# Communicating Change



s I reflect on my first eight months as your Eminent Supreme Archon, there is so much to tell. Past issues of The Record shared the rapid pace of change on campuses. Our fraternity is keeping pace with these changes through major modifications to our structure. Our path for change was identified through our eight-month strategic-planning process, involving an 18-brother steering committee and more than 100 interviews; our strategic plan, "2006...and Beyond," was adopted by our 145th Anniversary Convention in Orlando. The magnitude of change is immense and it is my top priority to communicate these changes.

The Supreme Council contains two new members, Ron Thiesen and Marty Wiglesworth, who provide new views and unique experiences. Staff changes within the Fraternity Service Center include hiring a chief financial officer and four assistant executive directors and one director following the elimination of the Educational and Leadership Consultant program. The Fraternity Endowment Fund is transforming into SAE Services, with a focus on housing and additional revenue to support Fraternity programs. We have replaced our antiquated DOS-based management information system with a Windows-based system, offering on-line management for our chapters and brothers. We have expanded our leadership education by creating, in addition to our annual leadership school and many province leadership schools, seven regional leadership schools this February in Alban Albuquerque, Atlanta, Dallas, Fresno, I dianapolis, and Kansas City.

One challenge we face as an organization is how to successfully communicate the changes even as the implementation process necessitates further changes. We must educate and inform our brothers to how these changes improve their frate nal experience. We will do so through To Record, The e-Recorder, www.sae.net, and our dedicated volunteers and staff. Obrothers (and our friends) must be we informed and patient as we travel the uncharted waters.

The Supreme Council remains committed to the mission of Sigma Alpha E silon, a commitment which all brother must realize is for life.

In closing,  $\Sigma$ AE extends its deepe sympathies to the families of the fobrothers we know we lost and the other we may never know of, and to all the who were impacted by the tragic events September 11. I am proud of the responses of our chapters and the roles our alumniplayed in response to the attacks. True gentlemen, we were equal to the emergency.

#### True Gentleman for Life





# BUILDING PARTNERSHIPS AT THE NIC/AFA CONFERENCE

The Fraternity Service Center sent 11 staff members to Washington, D.C., November 28-December 2 for the North American Interfraternity Conference (NIC)/Association of Fraternity Advisors (AFA) annual meeting, "Building Partnerships." The NIC is an umbrella organization made up of 66 male fraternities, while the AFA consists of university administrators including Greek advisors, deans, vice-presidents, and graduate assistants. Chris Hancock, Assistant Executive Director for Region III, and Dan Brunnert, Coordinator of Educational Programs, presented on "social norming," while Mike McCrea, Coordinator of Educational Programs, served as an ambassador for the conference. ESR Tom Goodale served on a panel that discussed 25 years of good practice in Greek life. The conference allowed the assistant executive directors to speak directly with university administrators about our chapters' successes and challenges. Since the elimination of the Educational and Leadership Consultant program last spring and the transition to four regionally-based assistant executive directors, many people are evaluating ΣΑΕ's new model for chapter management. The response from attendees was overwhelmingly positive. Former staff member Steve Sikorski (SDSI '64) was nominated to the Association of Fraternity Advisors Foundation Board.

#### **EDUCATION ABOUT SEXUAL ASSAULT**

Sigma Alpha Epsilon is taking a proactive role in the fight against sexual assault, a major campus issue. The Fraternity Service Center sent Carter Jones, Regional Coordinator, to the 11th International Conference on Sexual Assault and Harassment on Campus the weekend of November 8 in Orlando, FL. The Men's Health Committee believes it is a priority to educate undergraduate members on the issue of sexual assault and factors related to it. The information and resources provided at this conference are helping the Fraternity Service Center develop a program to educate members on how to assist survivors of sexual assault. One of the key facilitators at the conference was Dr. John Foubert (VAKA '90),

whose men's program deals specificall with how to help women deal with th traumatic effects of a sexual assault. Th conference was sponsored by the Saf Schools Coalition, Inc., and had approximately 50 co-sponsors ranging from th Department of Justice to the Boys an Girls Clubs of America. JOINT HIGH PERFOR-MANCE TEAM MEETING (DECEMBER 8-9, 2001)

On the weekend of December 8, more than 40 brothers convened at the Levere Memorial Temple to discuss the operations of the Fraternity and the status of the strategic plan ("2006...and Beyond") at a joint meeting of the high performance teams (HPT). The high performance team con-

sists of province archons, an assistant executive director, and a Supreme Council liaison. There are currently four high performance teams that support the undergraduate chapters and alumni volunteers. All Supreme Council members were in attendance as well as 23 of the 29 province archons, the assistant executive directors, the Eminent Supreme Recorder (ESR), and other directors from the Fraternity Service Center staff. Bob Dickinson (MOAL '62, pictured) was invited by the Supreme Council to facilitate the sessions. Past ESA Bill Woods and Honorary ESA Bob Dutro also attended.

The weekend began Saturday morning with formal introductions and the objectives of the weekend which were to clarify certain facts about operations, have meaningful dialogue, create constructive action plans, and build consensus on communication strategies for the future.

The meetings began with the outlining of the culture and heritage of our order. This was followed by every member sharing his feelings on the most significant needs of  $\Sigma AE$ . ESR Tom Goodale provided a thorough review of the strategic plan and the role of our consultants (The Institute at Biltmore, formerly Mars Hill). Alan Sidman, Chief Financial Officer, provided an extensive PowerPoint presentation of all of the Fraternity and Foundation's finances, including the Fraternity Endowment Fund (FEF). This presentation was e-mailed to all attendees on Monday, December 10.



These presentations alleviated many concerns over the Fraternity's finances, particularly in light of the current stock market and decline in membership. Session #3 focused on operational roles and relationships, specifically

defining the role of province archons and how their volunteer responsibilities impact the assistant executive directors. The Supreme Council and ESR want to guarantee our structure supports our mission and the services we aim to provide our undergraduate chapters. The final session was dedicated to communication strategies for an association of our size. The communications questions were: who? what? how? and when? Sessions #3 and #4 met in break-out groups, organized by HPTs, to provide for open dialogue on the issues.

On Sunday, members of the FEF met to discuss the various initiatives (including the development of  $\Sigma$ AE Services) since the Orlando Convention. Trustees John Kelley, Tom Devine, Ron Doleac, and Lou Smith were present. Brad Cohen was conferenced in via telephone.

Packets provided to each attendee included an organizational chart of the Fraternity Service Center, an Official Family directory, a regional HPT map, a spreadsheet of chapters that had paid their liability insurance (106 chapters), a state of the chapters spreadsheet (see page 60), executive summaries for leadership school programming, The True Gentleman Initiative program, branding information, the HPT rosters, the goals and objectives of the strategic plan, and a document describing the culture of  $\Sigma$ AE.

The weekend accomplished the prescribed objectives and allowed for some true fellowship at the Levere Memorian Temple. Many thanks are owed to out dedicated alumni who took time away from their families and careers (especially during the holiday season) to participate in a weekend that will improve the support and services we provide to undergraduates. One Brother's Courageous Response to the Nation's Tragedy

The terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, have had an indelible impact of the United States and the world. People everywhere watched as passenged planes became weapons of mass destruction in New York City, Washington D.C., and Pennsylvania. Residents of the New York metropolitan area worldered what would happen next. People were just trying to escape Manhattan; imagine a 45-minute commute taking nine hours. There was a sense of powerlessness to make a difference or even contact friends and family as cell phone networks went down and land lines were severed.

et in the face of terror, danger, and unertainty, an amazing picture emerged. eople poured into New York City to help n whatever way possible. Men and vomen of the fire department, police deartment, and emergency services as vell as other uniformed personnel perormed the largest evacuation in history, reventing the tragedy from taking an ven greater toll. The city and country allied to help with a sense of communiy and selflessness that illustrated the trength and compassion of the Amerian people. Everyone who responded to he emergency and helped fellow Amerians on that terrible day (and the tragic nes that followed) demonstrated the reatest good of humanity in response to s greatest evil.

Sean Boutros (TXTA '94) has been living in New York City since completing dedical school at Baylor University in 1998. He is a plastic surgeon at Bellevue cospital on Manhattan's East Side.

Boutros shared, "I love what I do. Just being a doctor is good, but being a surgeon is better. It offers me the opportunity to be the best. Being a plastic surgeon can involve reattaching someone's leg, then a breast augmentation, then a breast reconstruction (due to cancer), then a rhinoplasty for face cancer, and finally a hand surgery. I operate from about 7 AM to 7-10 PM five days a week and am on call every third night. You have to love being a doctor because it is such a big part of your life and who you are."

Boutros had a great fraternity experience, which began as pledge-class president. The Fraternity has always played a large role in his life. "The Fraternity was the greatest way to develop that network of a family that supports you where and when you need it. I was in Grant Henry's (TXTA '94) wedding a few weeks ago, and I often see Alfonso Gonzalez (TXTA '97), a chapter brother who lives in New York. A friend from high school, Trey

Duncan (CAGA '95), went to the University of Southern California, and I had not talked to him in years. I saw Trey on the subway wearing ΣAE letters, and we reconnected instantly. I have received a lot of phone calls and support from brothers since they found out I assisted with the emergency response to the September 11 attacks, many of whom I had not spoken to in years. Their support means a lot." This support has become even more important in the wake of September 11, when all of Sean's training was tested and he witnessed first-hand the horrors that most people only saw on television.

"On the 11th, I was already in the operating room (OR) when one of the interns came in and said that a plane had hit the World Trade Center. When I realized he was serious, I told another intern to call all of my patients and cancel their cases because Bellevue is a big trauma center. The OR had already done so for everyone. I was about to wrap up the procedure and had an intern close for me and went up to the roof to see for myself to really believe it. Then the overwhelming desire to do something overcame me and I went down to the emergency room (ER)."

As was the case in many hospitals that day, there was no shortage of people ready to help, but unfortunately there were not many people to treat. The nature of the attacks and the massive size of the Towers meant that rescue operations would be short and mostly futile - but no one was ready to comprehend or admit that at the time. "Leon Pachter, the Director of Trauma, said that someone was needed at New York University (NYU) downtown hospital (a small hospital about five blocks from the World Trade Center) who knows hand and plastic surgery, so I volunteered. I was very familiar with the hospital because I had been chief resident down there about a year beforehand. All of the physicians going to help were loaded on a security van to be escorted down to the hospital. I got caught up taking care of something, and the van left without me, so I grabbed some additional supplies and took my motorcycle to catch up with them. I got to the hospital a few minutes before pa-

tients began to pour in – just as the first Tower fell. It was ironic that Bellevue, which was equipped for just such patients, was virtually empty while, due to its proximity, NYU downtown was swamped and had virtually no surgeons essentially the front bone in his skull had been separated from his head so he could not breathe. I was able to restore breathing with a tracheotomy - inserting a breathing tube directly into his wind-pipe - and place tubes in his chest to re-

rush, the ER became eerily quiet, as any other wave of victims did not come though the OR was still very busy. I went to check on the patients that I had treat ed once everything calmed down. As some point while we were working, the


or outfitting to deal with massive trauma. Most of the patients had minor injuries related to smoke inhalation, but there were quite a few serious injuries from the blast, fires, and shrapnel."

Typical of the response across the city, people at the hospital pitched in to do whatever was necessary to help survivors, regardless of rank or station. "As one of the few people with surgical and trauma experience, I was initially concerned with stabilizing patients in the ER and making sure they were sent to the proper places to receive the right treatment. Over about an hour and a half, I saw ten seriously ill patients: three who had fatal wounds, five critically injured, and two near fatal – both of whom I was able to save. The first of those patients had a Laforte 3 fracture

pair a collapsed lung. He came through okay. Another man had similar problems breathing, and I had to perform a similar procedure to save his life. He was a recently married security guard who I think is having a tougher recovery. One man I sent to the OR who was too injured to survive had been a few floors below where the plane hit. The force of the blast literally threw him across a room and hemorrhaged his lungs so badly he had no chance. I also treated a member of a New York Police Department Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) unit who had debris fall on his arm and rip it to pieces. All he could say was 'Where is the rest of my company?' and 'I need to get back out there,' but he was the only survivor from that unit. After that manic

second Tower collapsed, and there was smoke and soot everywhere."

At that point, many people began to realize that the hospitals would not gemuch more work - a source of frustration for rescuers, volunteers, and physicians "I went to the intensive-care unit to help where I could. When I was up there, the power went out. The back-up generators kicked in, but there were very tense seconds because all of those people are on ventilators, and then you have to choose the one person you will bag to keep breathing. After that, I met the family or one of the men I saved, who I did not think was going to survive because he was so badly injured. You just do not know what to say; they were relieved, but it was still a very sad circumstance. It was tough

o stay composed, but you cannot get pset or lose it in front of a patient or the amily. Being busy was definitely the best ning because then you do not have time to think."


"Later that evening a call came in that rescue team had found someone trapped ho would probably need a leg amputatd to escape. I was the only one at the hosital with experience, so I went down to round zero. Thankfully, the person nded up getting freed before I got there, that night a few doctors and I set up a iage center for rescuers and victims in ne ruins of one of the buildings. We were t the site until about 3 AM and then went ack to NYU downtown where there was ot much to do either - just minor triage or injured rescuers. The lack of activity lowed the exhaustion to catch up with ie - I crashed at the hospital for a few ours. In the morning, I went back up to ellevue, but there was unfortunately not such else to do. People in New York are lowly recovering. Things are getting ack to normal; people here are tough, at there are countless reminders. The wline just does not look right."

Boutros exemplifies "The True Gentleman," not just in his conduct on September 11, but also in his approach to life. He shared some excellent insight into our creed and its role in Sigma Alpha Epsilon. "The True Gentleman' should describe the men we choose to join our Fraternity; we should not select people who need it as advice. The brothers must look inside that 18-year-old and see whether he is a good person, not just evaluate him on his social prowess, whether he can drink beer and get laid which anyone can do. I am a fairly religious person. I was chaplain as an undergraduate, and there is a passage from Proverbs that sums this up: 'iron sharpens iron and steel sharpens steel. ΣΑΕs need to bring out the best in each other and keep finding those men of character that are described by 'The True Gentleman' as much as they still need to learn from it."

Though Boutros has not been able to do much else to help since September 11, the tragedy has stayed with him – and everyone. Boutros was featured on NBC television's Dateline on September 13 (as

well as a segment called "Heroes of Ground Zero" on The Learning Channel). "Howard Beaton, The Chief of Surgery at NYU downtown, contacted a friend at Dateline to suggest a feature on some of the positive things happening in response to the attacks, considering many of us were being overwhelmed with the negativity and horror of around-the-clock news. Howard had a few of us who he thought did a great job during the day talk to the reporters. This was before I went down to the Towers. I told the reporters, 'I work hard and a lot of hours to be good at what I do. When you look at someone you know is going to die and are able to step in and stop that, it makes all the years of sacrifice seem insignificant.' What I did that day is why I became a doctor." While his honesty spawned a nice line for the news and he knows he was just a man doing his job - not a hero - it is profoundly true that he represented his profession and his fraternity well under the most trying circumstances.

### Continues

It has been more than eight months since our brotherhood convened at the 145th Anniversary Convention in Orlando, Florida. Brothers endorsed a ten-year strategic plan ("2006... and Beyond") and were willing to provide the leadership that would assist with the implementation of the 11 goals. My review of the Fraternity Service Center's accomplishments for 2001 deals with the implementation of the strategic plan's five fraternity goals.

ith the dedication of many brothers, students, and alumni alike, and with the assistance of an outside strategic-planning firm, the Institute at Biltmore (formerly the Institute at Mars Hill), we are indeed on our "journey." In less than five years we will celebrate our 150th anniversary. Few organizations on the North American landscape can claim such a heritage. I share with you our goals and strategies for implementation.

### GOAL Restructuring ΣΑΕ to better serve

Restructuring  $\Sigma AE$  to better serve its constituency.

The magnitude of these changes is immense, but the impact it will have on the service to our undergraduates will be unparalleled. This restructuring includes a new regional infrastructure, which divides the Realm into four geographic areas and assigns approximately 50 chapters and seven provinces to an assistant executive director. We have selected four alumni brothers, all former province archons, to work fulltime in these regions.

The West coast, due to its vast size an amount of chapters, has a director to su port the efforts. The Education and Lea ership Consultant program has ended. served us well but it is now time to foc on customer service with a field operation utilizing experienced brothers, support by the staff at 1856 Sheridan Road. T regional paradigm mirrors our Suprer Council High Performance Team (HP concept and supports the province a chons in the management of chapters a alumni associations. We have also inve ed in two new management-informati systems: a member database (Avects and an accounting package (Great Plain that provides state-of-the-art technological for our business practices, enabling us communicate with our undergradua and alumni brothers effectively and e ciently.

Among the changes to our governi structure is the creation of a new entitentatively named "ΣΑΕ Services." Σ. Services will provide alternative reven to offset declining membership du ΣΑΕ's collegiate membership, like that most fraternities, declined in the 9

While our ultimate goal is to recruit more men to the  $\Sigma AE$  experience,  $\Sigma AE$  Services will generate additional income in the meantime and provide an array of services and products for our membership.

The Supreme Council holds financial responsibility over all assets. We have appointed Alan Sidman as the first chief financial officer in our history to stabilize our investments in the difficult market and play a leading role with the establishment of  $\Sigma$ AE Services.

We reduced our operating budget by 27 percent and reduced staff in order to live within our means. The staff, in concert with the Supreme Council and province archons helped collect \$1.1 milion owed by the chapters for annual dues, insurance premiums, and the filelity bond.

We continue to hold our chapters to high standards; the Supreme Council closed 15 chapters while opening six new ones in the last academic year. We remain aggressive in identifying new college and miversity campuses that embrace our deals and practices. We have colonies at the University of Texas at Dallas (Texas Chi), North Georgia College and State University (Georgia Delta), University of the Pacific (California Rho), Harvard University (Massachusetts Gamma), and ohn Carroll University (Ohio Beta).

Our undergraduate brothers contined to reap the benefits of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation's fundraising fforts. Thirty-seven brothers were warded scholastic loans during the fisal year, with the average loan being nore than \$4,500. Furthermore, many rior loan recipients have fulfilled their bligation to repay the Foundation - we ollected \$915,882 in principal and 174,456 in interest during the fiscal ear. Our default note is comparable to tudent loans at colleges and universies. In June of 2001, we awarded nearly 40,000 in scholarships to 23 deserving rothers who displayed academic, campus, and community leadership. An anonymous donor contributed monies for three scholarships focused on the performing, literary, and visual arts. Finally, of the 501 leadership school delegates in 2001, 209 delegates had their registration fees covered by Foundation scholarships totaling \$62,700. Ninety of these scholarships came out of endowed chapter educational funds, while another 119 came from one-time tuition gifts.

### GOAL

Design and implement a comprehensive chapter-development program capable of building a sustainable undergraduate enrollment.

The True Gentleman Initiative (TGI) was unveiled at the 66th Leadership School. The program evolved from the Minerva Project, which was developed by the member-education committee in 1999. Many fraternities have created character-development programs (i.e. Sigma Phi Epsilon's Balanced Man) to return the focus of the fraternal experience back to the founding values. The TGI is unique in that it covers all aspects of chapter operations (12 core areas), and still offers resources for personal development (The Portfolio). We currently have 18 partner chapters that are benefiting from the numerous resources the program offers, such as additional chapter visits, scholarships, recognition, and the website. The partner chapters have documented higher recruitment numbers, improved community relations, improved educational atmosphere, and a better understanding of the general expectations of membership. Our staff continues to focus on this evolutionary program by developing and providing resources for all  $\Sigma AE$  chapters. The TGI is truly a framework for chapter operations is web enhanced through www.truegentlemaninitiative.net.

### GOAL

Design and implement a comprehensive alumni development and retention program to support chapters.

The High Performance Teams were created two years ago and were introduced to efficiently address challenges and opportunities throughout the Realm. Four HPTs aid in the development of chapters, colonies, alumni associations, and house corporations. HPTs consist of a Supreme Council member, province archons, and an assistant executive director. HPTs have offered improved communication and quicker resolution to chapter crises. We continue to examine models and strategies to increase alumni involvement on all levels (it is proven that alumni involvement leads to chapter success). These models include using alumni staff consultants in the areas of housing, ritual, recruitment, and finances. The need for dedicated alumni to support our chapters in various capacities continues to be a major focus and challenge; we need your support to sustain our mission.

### GOAL



Establish the Fraternity Service Center to house administrative and communications function for its three operating units.

The newly titled Fraternity Service Center, in addition to housing the management-information system, will be customer-service driven. We will strive to fulfill the needs of our chapters and alumni from both the field and in Evanston. The communications department continues improving its goal of informing all brothers of the significant events and issues related to the Fraternity. The department won two awards this past year at the annual College Fraternity Editors Association. The department created a partnership with Neiger Design of

Evanston, which assists with the creative design for all printed materials. The impact of this partnership has been significant and is visible in all materials, including The Record. The Record, our main communications vehicle, underwent a complete redesign with the fall 2001 feature, "Living the Life of The True Gentleman." The department also launched a branding initiative based on our creed, "The True Gentleman." The new logo can be seen on all of our printed materials and products offered by our vendors. We are hopeful all members will embrace our creed and participate in activities that perpetuate "The True Gentleman."

The e-Recorder, the official publication of the Eminent Supreme Recorder, is sent to chapter presidents, chapter advisors, house corporation and alumni association presidents, and the Official Family. The e-Recorder was converted to an electronic newsletter. The e-Recorder is distributed September through May and provides the most thorough information on Fraternity activities. An alumni directory was also published in 2001 through Publishing Concepts. The last directory was published in 1996. The 2001 version is available in soft-bound, hard-bound, and CD-rom versions.

Our website, www.sae.net, continues to evolve and be a vital resource to all members. The site is being reviewed and will soon offer enhanced functionality. The Levere Memorial Temple continues to be the embodiment of Sigma Alpha Epsilon and the values we espouse. The Temple will continue to be the cornerstone upon which we build.

### GOAL

Design and implement a chapter and membership-development operation within Sigma Alpha Epsilon.

Our membership development continues to revolve around Leadership School. The 66th Leadership School was once again held in Chicago with more than 500 members in attendance. The 66th school included chapter meetings, general sessions, and a new program (men building) designed to challenge the undergraduates to lead with integrity and character. The chapter meetings allowed the delegates the opportunity to discuss topics that were of importance to them. Former Georgia State Representative Dan Ponder (ALA-M '76) spoke to the undergraduates about tolerance in their actions towards others and Mary Peterson of the University of Iowa challenged the students to live their lives with integrity and hold each other accountable. Will Keim, our interfraternal brother, focused on living our lives in congruence with our ritual and "The True Gentleman." Finally, two past leadership school graduates were inducted into the Leadership School Hall of Fame: Ernie Harms well (GAEP '40), the voice of the Detroion Tigers and member of the Baseball Halls of Fame, who told stories about everyone from Jackie Robinson to his uncle Lorent Foreman (past ESA), and General Richard Myers (KSBE '65), Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, who talked about how he incorporates "The Trust Gentleman" into his life every day.

A new and exciting aspect of leaders ship programming was our seven region al leadership schools throughout America. Positioned to be within four to five hours driving time of most of our chappeters, the schools were held on consecutive weekends in February. This was as expansion of our national leadership programming. Regional schools are confective for our undergraduates, and offer opportunities for local issues to be addressed. We see this as an idea that time has come.

Our strategic plan is a rolling vision that will take us to the 150th anniversary and beyond. We ask for your continues support and involvement at this historic time in our history. The staff has been enough the staff has been

Figure 1 shows general information for the big six group. The six organizations appear alphabetically. Information for chapters and initiates appears for each organization. Sigma Phi Epsilon has the most active chapters and colonies with 242 and 17 respectively. With 200 active chapters and 8 colonies, Sigma Alpha Epsilon appears close to the average for both categories.  $\Sigma$ AE has the most total initiates with 267,963, or slightly more than 10,000 more than next closest organization, Sigma Chi.  $\Sigma$ AE ranks third in initiates for the year with 3629 and initiated 1662 fewer than the leader, Sigma Phi Epsilon. While most organizations increased their initiates from the previous year, both  $\Sigma$ AE and Kappa Sigma decreased the number of initiates. For initiation rate,  $\Sigma$ AE ranked second with 88.06%, behind Sigma Phi Epsilon who initiated 91.27% of those pledged.



This chart compares the fees of the members of the big six. Overall, ΣAE has the highest total 4-year cost with \$545. Phi Delta Theta had the smallest with \$310 ΣAE and Beta Theta Pi have the highes initiation fees and pledge fees at \$200 and \$75 respectively. For annual dues, ΣAE is second highest, \$10 less than Sigma Phi Epsilon's dues of \$100. Half of the groups charge a chartering fee. Ce the groups that charge a chartering fee, ΣAE has the lowest fee with \$1500. With an annual fee of \$124, ΣAE charges the most for insurance.

Figure Full and part-time ternity and full-time foundation staff is shown in this chart. Overall, Sigma Phi Epsilon has the mos staff with 38. ΣΑΕ and Sigma Chi both have 35 staff members. ΣΑΕ has the third highest number of full-time fraternity staff with 30. Sigma Phi Epsilon has four more than ΣΑΕ and has the most full-time staff for the big six. Beta Theta Pi has the most part-time staff with 6. Sigma Chi has the most foundation staff members with 9.

Chapter housing and alcohol-free requirements are displayed in this chart. Sigma Phi Epsilon has 201 chapter houses, the largest number for the big six.  $\Sigma$ AE rank third with 168 houses, 19 fewer than Sigma Chi. All of Phi Delta Theta's 140 houses are alcohol free. Phi Delta Theta is the only member of the big six that has a staff person dedicated to alcohol-free housing. In addition to Phi Delta Theta both Sigma Phi Epsilon and Beta Theta Pi have alcohol-free expansion.



### **EAE** Foundation Scholarships

In the fiscal year 2001, Sigma Alpha Epsilon awarded nearly \$40,000 in outright scholarships to 23 deserving brothers who, over the course of their college experience, had displayed academic, campus, and community leadership. The newest of these scholarships were made possible by an anonymous donor who contributed \$50,000 that funds three scholarships for the arts, one each for performing, literary, and visual arts.

Scholarships and tuition gifts are also available for those attending ΣΑΕ's national and regional leadership schools. Of the 501 John O. Moseley Leadership School delegates in 2001, 209 (42 percent) had their registration fees covered in full by Foundation scholarships totaling \$62,700. Ninety of these Leadership School scholarships came out of endowed chapter educational funds, while another 119 came from one-time tuition gifts.



minds and skillful hands. Hundreds of earnest lives have toiled that the Levere Memorial Temple awaits dedication – a temple unique in the fraternity world, a monument in honor of our heroes who died for their country since 1856."

General Everson delivered these remarks at the dedication of the Levere Memorial Temple 70 years ago, and the Temple remains unique in the fraternity world.

To ensure the preservation of the Levere Memorial Temple and the artifacts it houses, the David A. LaVine Keeper of the Temple Fund was created, consisting initially of a gift from the estate of Brother David LaVine (MNAL '49). Since Brother LaVine's gift, 22 brothers (see box) have committed either an outright gift of \$25,000 or pledged to give \$30,000 over ten years. In recognition of their generosity, each brother in this select group has received a symbolic key to the Tower Room of the Levere Memorial Temple.

#### The Future of Preservation

When it comes to preservation, the  $\Sigma AE$  Foundation supports more than bricks, mortar, and shingles. Since its completion in 1930, the Levere Memorial Temple has served as a repository for hundreds of historic artifacts, books, photographs, manuscripts, and documents.

The Temple itself was conceived with an eye not so much to the future, but to the past. In fact, one of the Foundation's primary missions is to preserve the history of Sigma Alpha Epsilon.

After more than 70 years, the Foundation has carried forth its mission of preservation. Among the collection housed within the Temple's gothic walls can be found many of the most precious aspects of Sigma Alpha Epsilon's history; Noble Leslie DeVotie's writings, Billy Levere's correspondence, and John Moseley's diaries are just a few of the irreplaceable jewels that are carefully guarded in the Temple's rare book room.

Also in the collection can be found cultural, artistic, and historical artifacts significant not only to  $\Sigma AE$ , but to American and even world history, such as a signed copy of a limited-edition volume of William Faulkner's last novel, The

Reivers; a portrait of President William McKinley; famed crooner Rudy Vallee's first saxophone; and an extremely rare 1493 volume of world history known as the Nuremburg Chronicle.

For the historian, it is no doubt that such items are immensely valuable. "No history can be written without them," says Dr. Joseph W. Walt,  $\Sigma$ AE Historian.

While some leading cultural repositories have unclogged storage areas by disposing of thousands of artifacts, rare books, manuscripts, and newspapers, the Foundation is committed to preserving the Fraternity's cherished history.

Preservation of the collection is possible thanks to generous support of the  $\Sigma AE$  Foundation. Someday, when your greatgreat-great grandson is looking to find about some aspect of  $\Sigma AE$ 's history, he will have the opportunity to marvel at the fact that it was preserved – just for him.




