive programming, tutoring services, scholastic awards and in addition to minimum initiation requirements, must maintain a 2.5 GPA to run for or hold office.

Each brother has an impeccable knowledge of chapter operations which begins in their pledge education program. Void of hazing they stress total chapter participation, learning everything from history to National Laws, Chapter Bylaws, office responsibilities and issues which affect today's students. It is their desire to teach these new young members everything there is to know about the fraternity, so that upon initiation they are fully prepared to assume a leadership roll. The concentration and purpose of their program is the

development of good brothers, not good pledges.

In the Birmingham Community they have spent countless hours working with groups such as the Muscular Dystrophy Association, the Junior League of Birmingham, local orphanages and various campus programs. Most notably, each Monday evening a team of big and little brothers spends the night at a men's homeless shelter. There they serve food, wash clothes and spend time conversing with these gentlemen in the hopes of offering them simple kindness.

Brothers demonstrate a thorough working knowledge of the Ritual. This past year they invested a great deal of time and effort in the restoration of a room, to be used, both as a safeguard for their equipment and to provide an atmosphere to emphasize the meaning and importance of the ideals of the Fraternity.

In February of each year the chapter conducts its annual initiation ceremony. Early on a Friday evening they travel to the outskirts of Birmingham to the home of an alumnus. A candlelit path through the woods on the land of this brother leads them to a clearing. Here under the stars is where the neophytes of Alabama Iota first learn the meaning of the Fraternity and become initiated brothers.

Yet beyond the daily operations of this chapter and their ability to challenge themselves with new and creative ideas, it is the commitment they have to the Fraternity and one another that emphasizes the cohesiveness and trust among them.

They place extreme value on the time they have to spend together. They are quick to challenge each other to become involved both on campus and in the chapter and are not hesitant about offering advice or constructive criticism. They are never hindered in their ability to offer a helping hand or to express their emotions regarding each other. They simply never take a moment for granted.

At the same time, they are certainly not without frustrations, obstacles or differing opinions, but it is the manner in which they handle these situations that speaks quite highly of them. They have the uncanny ability to find value in others opinions, no matter how far they

may stray from their own. Their ability to learn from their mistakes, and develop and implement ideas to fit their needs is outstanding. They comprise a rare quality to look past the black and white of an issue and discover a full-color picture.

It is important to note that although they have won this award twice before, 1983, 1984, the undergraduates who comprise the chapter today were not yet even enrolled as college students, therefore attesting to the level of communication they have attained and signifying their effectiveness in teaching, organizing and conveying the ideals of SAE on a long term basis.

At a recent Province Epsilon Convention, a group of undergraduates from the chapter were asked by another group:

"What is the secret to your success?"

Their response:

"First, we care about one another and we love each other. Additionally, we have learned that we can apply the knowledge we gain in the classroom from courses such as management to the daily operations of our chapter. Yet, most importantly we will not allow ourselves to be caught in tradition. We will not dispute the value of some traditions; however, you must keep them in perspective. The only tradition we have at Alabama Iota is the tradition of change; we will not settle one year for what we know we can do better the next."



# Kansas State Celebrates Diamond Jubilee

More than 450 brothers, wives and active members of Sigma Alpha Epsilon gathered in Manhattan, Kansas for a gala weekend March 25-27, 1988 to observe the 75th Anniversary of their Kansas State chapter. A highlight of the celebration at the Saturday night banquet was the honoring of Byron Taylor, Class of 1916 and the only surviving founder member of Kansas Beta Chapter, with a special plaque presented by ESA Ben Allen.

Brother Taylor and his wife, Nettie, attend almost every alumni function — he even enjoys a few turns on the dance floor, particularly when the SAE's "theme song" **Violets** is played. He also freely admits to frequently singing a few bars at home and reminices, "We had a quartet that could really sing that song; it made your heart swell and you felt mighty proud."

Other items on the agenda were golf, flag football, pledge class reunions, a combined undergraduate/alumni "chapter" meeting, a ladies' fashion show, a dance, and a bus tour of the city and campus with stops at Bramlage Coliseum and Town Center Mall.

Since the chartering of Kansas Beta in 1913 with a class of 27, there have been 1,540 inductees. Seventy members now occupy the chapter house.

Many prominent members, now deceased, include Milton Eisenhower, Evan and Tom Griffith, Alvin Hostetler, Vance Washington and the four Wareham brothers, Harry, Blake, Ralph and Everett.

Preliminary plans for an addition to the chapter house were unveiled with fundraising activity scheduled to commence during the 1988-89 school year.

## Ralleye Fever

Driving through 8,500 dangerous and barren miles, in which you often must create your own path hardly sounds like an enjoyable undertaking. But to three adventurous brothers from Boston, competing in the Trans-Amazon Road Ralleye, it was an exhilarating experience.

The race first captured the interest of Jeff Brand, Boston '87 (Beta-Upsilon), Mark Hughes '87, and Joe Phillips '86, last October, when they noticed an ad for it in a magazine. By December they had already bought a Toyota Land Cruiser for the April 21st-May 6th event.

Straight from the factory, the car was far from ready to take on the world's toughest road ralleye course, spanning from Cartagena, Colombia to Buenos Aires, Argentina. The three men had to send the car to get modified in Alabama, the nearest place that could undertake the job of suiting car to course. Roll bars, special seat belts, and an 80-gallon fuel cell were among the equipment added to the Land Cruiser. After driving it to New Orleans, they shipped the car to Colombia.

Their diligent preparation did little to make the race a comfortable experience, though. When a group of competitors drove off a cliff to their deaths on the first night, it served as a reminder that intense concentration was a must. The course would not relent as six of the top ten finishers rolled at least once and, by the end of the race, only 14 out of 88 teams were still running. And by that time, those still left were exhausted.

An average day consisted of driving through trees and ditches from 7:00 AM until midnight, with only an occasional town or city providing a real path

on which to drive. When they reached each night's destination, another hour or two was spent making what repairs they could on their beat-up car. Navigator Hughes had to combat a broken odometer and at least a flat a day to direct the Boston team. Most nights were spent sleeping in tents or downtrodden hotels, but the rest was welcome following the intense days.

The race was not all treachery, however, to which their gratification attests. In a continent where soccer and road ralleys are the two most popular sports, "we were treated like heroes," Hughes said. "We also met a lot of interesting, quality people." Indeed, when their suspension literally was on the ground less than a week into the race, the three Americans thought their journey was over. But a mechanic at the only service station for miles spent hours repairing their car, while the three men were treated to refreshments. Another memorable experience was blasting rock and reggae music to the thousands of appreciative

onlookers that lined the streets of towns and cities. The music was supplied courtesy of Bose Stereo Equipment, one of the team's sponsors.

Lining up sponsors actually proved to be one of their most difficult tasks. Convincing a company to sponsor three first-time competitors in a race that, without definite skill and some luck, could end in a day, is not easy.

But when all was said and done, the sponsors had their money's worth, and Brand, Hughes, and Phillips had surpassed all of their expectations. Finishing 12th in a field of competitors that included several previous champions, and 7th in their class, was a satisfying feeling for the three men.

But though they were happy even to finish, don't expect them to stick with the real estate development business in which they are partners for 365 days a year. "We plan on doing at least one of these a year," Brand proclaimed. "We've got the ralleye fever."



## Alumni Reminded of The Record Circulation Policy

The National Convention of the fraternity voted in 1981 to change the circulation policy of *The Record* due to the high costs of paper, printing and mailing.

The current policy allows a brother to automatically receive each quarterly issue of the magazine until his initiation class has been out of college five years.

Thereafter, an alumnus will receive only the Annual Report issue each winter, unless he contributes a minimum of \$10 annually to the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation. Once a brother's total support reaches \$100, he will receive the magazine quarterly for life.

Brothers who would like to receive the magazine quarterly, may send a contribution of \$10 or more to the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation, P.O. Box 1856, Evanston, IL 60204. All foundation contributions are tax-deductible and will appear on the member's giving record.

# Leadership '88

Since the birth of SAE's Leadership School in 1935, year after year delegates and faculty alike have praised the program as a driving force in their commitment to the fraternity. Each year seems to bring comments referring to the most recent School as "the best ever." A comparison between the 1st and 53rd Leadership Schools, however, would be difficult to make; although the basic purpose has remained the same, changing times bring new issues and distinct character. While the 498 delegates, 37 faculty members, 25 Province Archons, 23 Chapter Advisors, and 13 House Corporation Officers attending the 1988 Leadership School spent numerous hours discussing the matters of the fraternity, perhaps the most valuable experience was learning about a wide array of men with different backgrounds and lifestyles, but all with a common interest in SAE.

A talk with Eminent Supreme Archon Ben Allen, at his 10th School, revealed his thoughts on this class: "These young men comprise the most thoughtful, in attune, devoted group I've ever seen at Leadership School." They had good reason to take a particularly strong interest in the program, as 1988 brought serious issues into the spotlight. Foremost of these is the Risk Management Program. With increasing liability suits being brought against fraternities, a goal of this program is to compel the chapters to use more care when dealing with alcohol. The fundamental message, Allen said, is that the responsibility should lie with "the individual who is drinking. You should be responsible for yourself—not the chapter or national." Although the program is not necessarily looked upon favorably by the undergraduates, "they understand the reasons for it."

On a more broad scale, this year's School dealt with problem-solving methods — "how to identify problems and challenges, and formulate strategies," according to Jay DeWitt, SAE's Director of Educational Programs. Working on his 3rd Leadership School, DeWitt said that "this crowd seems more serious about getting the most out of the program. They're really taking advantage of it." The program included group meetings, sing-alongs, awards presentations, seminars,

and other activities aimed not only at strengthening fraternal commitment but encouraging each delegate to explore and gain insight into his own life.





Certainly one of the most moving occasions of the four days was the Dedication of the Viet Nam Memorial, a bust contributed by the Portland Alumni Association in memory of the many SAEs who died in the conflict. The Dedication took place in a Chapel overflowing with concerned brothers who listened intently to Father Robert Hedges and Immediate Past ESA J. Clarke Houston, III, despite the suffocating heat and humidity generated by the crowded setting. Pictures of Houston, who himself served as a Company Commander in the USMC in Viet Nam from May 1967 to June 1968, served as the sculptor's model for the bust. The Captain's emotional attachment to those who served in the war was evident in his speech, which described the Viet Nam years as an "intense period of introspection for the United States. These brothers [who served] are just like you, but responded to the ultimate challenge." Following the dedication and unveiling of the bust, Father Hedges invited brothers to take the stand and remember all dead brothers. Delegates then filed out of the Chapel quietly, with the memory of the service having created a contemplative mood.

"The Viet Nam Memorial Dedication and the Model Initiation will definitely

be two of the most memorable events of the week," said Troy Means, **Southern California '90**, and John Harper, **Southern Methodist '89**. Indeed, just the experience of being at the National Office in itself was an important one for the undergraduates. "I've waited four years to get here," said Scott Barrier, **Townson State '89**, "and I'm learning that we have an incredible support structure here at National." Another aspect of the National Headquarters that made the visit so special was the opportunity to "soak up the history of the fraternity."

But the August 14th-17th School did not entirely fill up the days with planned events, and brothers also spent time exploring Lake Michigan, the Northwestern campus, Evanston, and Chicago. Any free time was welcome, particularly since much of the time the delegates and faculty had to endure a 110-degree heat index in coat and tie. Though most of the men agreed that they would miss the School when it ended, they unanimously agreed "we're not gonna miss the heat."



But several brave SAEs found themselves at the starting line of Minerva's 8th Annual Highway Run at 7:00 one morning. They were described as "crazy" by those who chose not to participate. Trips to Chicago on the 'El,' of which the air-conditioning system is quite suspect, would have to be extremely rewarding to be worth the ride. One brother said in passing, "I wouldn't get back on that 'El' if you paid me!" Some of the men found it more beneficial just to sit in their dorm rooms and fan themselves while they talked and became better acquainted with other brothers. A few cooled off by visiting dorm counselors and faculty who were lucky enough to stay in an air-conditioned dorm, while others found Lake Michigan to be a welcome relief.



The end of Leadership School brought mixed emotions from most who, excited by what they had learned, were still eager to stay for more. Despite the wide variance of geographical areas represented by the delegates, the common goals shared made this year's group a very close-knit one. Barrier was particularly touched by the tremendous sense of fellowship. "It has been very easy for me to meet many brothers," he said, "but unfortunately, it's such a rare opportunity for so few."

Which brings up another important issue: With the Leadership School Delegates being among the most motivated men in their chapters, how smoothly will their experiences at the School be translated into overall improvement of each chapter? The answers to that question will not come easily, but most agree with ESA Allen — that "those who want to improve their chapters can," and the delegates at the School can show them ways to do so. Hopefully, their newly discovered image of the National fraternity will help to show their chapter members that SAE is not limited to their corner of the world. In that way, each individual improvement can be an improvement for thousands of brothers from all over.

# THE FRATERNITY IN 1988

## LIVING THE GOOD OLD DAYS!

Remember the good old days when fraternity life was fun. When those twenties were roaring and fifties carefree. We didn't seem to have all the problems we have today. Sure, they were good old days. SAE men practiced the fraternity ideal just as they do today. Just what makes for good old days? Is it what we care to remember; the memories of friendships we cherished? Do we forget the wars and depressions that provided the setting for our experiences? Do we forget the charges of bigotry, hazing and boozing encountered since the earliest days of the fraternity movement? (Not all the charges are groundless.)

### Today, the headlines seem more prevalent and the public cries more strident.

---

But as we take a good look at our past and present we have cause to be optimistic about our future. We go through tough times, most recently in the early 1970's. We have come a long way since then. These are good times.

I spoke with a brother in San Francisco last week. The recent bad press about several SAE chapters, including his own, upset him greatly. He wondered aloud whether we could survive it all. I tried to reassure him that SAE would survive because the fraternity faces its problems head on. His chapter will come out of it stronger and better. We get angry about the headlines and the talk shows and the constant barrage of bad press. But if that's what it takes to make us deal with our problems, then bring on Geraldo and Oprah and Phil. We must get angry enough to do something about the causes.

Fraternities are vulnerable because they are so easily identified. But we are a part of the world and if you look seriously at the world, fraternity, with all its faults, is without question one of its better parts.

---

### This is a good time to reaffirm and celebrate our fraternity ideals!

---

We see fraternity men who care not only for each other but for people beyond their doors. Our young brothers are becoming true gentlemen in the best sense. They work, study, play and learn to be better people — together! They make mistakes together. They live hard! But the goal is the same as it has always been — to make and keep friends — and that makes us better.

---

### As always, a few perpetrate the bad about Fraternity.

---

Most SAE active brothers are solid citizens who strive to live up to the ideals of our founders. For the few who will not, SAE continues to make some hard decisions. Our mission as a fraternity is to provoke thought and careful consideration of what is right. A few don't take to the message too well at first, but they come around when they realize how much better life can be. Some don't ever come around so we go on without them. Decisions are not lightly made. We follow due process. We carry out our mission with compassion. Unfortunately, good and innocent men sometimes get lost in the process. But in the end a quality experience is the reward for those who seek and pursue the truth. Not to be overdramatic, but careers and lives are saved.

---

### 1988 was a remarkable year! The emphasis on LIVING OUR IDEALS is perhaps greater than at any other time in our history.

---

There has been a lot of talk and a lot of action, which we hope to show in this annual report. Statistically, SAE has never been in better shape, and the intangible qualities look good too!

Steady growth and prosperity mark 1988. Sigma Alpha Epsilon surpassed its previous high number of new brothers for a given year by initiating 4,288 men. Our growth in number of members and chapters continues steady and sure. Eminent Supreme Archon Ben Allen installed five new chapters. We created eight new colonies. Our financial position is stable despite stock market gyrations. The National Staff was enhanced with the addition of a RISK MANAGER. Many worrisome chapter situations have significantly improved. The 53rd Leadership School was held last August 14-17 for delegates from 169 chapters and 11 colonies. (See related story.)

We have made significant progress on our five-year administrative plan, now in its final year. We continue to strive to provide quality programs and timely service to our members with enthusiasm, pride and care.

---

### SAE established policies designed to safeguard and improve fraternity life.

---

Chapters may no longer purchase alcoholic beverages with chapter funds, rush must be conducted without booze, and parties must be closed to those without specific invitations. These so-called risk reduction policies appear to be effective. There have been pockets of resistance but the policies get carried out with courage and conviction because, to many undergraduates, they make a lot of sense.

---

### Chapter Development staff works to improve chapter life

---

By November of 1988, 200 active chapters graced our rolls; the highest number in our history. Sadly, the charter of Illinois Gamma (Northern Illinois University) was surrendered because of a lack of members. Hazing and alcohol abuse continue to be our leading problems. The National Fraternity, through its field staff and volunteers, aggressively aid chapters in dealing with these problems and improving chapter standards. As of November 1988, there were nine active chapters under Alumni Commission and eight chapters on probation.

Under the auspices of a Commission of Alumni, chapters are reorganized without having their charter suspended.

Alabama Mu (University of Alabama): The Alumni Commission at Alabama continues to do a good job reorganizing the mother chapter. We experienced a setback last April when two active members were arrested for drug trafficking. The commission determined that no other members knew of these activities. The chapter decided to have their members submit to drug testing to insure that none of the remaining members are involved with drugs. Despite this decision, the University suspended recognition of the chapter and the brothers had to vacate the chapter house until May of 1990. University officials, parents and alumni are working to rebuild the chapter and improve its programming. We are confident we have the right man to build a fine chapter. The chapter size was cut from near 100 last year to 40 men this Fall.

Mississippi Gamma (University of Mississippi): The University of Mississippi suspended the chapter's recognition as a student organization as a result of many university policy violations. In conjunction, the Supreme Council transferred the charter to a Commission of Alumni in October 1988. Under the leadership of the Alumni Commission and National Staff the chapter will be completely reorganized. Through an interview process, a core group of men from the former chapter will be selected to begin rebuilding immediately.

## Several chapters undergo reorganization

Similar rebuilding programs are in progress at California Kappa at the University of California-Davis, Oregon Beta at the University of Oregon, and Colo-

rado Zeta at Denver University.

Two former chapters are being reorganized independent of the National Fraternity. However, members of the national staff are helping the alumni.

California Gamma (University of Southern California): The chapter closed after many serious disciplinary problems in December of 1986. The alumni recruited a new group of students in 1987 and have worked hard to rebuild this once fine chapter. We anticipate restoring the charter in early 1989.

Georgia Psi (Mercer University): Because of conduct unbecoming a true gentleman the chapter closed in the fall of 1986 and is yet to be rechartered. Progress was slow as the alumni worked with the old members. As new men came into the group, progress improved. Although they have many goals yet to achieve, we are confident that they will continue to make positive strides and regain their chapter by the end of 1989 or early 1990.



We have eleven colonies, giving us a total of 211 campus groups. To be a dynamic organization we must continue to

grow, and several new institutions are targeted for colonization. Brian McCrae recently replaced Brad as Extension Director. George Ilse, Syracuse '50, is Chairman of the Extension Advisory Committee.

## Over 100 brothers have served in the field

Since Billy Levere took to the road in 1910, 103 men have served in the field for ΣAE. Last Summer Steve Matthews came on board as Consultant number 100. Although without peer, Billy could only visit about half the chapters in a given year. All chapters received visits by an Educational & Leadership Consultant last year.

The field staff under the direction of Scott Haggard has done outstanding work in the area of Chapter Development. Working with Scott is Mike Sopher, who serves as Assistant Director of Chapter Development. Field staff members include: Fritz Kruger, Puget Sound '87, Stephen W. Matthews, Cal-Irvine '88, Tyler F. Terry, Arizona '88, Christopher J. Littlefield, Arizona '88, Michael R. Tarbet, North Texas '88, and Brian McCrae, New Mexico State '88, who serves as Extension Director. After noteworthy service Brad Cohen, Todd Mullins, and Steve Cady left the staff last summer.

We appreciate the work of the Province officers in the area of chapter development. Several provinces held outstanding leadership schools during the biennium and reached hundreds of ΣAE undergraduates with a leadership training experience.

## Service to Alumni receives new emphasis

The Director of Alumni Services is Tom McCarthy, Northern Arizona '82. Richard Hopple, Cincinnati '70 serves as chairman of the Alumni Services Committee. In addition to services designed to assist Alumni Associations, several programs that benefit alumni support groups have been conducted. Twenty-three alumni participated in the 53rd Leadership School Chapter Advisors Program. Since its inception in 1978, over 170 advisors have participated in this invaluable training program.

Alumni activity was very high this year as over 100 Alumni Associations reported successful activities. We have provided a consulting service for Alumni Associations through the Permanent Committees on Alumni Services. We published several issues of ΣAE ALUMNUS. Other programs include the T.H.E. Awards program, alumni awards, promotion of Founder's Day activities, the 50-year Certificate program, and the Alumni News section of *The Record*.

## SAE hires a Risk Manager

John Perkins, Western Kentucky '81, is Risk Manager and Director of Housing. Tom Devine, Minnesota '74, is chairman of the Risk Management Committee and David Covert, West Florida '71, serves as chairman of the Permanent Committee on Chapter Housing. John manages the Risk Management Program, designed to reduce risk and handle claims and suits as reported to the fraternity. We provide risk management help through written materials, consultations, speakers, and video tapes, and by distributing "Fraternal Law" to House Corporation Presidents, Chapter Advisors and Eminent Archons.

Besides the Risk Management Program, we continue to arrange for multi-million first dollar liability insurance coverage to Chapters and House Corporations across the country. We do this because very few chapters have had success in obtaining liability insurance on their own.

We have worked on fundraising plans for house renovations with several indi-

vidual House Corporations. This continues a stance recognizing that many chapters need major renovations or house replacement and that we should aid them in their fundraising efforts.

ΣAE started a new national training program for House Corporation Officers at the 51st Leadership School and over 50 alumni brothers have now participated in this valuable training program including 12 last summer. This program, along with existing training programs for Chapter Advisors and Province Officers, will have a far reaching affect on the quality of chapters in the future.

Beyond training programs at the ΣAE National Leadership School, the fraternity started a regional House Corporation Officers Training Program in 1987. We turned the program over to the National Interfraternity Conference in 1988 and they have conducted seven very well attended regional programs. The program remains under the inspired leadership of ΣAE brother Tom Devine, Minnesota '74.

## Administrative staff keep it together

The day-to-day functioning of the National Office is under the able direction of Assistant Executive Director Jeff Arnold. Jeff directs the maintenance of the buildings and the financial administration of the fraternity and foundation. He supervises the Risk Management Program. He serves as staff liaison for the Board of Trustees of the National Endowment Fund, the Advisory Council of the Foundation, the Temple Building Committee, and the National Laws Committee.

The National Office staff consists of 17 very dedicated and loyal full-time employees and several students who work part-time. We produce many publications including *The Record* and the *Phi Alpha*.

## If these are the good old days, the future is bright, but who has a crystal ball?

Good ΣAEs build on their glorious past and provide leadership in preparing for the future. We have always looked

ahead and with these good times comes the responsibility to work hard for future success. No one knows when the next "bad times" will come.

In 1989, we will continue to study the province structure in an effort to make it more responsive to the needs of our undergraduates and to the alumni who work with them.

The Province Redistricting Committee chaired by G. Robert Hamrdla, Stanford '60, will report its recommendations. New programs to help our members understand and LIVE the values and purposes of fraternity will be researched and developed. Ritual Committee Chairman Todd Dickinson, Allegheny '72, and his committee have been working on a new printing of The Ritual. A network of ritual counselors will be started throughout the realm next year. Work continues on the Computers in Chapters Program. Future housing needs will be assessed and programs developed to meet those needs. Continued emphasis on academic success will be a top priority. Leadership development will be enhanced through new support for regional leadership training programs to augment the work of the National Leadership School.

Leadership is the key as we continue to study the trends and face the issues that confront us as fraternity men. Loren Boone, South Dakota State '73, chairs a committee to study pledge programming.

## ΣAE will be taking a hard look at the current trend among fraternities to eliminate pledging and little sisters

Many believe that the very status of being a pledge promotes hazing and leads to so many deaths and injuries. Many believe that little sisters groups are sexist and degrading to women. ΣAE has the courage to consider ending pledging and little sisters. As a democratic organization the views of all will be heard and the decision of the majority will prevail.

Our gratitude goes to all permanent and ad hoc committee chairmen and members whose support and guidance are of great importance to the progress of Sigma Alpha Epsilon. The names and



# THE SIGMA ALPHA EPSILON FOUNDATION

The Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation is a public not-for-profit corporation, chartered by the State of Illinois to provide for educational programming for the benefit of members of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity.

## Purposes & Functions

- Maintain the Levere Memorial Temple
- Hold funds in trust for individual chapters
- Provide student loans, various scholarships, fellowships, internships
- Funding of Leadership School
- Provide Men's Health Programs such as Alcohol & Drug Abuse

## Foundation Finances & Operations

The financial position of the Foundation is stable. However, even though revenues continue to increase, expenses seem to be increasing even faster. Demands on the Foundation's funds have been intense, especially for building maintenance and the funding of the capital campaign.

The data processing staff has embarked on an aggressive campaign to find lost brothers. We now communicate with every college where we have a chapter, as well as with chapters, alumni associations and house corporations. All members are urged to send us address changes as they are received.

## The Levere Memorial Temple

We have now retained an architect to advise the Building Committee on conditions and concerns. The position of Artist of the Temple has been filled by John March.

## Foundation Programs

Jay B. DeWitt assumed responsibilities as the Director of Educational Programs in May of 1988, after serving two years as an Educational & Leadership Consultant.

Programs include: scholarships, resident educational advisors, career planning, men's health issues, and video productions. Jay serves as liaison with Dr. Tom Goodale, Educational Advisor; Darrell Gibson, Director of Leadership Training; and Father Bob Hedges, chairman of the Men's Health Issues Committee.

Over \$47,053 in fiscal '88 was allocated toward Chapter House Library Grants to assist in the building or renovation of chapter library and/or study facilities. A temporary freeze was put on this program until the IRS clarified its stand on such building fund allocations. The program, with some modifications, is now back in operation.

We are especially excited about the plans of the Men's Health Issues Committee chaired by Father Robert Hedges, **Drake '51**. The committee provides assistance to chapters of Sigma Alpha Epsilon on a broad range of health problems affecting college men. The committee has created educational modules on subjects such as alcohol and drug abuse, acquaintance rape, and quality of brotherhood. These modules will be available for chapters to use in early 1989. The committee also provides resources such as speakers, written materials and video tape productions. Video tape programs are already available including such topics as Young Men's Sexual responsibility, Reproductive Health, Cancer, A.I.D.S., and Legal Liability. More tapes are being planned.

An \$80,000 grant was provided to support the SAE National Leadership School.

\$2,000 grants were provided to eight Resident Educational Advisors

who were sponsored by eight chapters of Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity.

Thirty-three student loans of approximately \$59,700 were provided to undergraduate and graduate student members of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity.

We provided \$8,000 in Scholarship grants to the outstanding scholars of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity. The Jones-Laurence Award for the Outstanding Scholar in SAE was given to David Magilner, **Dartmouth '88**, who received a \$3,500 scholarship. Runners-up included Iain Penny, **Central Florida '89** and Mario Quieroz, **Stanford '88**. Each received a \$500 scholarship.

The first recipient of the Dr. Charles A. Preuss Medical School Scholarship was Hans Carlsson, **Oregon Gamma and Alpha '89**.

The Foundation has available a very fine video tape program, "Passing the Torch," on the Levere Memorial Temple produced in 1985. The one-hour tape is on sale for \$39.00.

Other programs include an instructional notebook for Province Leadership Schools and the production of Educational Video Tapes with the recently completed video studio.

Through an anonymous gift received in May 1987, so far \$50,000 has been received toward a \$100,000 anonymous gift pledge toward the construction of a video studio which is now under construction in the Levere Memorial Temple.

## Annual Fund

For the 1987-88 Annual Fund year, we received \$400,200 in contributions, from 8,116 donors. We had over 500 first-time donors for this year. Due to the success of the capital campaign, our numbers are down from last year's all time high;

however, our response and donations from our Founder and Society Members have increased. The 1988-89 Annual Fund year is just beginning and the Founder and Society members response is extremely encouraging and very generous.

In the past fiscal year, 195 brothers became new Founder Members. We are closing in on Founder Member number 1856, and from our projections we anticipate Founder Member number 1856 will be issued in June of 1989. The number will be assigned on a random basis, and will not be held for any individual member.

**THE ANNUAL FUND PROVIDES ABOUT 50% OF OUR OPERATING COSTS; THEREFORE THE SURVIVAL OF THE FOUNDATION IS DEPENDENT UPON THE ANNUAL FUND. THE CAMPAIGN FOR SAE MUST NOT DIMINISH THE IMPORTANCE OF THE ANNUAL FUND.**

At the same time we are planning for the future, current programs need funding. Each year it is the alumni support to the Annual Fund that allows the Foundation to conduct that year's programs in the areas of alcohol and substance abuse education, and resident educational advisors.

Support to the Annual Fund was down 20% this past year, due in part to The Campaign for SAE and changes in the tax laws. There has been frustration within the Foundation caused by the inability to fund all of the programs we wish to implement. Until funds are available, some programs will have to wait.

We are excited about the future and the promise of many exciting new programs and services that will come to fruition as a result of the generous gifts and bequests to The Campaign for SAE, but we still need alumni support of the Annual Fund for today's efforts.

## *Development*

As of November 1988, alumni have pledged \$6.8 million to The Campaign for SAE: The Path to Leadership. A large portion of these commitments have come from a

handful of loyal alumni through cash gifts and bequests.

Several thousand alumni have also made generous commitments when they were called. We will be calling 10,000 more alumni this spring. It is our hope that we can announce the successful conclusion of the Campaign at the Cincinnati National Convention in June.

The Campaign for SAE is to create endowment funds to ensure the future of programs such as Leadership School, provide student loans and scholarships, to be able to make loans to house corporations, and to preserve The Levere Memorial Temple.

When called upon, we hope you will join in our efforts to guarantee the long-range future of SAE.

## *Scholarship Funds*

Part of the efforts of the Foundation Development Staff is to encourage the creation of endowed scholarships for chapters or professions. Dr. Charles Preuss has created an endowed scholarship for medical school students. Several chapters have been the beneficiaries of generous gifts to the Foundation for the creation of endowed scholarship funds to reward and recognize individuals who have shown excellence in leadership and academic efforts.

These scholarship funds are a great way to support your chapter and help undergraduates achieve their dreams.

One of the principal services of the Foundation is to act as trustee for chapter funds which are created through the generosity of a chapter's alumni. New Chapter Scholarship Endowment funds were created for chapter University and Bucknell University. A Student Loan Fund was created for a Kansas University Chapter.

Incidentally, house corporations will be able to borrow from the principal of such funds for the purpose of a chapter's house improvements.

## *Leadership School Endowment Funds*

In the belief that the Leadership School experience is a valuable opportunity for undergraduates, some alumni have created endowed scholarships which will provide funds to pay the registration fees for brothers from their chapter. A Leadership School Endowment Fund can start providing grants once it reaches \$5,000.

Within the past year, we have almost doubled the number of chapters that have Leadership School Endowment Funds. The chapters are: Troy State (ALEP), Miami (FLAL), Simpson College (IASI), Idaho (IDAL), Kansas State (KSBE), Southern Mississippi (MSSI), Washington University (MOBE), Eastern New Mexico University (NMAL), Ohio State (OHTH), Oklahoma (OKKA), South Dakota (SDSI), Tennessee (TNKA), Washington (WAAL), Puget Sound (WAGA), Province Eta, Central Florida Alumni Association, and the San Francisco Alumni Association.

\$29,080 was received from donors for tuition scholarships to individual delegates to attend the 53rd Leadership School.

## *Bequests*

The Foundation continues to be the beneficiary of a number of bequests each year. See chart for list of specific gifts.

We are very excited about the future and the promise of many exciting new programs and services as a result of the generous gifts and bequests that will be generated by the capital campaign.

AFTER THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN, THE FOUNDATION WILL TURN ITS EFFORTS TOWARD HELPING CHAPTERS WITH THEIR FUND RAISING.

Once the capital campaign is over, the Trustees have determined that our thrust will be to assist chapters in the development of fund raising campaigns for scholarships and housing purposes.

# Foundation Supports Scholars

## Hummel Scholarship

Michael E. Carley and Robert G. Pivarnik are the recipients of the Lt. Fred E. Hummel, Jr. Scholarship for the 1988-89 school year.

Carley, a Junior, is majoring in Biology and Psychology. He is involved extensively in campus activities and in the leadership of The College of William & Mary chapter. Pivarnik is a repeat winner of the scholarship. Robert is majoring in history and hopes to ultimately become a professor of History in tertiary education after graduation this spring.

The Hummel Scholarship is established solely for SAEs attending The College of William and Mary. The Hummel Scholarship is awarded annually in memory of Lt. Fred E. Hummel, Jr. of the college's class of '48, who was killed while serving his country. The scholarship awards \$1500.00.

## James Peterson Award

This award for achievement in scholarship, named for the late Past Eminent Supreme Archon, James Peterson, **Minnesota** '57, is administered by the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation. 


## **A Triple for West Virginia Alpha**

### Katherine C. Woods

Katherine Condon Woods, the Grand Lady of Oklahoma Mu at Oklahoma State University, passed away quietly on Monday, July 4, 1988 after a brief illness.

She became housemother for Chi Beta in 1924 before it was chartered as Oklahoma Mu, a chapter of Sigma Alpha Epsilon. She gave strong encouragement to the chapter in its efforts to affiliate with SAE and provided strength and devotion to Oklahoma Mu until the time of her death, a period of time spanning 64 years.

It is doubtful that any chapter of any national fraternity in the United States has reaped the benefit of a long lifetime of commitment and service such as that rendered to Oklahoma Mu by "Mom" Katherine Woods. SAE was the focus of her life; she provided a continuity between generations, serving as "Mom" to the sons of her boys, then to their grandsons, and even to their great-grandsons. With her remarkable memory and the obvious love she felt for "her sons," every pledge class up to the spring pledges of 1988 has found pleasure and a deep appreciation of the meaning of fraternity through time spent with her. A day never went by without a visit to her from an active or pledge, and her mailbox was always generously supplied with letters from her many sons who felt her love and influence in their lives and kept in communication with her regularly. One of the side benefits of this mutual affection between Mom Woods and hundreds of Oklahoma Mu alumni was a current report shared by Mom Woods through the chapter newsletter of everyone's news and activities. Oklahoma Mu has grown from the small charter class to a chapter with over 1,400 alumni, and Mom Woods knew and loved them all.

Keeping communications flowing in her SAE family was one of the many significant contributions Mom Woods made to Oklahoma Mu. During World War II when the chapter house had to close temporarily, Mom Woods started a newsletter which she continued on a monthly basis throughout the entire war. These letters gave news to the brothers in the service of where other brothers were serving and personal news from each of them. Numerous joyful reunions of the sons of Oklahoma Mu in the far corners of the world were made possible because of Mom Woods' newsletters, and those unable to meet with the brothers were warmed by the news lovingly forwarded to them by Mom Woods.

Chapter history was another major contribution made by Katherine Woods. Her memory was remarkable to the day she died, and she was the chapter's living history book. As the years passed she kept many



chapter treasures and souvenirs of special events which she turned over to alumni interested in compiling the history of Oklahoma Mu.

By far the most significant contribution of Katherine Woods to Sigma Alpha Epsilon, however, was her deep love for the fraternity and for each person with whom she shared her life during those 64 years of fraternity service. The outpouring of love she enjoyed through these many decades from large numbers of actives, alumni and parents lends testimony to the selfless life she lived, centered around Oklahoma Mu. Nowhere was this felt more than at her memorial service when the large numbers of brothers, spanning several generations, joined together in singing "Friends," for Mom, one last time.

We shall miss her.

July 4, 1988 Mom Woods passed away in Stillwater and is interred in the Prairie View Cemetery in Macomb, Oklahoma.

# JAY COOK PRICE 1963-1988

"He was a brother, a friend and a man who would go out of his way to do anything that was asked of him" ... "He was big and burly, but as friendly as anyone you'd ever want to meet" ... "When Jay and I would make a trip to the store for a pack of gum, Jay would have to stop and talk to everyone, making that trip an all-day affair" ... "Jay was a great asset to the fraternity; any job that needed to get done, Jay did, no questions asked" ... "We used to tease him around the house that it wasn't football that hurt his bad knee but it was standing up every time a lady entered the room — that's how mannerly he was" ... "If anyone exemplified a true gentleman, it was Jay." These remarks, and many others were expressed as Jay Price's many friends paid him their last respects.

Brother Jay, of Aztec, New Mexico, a junior at Eastern New Mexico University, had come to play football but suffered a knee injury which required surgery and put an end to his dream of playing for the Greyhounds.

Jay died on October 30, 1988 from a

small-caliber bullet wound to his chest after an altercation with three Clovis, New Mexico non-Greeks who were refused entry to a private SAE house party. He and his fraternity brother, Kevin Shaughnessy, of Dayton, Ohio, who were checking IDs at the door, advised the intruders that it was a private party but they refused to leave the premises. Other members became involved in the confrontation, and as Jay and Kevin attempted to return the members indoors, they were both shot by the suspects who then fled by car. Although the two injured brothers were rushed to the hospital, Jay was pronounced dead on arrival. Brother Shaughnessy was listed in good condition, after being wounded in the right buttock.

Jay is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Joe Price of Aztec, who both attended Eastern New Mexico University; a brother, John; and a sister, Jana. A scholarship fund in Jay's name has been established and contributions may be sent to the Office of Development at ENMU.




A native of Springhill, Louisiana, Brother Williamson did post graduate work as a






