The team and I are focused on the four strategic objectives listed above to help drive and measure our progress.

We began the school year by reorganizing the Chapter Services Consultant coverage model to focus on chapter size versus geography. The purpose was threefold:

- Align our most experienced consultants with the largest chapters.
- Leverage best practices from like-size chapters.
- Provide a career path for our Chapter Services Consultants.

We also added two consultants to decrease the number of chapters in each module. This change enables the consultants to meet and work with their chapters twice a year versus once a year.

Additionally, we took the second step in our segmentation model by adding a new leader and two more consultants to the Chapter Services team. This team oversees chapters that contain less than 25 men and emerging chapters, providing much-needed support to SAE's smaller chapters. We added two more members to our Risk Management team to enable these consultants to identify and tamp down potential culture issues within a chapter before they become incidents.

The Supreme Council is committed to being a leader in risk management practices in the fraternal community. They commissioned, approved, and posted a position statement on risk management on SAE's website. This statement makes clear that the well-being of our members, guests, and their respective communities remains a top priority for our organization and outlines the desired outcomes of SAE's risk management program. We consulted Favor & Company, our insurance company, and fraternity peers to identify and adopt best practices, and we have proactively contacted our higher education peers to become better

partners. These initiatives have reduced SAE's incidents by 25% year-over-year.

The Fraternity Service Center took these actions to enable the TEAM to be more proactive, provide better support for our undergraduates, and allow us to focus on the aforementioned objectives.

## GROWTH AND RETENTION

Sigma Alpha Epsilon is generally considered one of the largest fraternities from both an undergraduate and alumni perspective. Today, SAE has roughly 13,300 undergraduate members and 253,000 living alumni members. The goal is for SAE to grow to at least 15,000 undergraduate members who remain engaged from initiation to graduation and then as alumni members and leaders.

## EDUCATION

The 86th National Leadership School held this past January set a post-COVID record in terms of individual attendees and chapters represented. Ideally, every chapter should send an undergraduate member to learn best practices from the staff, alumni facilitators, and their peer groups.

## RISK MANAGEMENT

As previously mentioned, we added more team members to our Risk Management team. The Risk Management team is working to develop a culture where undergraduate members feel safe, are a part of something bigger than themselves, and part of an environment where they can truly make a difference.

## ALUMNI ENGAGEMENT

Chapters with support from engaged alumni are far more successful than those without. They have fewer incidents, better institutional relationships, and benefit from historical knowledge of their past success. We aim for every chapter to have two advisors for every fifty undergraduate members.

I have no doubt we will continue to face hurdles, but I believe that with your continued support, our future is bright.

# GREETINGS BROTHERS,

Happy 169th Founders' Day to all the Brothers in the Realm! It is always refreshing around the spring semester to connect and celebrate the bonds of our Brotherhood. There are so many things in our corner of the Greek world to be proud of, I am honored to discuss a few one final time in The Record. What started as a challenging biennium with organizational changes, has turned into a year of accomplishments.

Leadership School was back in Chicago this past January and had great attendance. We saw 165 of our Chapters represented with 419 undergraduate men participating. These numbers are an increase over the last few years, and show a healthy growth in the right direction. More impressive than the numbers in attendance was the content of the program. Brother Dan Wenker (Penn State-University Park '81) spoke at the Levere Memorial Temple about his experiences mountain climbing, and how it led to self-discovery and inspiration for our men. In some great rotational sessions, presentations were heard from Quinn Moran on recruitment and Tom LaMantia (Arizona '87) on entrepreneurship. Lianne Kowiak shared a deeply touching account of losing her son to hazing with a

call of action to our men to rise above. Our amazing alumni faculty held breakout sessions with small groups, gave presentations, and guided so many meaningful discussions. The weekend closed with an inspirational presentation by past ESA Todd Buchanan (Southern Mississippi '90). Tying the event together so well was the magical music of Dr. Fred Phelps (Eastern New Mexico '64), who makes many of our events memorable!

In the spring, we had some exciting events. The SAE Foundation held the March to the Madness (M2M) fundraising tournament. This is an exciting inter-chapter competition that raises funds for the programming and scholarships our Foundation provides. Inner Circle was held in April, an elite experience for 30 of our top undergraduates. This year we had an exciting list of speakers who provided personal connections to the attendees, shared compelling stories, and provided unique growth experiences. The 48th SAE National Amateur Golf Tournament is in early May. This event is a lot of fun for golfers of all skill levels. My last-place finish in 2024 is evidence of the wide skill range of golfers!

In June, we will end our biennium in Atlanta, Georgia at the 169th Anniversary Convention. This is the largest meeting of our membership and is critical in shaping the future of the organization with by-law proposals and elections. I have been to nine Conventions over the years, and it's a special experience to participate in at least once in your life. Following our Convention is the Ritual Academy over the summer. This is a unique event in the Greek world. All Chapters should send representatives to the Ritual Academy as it strengthens the ties that bind us together.

As I sit here, contemplating my last few months on the Supreme Council, several things begin to cross my mind. First, how blessed I am to be able to serve my Fraternity over the last 27 years in multiple roles. How lucky I am to have crossed paths with so many amazing Brothers, friends, and SAE mentors who have helped guide and encourage me. I also consider the "why." Why have I volunteered so much of my life to the Fraternity? Has it been worth my time, talent, and treasure? Has the sacrifice of my personal time and time away from family been worth it? The resounding answer is YES. The answer is yes for so many reasons. I believe, in my soul, in the Mission and Vision of the Fraternity. When fraternity is done right it creates a space for men to learn to be in a community, have better mental health, serve others, focus on scholarship, develop leadership, learn to fail and succeed, hold peers accountable, gain access to lifelong mentors, and manage a small business just to name a few. These are amazing things to work on before you launch into the greater world, your relationships and your career.

Recently, I found inspiration in an old edition of The Phoenix. The writing was titled "A Creed for Sigma Alpha Epsilon," by Ivan Lee Holt (Vanderbit 1904). This 121-year-old message is fully relevant in 2025. In this piece Brother Holt talks about "My Fraternity!" and how important it is to take ownership of the Fraternity in order to

**My Fraternity!**

Each of those words can stir the heart! What is fraternity? It is brotherhood, and brotherhood is possible only where selfishness is subordinated to heart-felt interest in another man. But fraternity is more than brotherhood, because it is brotherhood with a purpose. It seeks ever to promote that fine thing we call loyalty! Loyalty to itself? Far more than that it means by loyalty. Amid life's conflicts there come sometimes clashes of loyalties, and a fraternity must teach its members in every such crisis to be loyal to loyalty! There are certain ideals of life, goals of living, which emerge each year one lives, and a fraternity in its fellowships, its ritual, its program is ever stressing them, and leaving in the hearts of its members a distressing dissatisfaction with petty, or selfish, or mean conduct. A fraternity is a brotherhood whose philosophy of life is loyalty.

**My Fraternity!** I can make a fraternity mine by saying: This day I will think of that other one who needs the clasp of my hand! This day I will know that all wisdom is not in my learning, and that I need to seek it from all sources I can find! This day I will remember that living demands honesty, discipline and straightforwardness! Suppose I will not say all this? Then the fraternity will be some one's fraternity—but it is not mine. My name may be on its roll but I have no right to call it *My Fraternity*.



When you can achieve this type of contribution, your name will not merely be on the roll of SAE, but it will truly be My Fraternity!

SAE's goal is to compel its members to report any issue or concern and prevent misconduct by offering a safe and private space that uses familiar communication tools. This service is managed 24/7, 365 days a year, by a member of the Risk Management Department, ensuring prompt responses to all reports.

Sigma Alpha Epsilon encourages all members to uphold Minerva's Shield and hold one another accountable to these standards. Risk reduction is a shared responsibility among all members. Together, using RealResponse, we can foster a safe and more responsible community guided by our shared commitment to risk reduction and member well-being.

# THE LEGACY OF JAMES GAMBLE NIPPERT

## A CENTURY OF BROTHERHOOD & DEDICATION

In the heart of the University of Cincinnati's campus stands a testament to the enduring power of brotherhood. Nippert Stadium, a centerpiece of Bearcat pride for a century, is more than just a stadium. It's a living memorial to a young man whose tragic story has inspired generations of students, athletes, and fraternity brothers. But perhaps even more significant to the brothers of Sigma Alpha Epsilon is another building which shares the same name: The James Gamble Nippert Memorial Lodge. This structure has been home to the Ohio Epsilon chapter for 100 years, and stands as a physical testament to the brotherhood's values and history.



### THE MAN BEHIND THE NAME

James "Jimmy" Gamble Nippert was a student at the University of Cincinnati in the early 1920s. A member of the Ohio Epsilon chapter of SAE and a center on the football team, Nippert embodied the ideals of scholarship, leadership, and athletic prowess that the university sought to instill in its students.

On Thanksgiving Day 1923, during a game against rival Miami University, Nippert sustained what seemed at first to be a minor injury—a spike wound to his leg. The game was played in miserable conditions, with driving rain turning the field into a muddy quagmire. The severity of Nippert's injury went unnoticed, masked by the mud and the adrenaline of competition.

What followed was a tragedy that would reshape the University's landscape and leave an indelible mark on the fraternity. Nippert's wound became infected, leading to blood poisoning. Despite efforts to save him, he passed away on Christmas Day, 1923. His reported last words, "Five more yards to go, then drop," became a poignant symbol of his dedication and perseverance.

### A FAMILY'S RESPONSE TO TRAGEDY

The Nippert family's response to this heartbreaking loss was extraordinary. Instead of retreating into grief, they chose to honor James's memory in a way that would benefit future generations of students, athletes, and brothers.

James N. Gamble, Nippert's grandfather and son of the Procter & Gamble co-founder, donated \$250,000 to complete the stadium that would bear his grandson's name. This generous gift ensured that the partially-constructed facility, which began development in 1915, would be completed and dedicated as a fitting tribute to James Gamble Nippert.

But the family's commitment to preserving Nippert's legacy didn't stop there. Judge Alfred K. Nippert (Cincinnati 1894) and his wife, Maud, gifted land and funds to construct the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Lodge, which would become the new home for the Ohio Epsilon chapter.

### THE BIRTH OF A CHAPTER HOME

The James Gamble Nippert Memorial Lodge, situated at 2707 Clifton Avenue, was dedicated on March 25, 1925. The lodge's location is no coincidence. It sits on an elevated position, with the main stairs leading directly to the main building of campus. This prominent placement has given SAE an elevated status on campus, both literally and figuratively, for the past century.



Architect Brother Clifford M. Stegner (Ohio Epsilon 1899) designed the Lodge, and the details of the original structure inspired much of the Lodge's design and function. Judge Nippert was very deliberate about every selection in the Lodge, from the terrazzo floors and travertine wall cladding to the custom light fixtures and stained glass in Chapter Hall featuring Noble Leslie DeVotie. The stained-glass windows are part of the DeVotie Hall addition, and the DeVotie Hall Association (est. 1910) serves as the house corporation for the chapter.



# THE LEGACY OF JAMES GAMBLE NIPPERT

The Lodge was designed specifically to accommodate Cincinnati students' co-op program. Brothers would be going to school for 10-12 weeks, then alternating with a work session for 10-12 weeks. Brothers slept at the end of the dormer hallways, called "Rack Rooms." The attic was designed for storage trunks, and the basement was designed for coal deliveries- quite the difference from the central heat common to our modern fraternity houses! The original third floor room was a common area library and "Radio Room"—the height of technology for the day.

The Lodge has expanded twice over the years—first with the George Kress Memorial Library in 1956, and then with the DeVotie Hall Addition in 2010. The George H. Kress Memorial Library had the amazing foresight to set foundations and structure to accommodate additional floors in the future—this made the 2010 addition possible without changing or destroying any of the existing chapter house. These expansions have always been made with an eye toward improving the brothers' collegiate experience while maintaining the architectural beauty that complements Cincinnati's campus.

The craftsmanship of the original 1925 structure shines through after thousands of Ohio Epsilon Brothers living there, including the original slate roof. Each addition was done with the same level of quality and expectation of longevity. The Nipperts set the highest expectations, and the Ohio Epsilon Chapter and DeVotie Hall Association will always strive to meet that bar.



## THE CORNERSTONE BOX: A BRIDGE BETWEEN PAST AND PRESENT

Perhaps the most intriguing aspect of the Lodge's history is the cornerstone box—a time capsule that has captured the essence of SAE's history at the University of Cincinnati for the past century. The cornerstone box, laid during the construction of the Lodge in 1924, has been a source of fascination and speculation for generations of brothers. Its contents, carefully preserved for 100 years, offer a tangible link to the fraternity's past and the era in which Jimmy Nippert lived.

The box was first opened in 1975, at the 50th-anniversary celebration of the Stadium and the Lodge. According to Mike Steur (Cincinnati '78), an attendee of the event, the box contains a wealth of memorabilia from the Lodge's early days. Among the items was a copy of the 1925 Record, newspaper articles on the cornerstone, and other details about the house dedication ceremony. These artifacts provide a window into the lives of the brothers who first called the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Lodge home.

The cornerstone box holds more than just historical documents. It contains the spirit of camaraderie that has defined SAE for more than a century. Each item represents the hopes, dreams, and experiences of brothers who came before, serving as a reminder of the fraternity's rich heritage and the responsibility current members have to uphold its legacy.



opportunity to touch history and reflect on the enduring nature of their bond. Saturday, March 8 saw a grand 100th Anniversary Celebration at the Cincinnati Masonic Temple. This event was a fitting tribute to a century of SAE excellence at the University of Cincinnati.



But the celebration didn't end with the opening of the cornerstone box. In keeping with tradition, a new time capsule will be created and dedicated at some point this year, to be opened by future generations of SAE brothers. This new box, filled with items representing SAE life in the 21st century, will carry forward the legacy of Jimmy Nippert and all the brothers who have called the Memorial Lodge home.

### THE ENDURING SPIRIT OF BROTHERHOOD

The story of James Gamble Nippert and the legacy he left behind is a powerful testament to resilience. It demonstrates how a tragic loss can be transformed into a force for good, inspiring generations of brothers to strive for excellence and maintain their resilience in the face of adversity.

For the brothers of Ohio Epsilon at the University of Cincinnati, Nippert's story is a constant reminder of the values they aspire to uphold. Each time they gather in the Memorial Lodge or cheer on the Bearcats at Nippert Stadium, they are connected to a legacy and a pedigree that spans more than a century, and as the living descendants of that lineage should continue to represent their chapter and their university proudly.

## LARRY JONES AND THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE CHAPTER HOUSE

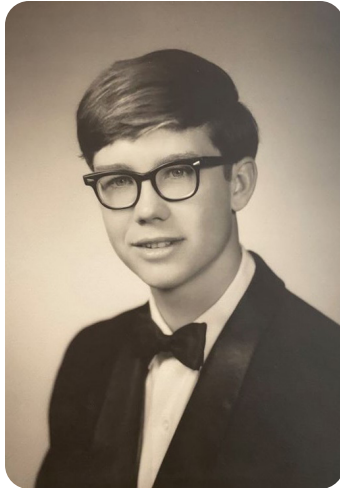

People are in constant search for a sense of belonging and a place to call home. For many during their undergraduate years, the SAE chapter house becomes a home-away-from-home, serving as a sanctuary to enjoy newfound freedom and develop the characteristics they need to succeed in life. But, for some individuals, the chapter house can quite literally become home.

Such is the case of Larry Jones (Mississippi State '71), an individual who embodies the spirit of Sigma Alpha Epsilon in his leadership, character, and humility. From a young man in search of belonging, to a leader helping shape the fraternity's future, his journey is a testament to the power of brotherhood, and how the chapter house reinforces that bond.

## FINDING ROOTS IN A TRANSIENT WORLD

As a son in an Air Force family, Larry's childhood was marked by constant change. "We lived all over the world," he recalls. "Japan, Germany, Morocco, Oklahoma, Michigan, Kansas, Mississippi, and California." This nomadic lifestyle left Larry craving a sense of stability and belonging, which he found when he joined the Mississippi Theta Chapter of SAE at Mississippi State in 1968.

"Mississippi State introduced me to a world of impressive young men and a way to develop roots in an organization and a community," Larry explains. Despite being unfamiliar with fraternities, he was drawn to SAE by the outstanding leaders he encountered on campus and friends in the Chapter from Columbus, Mississippi, where he graduated from high school.

Other interesting life experiences also welcomed him. In college, Larry worked multiple jobs to support himself, including waiting tables, building golf courses, driving delivery vans, working in retail clothing sales, and even making car tags. Yet, his most defining experience was two summers spent working on a railroad track gang in Shreveport—a job that tested his grit and broadened his perspective.

"It made a professional out of me," Larry reflects. "We repaired, laid, and took up track and repaired and built bridges among many other challenging projects" for over 10 hours a day in the Louisiana sun and in a bath of creosote. His coworkers, who Larry describes as men of steel, had worked for decades on the railroad. They encouraged him to stay in school and focus on his career goals, a lesson that Larry took to heart.

This challenging and rewarding experience instilled in him a deep appreciation for hard work and diverse perspectives. Through these and his other formative experiences, Larry developed resilience and self-reliance—traits that would become crucial when life presented its greatest challenge yet.

## A BROTHERHOOD BECOMES FAMILY

In 1969, Larry faced a major decision when his father was transferred to Castle AFB in California. He chose to stay at Mississippi State and with the Chapter. However, in 1970, tragedy struck when Larry's parents were killed in a car and train accident in California. In an instant, his world changed. With no physical home to return to, and

three younger brothers left needing direction, he became the head of a family now relocated to Shreveport and living with a relative.

"The brotherhood, particularly brothers Dean Oswalt, George Wilder, Lee Gallion, Bobby Arentson, Wayne Taylor, and Hoyt Hayes surrounded me during this challenging time," he reflects.

During this entire time, Larry's home was the SAE House. With the support of the brotherhood, Larry was able to stay on top of his studies, develop his professional skills, and keep his family on track, a feat almost unthinkable for a young man in his position. This experience deeply influenced Larry's commitment to SAE, transforming a personal tragedy into a lifetime of giving back to the organization that had become his second family.

After graduating from Mississippi State in 1971, and marrying Toodie Smith, a Little Sister of Minerva, Larry was commissioned as an officer in the Air Force and assigned to Barksdale Air Force Base in Shreveport. He and Toodie then worked to restore some normalcy to their lives, and the lives of his brothers. Two of those brothers would follow directly in Larry's footsteps, enrolling at Mississippi State and joining Mississippi Theta.



## LARRY JONES: THE PROFESSIONAL

After serving in the Air Force, Larry attended law school at The University of Mississippi and graduated with honors. He then began a decade of service in the Mississippi Air National Guard, serving as the State Judge Advocate General. He also began a decades-long journey, building a successful law practice as a Partner and Shareholder. He first worked with Watkins, Ludlam, Winter & Stennis, and later with Baker, Donelson, Bearman & Caldwell. On the homefront, Larry and Toodie welcomed three beautiful daughters into the family. Today, the Jones family has grown to five granddaughters and two grandsons.

But his path in life kept leading back to SAE, and he felt compelled to give back to the institution which had taught him so many lessons of friendship and brotherhood and supported him in his time of need.

# SOMEWHERE TO CALL HOME

## RETURN TO THE FOLD

This began with a simple appointment to the Mississippi Theta House Corporation, where he served in every leadership role from Secretary to President. His commitment grew even deeper in the early 1990s, when he joined forces with Johnny Ray ('86), another Mississippi Theta alumnus, to spearhead a major \$1.5 million renovation and expansion of the Chapter House.

When Larry reflects on what he hopes to achieve in his service to SAE, his focus always circles back to his time as an undergraduate. Larry explains that "I observed and learned the importance of friendship, brotherhood, and the necessity of leadership, standards, and accountability." Larry took these life lessons with him in his work with the Mississippi Theta House Corporation and the Chapter.

In these roles, he mentored many chapter leaders, and helped the Executive Board make responsible decisions and ensure the chapter's security for the future. While working with Mississippi Theta, Larry also came to more fully appreciate "the full scope of our Fraternity... and how the principles that we tried to instill at Mississippi State were universal."

His guidance and stewardship of the Mississippi Theta House Corporation and Chapter was recognized outside Mississippi. He was extended an opportunity by Charlie Boyd (Mississippi State '65), one of the great leaders of SAE, to serve on the Board of Directors for SAE Financial & Housing (F&H). He has served more than eight years and was the President for 3 years.

## THE IMPORTANCE OF CHAPTER HOUSES

One of Larry's key insights about the fraternal experience is the crucial role chapter houses play in the fraternal experience and its success. "The chapter house is a foundation for building the college, fraternal experience," he asserts. "And it is our job as alumni to ensure that this experience incorporates integrity and accountability." He has seen this first hand in his service to F&H's mission of owning, managing, and often saving chapter houses and providing a wealth of housing related services to the Realm.

Few people are as qualified to testify to the importance of the chapter house. During his work with F&H and Greg Somers (Michigan State '98), the long standing F&H CEO, and many committed Board members, F&H has invested millions in saving and preserving

chapter houses, and today owns 14 houses, manages another 14, with a market value in excess of \$78 million and provides services to over 2200 active members, ensuring that many future generations of SAE brothers have safe and productive environments to call home.

## FAMILY BONDS

Finally, Larry's impact on SAE extends to his own family. Two of his three brothers followed in his footsteps at Mississippi State and Mississippi Theta. Terry ('76), a recently retired maxillofacial surgeon, is now the President of the House Corporation and is a leader in contributing to the success of this outstanding chapter. Darrell Jones ('79), a recently retired USAF Lt. General (3 Star), was also a member of the Chapter and still supports SAE in Texas. And Darrell's son USAF Lt. Col. Taylor Jones also followed in the family SAE tradition at Mississippi State.

## WISDOM FOR FUTURE GENERATIONS

When asked what advice he would give to undergraduates and young alumni, Larry offers this:

**“TAKE THE TIME TO REFLECT AND ACT, DURING AND PARTICULARLY AFTER YOUR COLLEGE EXPERIENCE ON THE IMPORTANCE OF THE BROTHERHOOD AND FRIENDSHIPS YOU FOUND IN SAE, AND HOW IT WILL IMPACT YOU THROUGHOUT THE REST OF YOUR LIFE.”**

Larry and his family's story is more than a testament to the power of brotherhood—it's a reminder that leadership, service, and unwavering support define the SAE experience. His and his family's legacy stands as an inspiration, and a challenge to future generations to uphold these values and leave their own mark on the Fraternity.

# 86TH NATIONAL LEADERSHIP SCHOOL RECAP

Sigma Alpha Epsilon's National Leadership School now offers two separate tracks, each aimed at equipping our members with new skills they can take home to their Chapter once the weekend concludes. The Leadership Track, meant for general members, takes a big-picture look at fraternity leadership and a deeper dive into what it means to serve the Fraternity and our global community. It is an immersive learning experience in which collegiate brothers focus on building the skills needed to serve in any leadership role and build leadership competencies required to lead within the Fraternity, their community, and their professional roles. The Executive Track, designed for members with specific roles, focuses on increasing officers' understanding of their roles and responsibilities, team building, goal setting, strategy development, and implementation.

This year's iteration spanned four days and two locations. The schedule included small group activities and discussions led by the incredible team of facilitators, comprised of alumni volunteers and Fraternity Service Center Staff, as well as several large group sessions. Those general sessions allowed attendees to collaborate with peers and hear from speakers who addressed broader topics, led by industry leaders, accomplished alumni, and compassionate activists alike.



## DAY ONE

The foyers and corridors were buzzing with zeal as the undergraduates, clad in their future alma mater's colors, flooded the Marriott Chicago O'Hare while waiting to check in for the event. Even though rival colors clashed outside the Grand Ballroom, deep down, we were all loyal to the Royal Purple and Old Gold.

A bit of downtime before the 86th National Leadership School officially kicked off afforded ample time to meet this year's exhibitors. The SAE Foundation and SAE Financial & Housing were well represented. They lined up and were ready to form new connections with the undergraduates or reaffirm their commitment to one another. Three of our national service partners — November,

NMDP, and Children's Miracle Network Hospitals — were in attendance. Greekbill and Campus Collections rounded out the roster, with the latter providing an apt event t-shirt showcasing the Levere Memorial Temple encased in a snowglobe with the skyline of Chicago in the distance.

As everyone filed into the Grand Ballroom, Eminent Supreme Archon Mark McDonough (Youngstown State '98) warmly welcomed this year's attendees and performed the Opening Ceremony according to Sigma Alpha Epsilon's Ritual. Friday opened up with everyone donning their Leadership School Event T-shirt and a general session led by Dr. Spencer Long and Kevin Gath. During this session titled The Importance of Member Education, they explained the history behind how new members



joined Sigma Alpha Epsilon — from Newton Nash Clements to the True Gentleman Initiative — where they transitioned into the current Phoenix Member Education program.



The following “Chapter Meeting” built upon Dr. Long and Brother Gath’s session and allowed participants to look deeper into the Phoenix Member Education program with the expert guidance of our facilitators. The buses eagerly awaited their passengers in the hotel’s parking lot as the meeting continued. During this activity, the smaller groups were divided into four and given a specific lesson to research and teach, showcasing the ease, accessibility, and value of our Brother-to-Brother lessons. In appreciation for her efforts to end hazing by speaking across the country and collaborating with Congress to pass stricter legislation, Mark McDonough presented Lianne with artwork depicting the LMT's stained glass panel of Lucy Pattie. Following that touching moment, the Risk Management Team- Steadman Boston (Winthrop '17), Layne Smith (Winthrop '19), John Hatfield (Arkansas-Little Rock '77), and Madison Simmons- led a session on Health, Safety, and Accountability, addressing real-world problems that our chapters have faced. Additionally, we launched our partnership with RealResponse, a confidential platform designed to enhance safety and accountability by providing members and guests with an anonymous way to report emergencies, crises, or general concerns.

Some exciting announcements accompanied that night's dinner. Our very own Director of Education, Hannah Blenden, was honored with the Order of the Violet Award for her outstanding contributions to the team. The Order of the Violet is given to the women in our lives who have shown commitment to the Fraternity and its mission through actions, support, involvement, or volunteer effort, demonstrating loyalty and service to Sigma Alpha Epsilon. To celebrate Hannah, the gentlemen in the room serenaded her with the timeless Violets from one knee.

Once desserts were served, Tom Killian (Indiana State '99), President and CEO of the SAE Foundation, announced that the SAE Foundation raised an impressive \$4,040 for the Annual Loyalty Fund at Leadership School. This fundraising initiative included donations from 129 new members of the Phi Alpha Club, an exclusive undergraduate giving society. Alex Pavic (Gettysburg) was the lucky





winner of the vintage SAE Badge giveaway that was generously donated by Dave Griego (New Mexico '83). A big thank you to all the attendees who donated to be a part of this special effort.

The evening continued with another "Chapter Meeting" centered on the theme of communication; the facilitators began the session with a great activity where the groups were divided once again and given LEGO sets to build. There was a caveat, though. Each group had their ability to communicate altered or taken away completely. Others did not even receive instructions, cementing the idea that you need a blueprint to follow to accomplish most things. Once the LEGOs were picked up and put away, the groups began to break down effective communication skills needed to run a chapter and recruit new members. The night transitioned into the final general session of the weekend headed up by Dr. Anthony Mack (North Florida '11) and Cullen Kerigan (Western Carolina '22). Dr. Mack and Brother Kerigan instructed the men on SWAT analyses and SMART Goals, setting the table for the next "Chapter Meeting" named Action Planning that followed. Action Planning helped the undergraduates take everything they learned throughout the weekend and make goals to help improve their chapter once the new semester begins.

A full day came to a close once again in the River Room with Kevin Gath and his final installation of "SAE Stories, Myths, and Legends" taking us through the different generations of Sigma Alpha Epsilon, showcasing how far we have come and just how excited we should be for the future of our Fraternity.

The final day of the 86th National Leadership School came to a close, but not before this year's keynote speaker addressed the undergraduates. Past Eminent Supreme Archon Todd Buchanan (Southern Mississippi '90) shared his journey, starting as a young man in Mississippi working for everything he had. Todd emphasized the impact SAE had on him during his formative years and beyond as

he joined the workforce. Buchanan has had a decorated experience as a member and was awarded the Distinguished Service Award #130 in 2011, the highest achievement award that can be bestowed upon a brother. Todd continued with the lessons he has learned as an executive, giving the attendees some great perspective on life after college.

As a final act, ESA Mark McDonough wrapped up the event with a heartfelt Closing Ceremony according to Sigma Alpha Epsilon's Ritual, leading to a boisterous SAE Yell to bellow towards the rafters and likely wake up anyone who slept through their alarm.

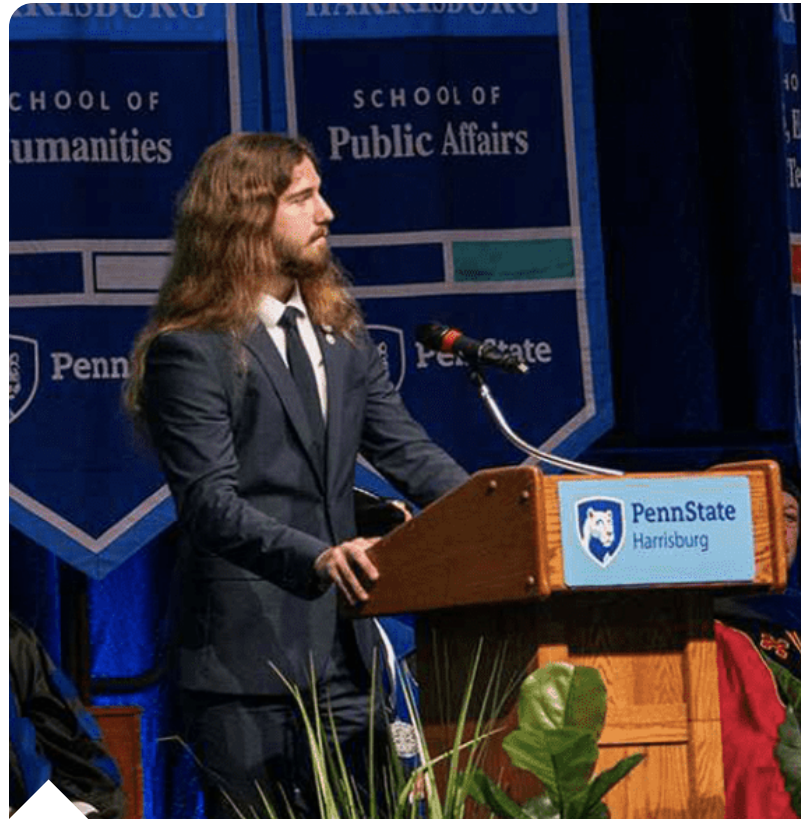
## ILLINOIS 125TH ANNIVERSARY

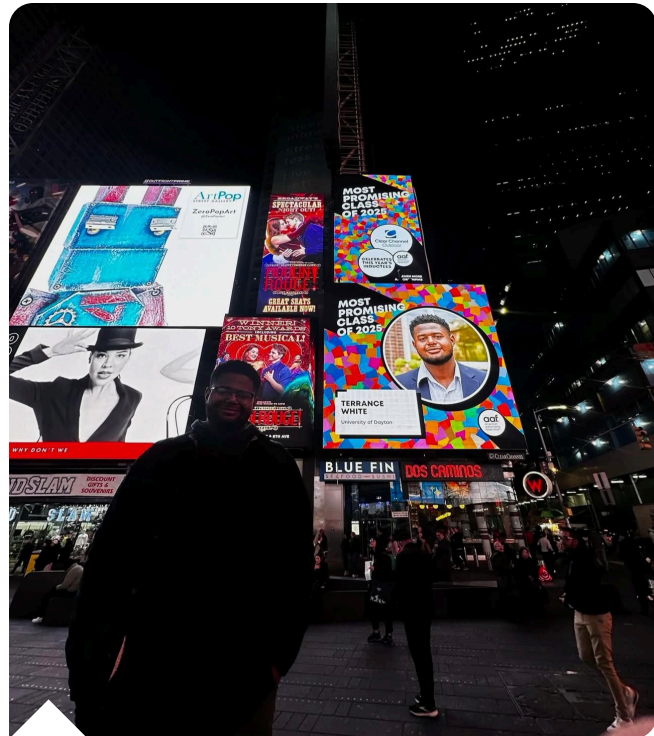
## 50 YEARS OF HUNTING & BROTHERHOOD

# LEVERE MEMORIAL TEMPLE

## CENTENNIAL SERIES: HONORING THE PAST, INSPIRING THE FUTURE

For 169 years, Sigma Alpha Epsilon has upheld the values of friendship, scholarship, leadership, and service. Today, these ideals are nowhere more clearly embodied than within the walls of the Levere Memorial Temple (LMT), a Gothic-style structure (now the seat of the Fraternity's operations in Evanston, Illinois) erected between 1929 and 1930 as a lasting tribute to the Fraternity's members who served their country during World War I (and other wars). While the LMT was born from a deep desire — perhaps even a duty — to honor Brothers who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country, its founders ensured that its purpose would extend far beyond remembrance.

At the 70th Anniversary Convention held in Boston, Massachusetts, in December 1926, the Supreme Council established the Levere Memorial Foundation of Sigma Alpha Epsilon (now known as the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation). The Levere Memorial Temple was so central to the Supreme Council's vision for the SAE Foundation that its first three "Objects and Purposes" were dedicated solely to defining and preserving the LMT's role within Sigma Alpha Epsilon for generations to come.



### 1. TO ERECT AND MAINTAIN A MEMORIAL TEMPLE IN HONOR AND MEMORY OF MEMBERS OF SIGMA ALPHA EPSILON WHO SERVED THEIR COUNTRY ON LAND OR SEA AND RENDERED OTHER DISTINGUISHED AND PATRIOTIC SERVICE.

The Levere Memorial Temple's genesis traces back to World War I's aftermath. In June 1919, during the 63rd Anniversary Victory Convention in Buffalo, New York (the first post-war SAE Convention), an exploratory committee was formed to create a memorial honoring SAE members who died in the war. This initiative, led by William C. Levere (Northwestern 1897), culminated in the designation of an exploratory committee to establish the LMT. Now, nearly 100 years later, the LMT still stands — in memory of those same Brothers who gave their lives for their country.

In its early years, visitors used the Peace Chapel in the LMT as a site to honor those who died in World War I. Since then, its purpose has expanded, and additional memorials have been added to the chapel to honor Brothers who died in the Civil War, World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, the Persian Gulf War, and those who perished on 9/11 and in the resulting conflicts in Afghanistan and Iraq. Additionally, another memorial honors Brothers who served as law enforcement officers.

### The LEVERE MEMORIAL FOUNDATION of SIGMA ALPHA EPSILON

#### OBJECTS AND PURPOSES:

1. To erect and maintain a memorial temple in honor and memory of members of Sigma Alpha Epsilon who served their country on land or sea and rendered other distinguished and patriotic service.
2. To maintain therein a memorial chapel, a library, museum, and archives.
3. To preserve documents, war records, works of art, and related objects for the encouragement of historic research, particularly as to the history of education and college organizations.
4. To establish and grant scholarships and loan funds to worthy and needy students in various universities, colleges, and other institutions of learning.
5. To receive funds, donations, bequests, legacies, endowments, and gifts, both real and personal for the furtherance of the objects and purposes of the Foundation.





**2. TO MAINTAIN THEREIN A MEMORIAL CHAPEL, A LIBRARY, MUSEUM, AND ARCHIVES.**

To this day, the memorial Peace Chapel is adorned with brilliant, themed stained glass windows crafted by renowned artist Louis Comfort Tiffany. These windows are portals to moments in time, illuminating the chapel's walls, which are bedecked with artwork depicting instances from the Fraternity's past.

The chapel's vaulted ceilings, stone archways, and dark wood interior lend themselves to an atmosphere of solemn reverence and quiet reflection. Rows and rows of wooden pews extend toward the altar, guiding the eye to the intricate stained glass window that bathes the chapel in colorful light. Delicate chandeliers hang from the ceilings, illuminating the rich stonework and elaborately painted walls.

To embellish the Chapel's interior, Judge Alfred K. Nippert (Cincinnati 1896), who served as Chairman of the Building Committee for the Levere Memorial Temple, sought out Johannes Waller (Northwestern 1936), a German painter from Munich, bringing him to America to work on the Peace Chapel and other murals throughout the building. Over the course of nine years, Waller and an assistant meticulously transformed the space, using imported German paints, to create the breathtaking designs that are still visible in the chapel space today. Adding to the grandeur of the space, at the base of the ceiling arches, twelve carved solid oak busts guard the space. Designed and sculpted by Chicago artist Joseph Dux, these solemn figures represent soldiers from all American wars.



**3. TO PRESERVE DOCUMENTS, WAR RECORDS, WORKS OF ART, AND RELATED OBJECTS FOR THE ENCOURAGEMENT OF HISTORIC RESEARCH, PARTICULARLY AS TO THE HISTORY OF EDUCATION AND COLLEGE ORGANIZATION.**

For a Fraternity as distinguished and historically rich as SAE, the addition of the aforementioned library, museum, and extensive archives to the Levere Memorial Temple was essential. The LMT houses a vast collection of memorabilia—including badges, letters, portraits, and personal effects from some of the Fraternity's most notable members. Among the pieces stored are the shovel used at the LMT's groundbreaking ceremony in 1929, Lucy Pattie's original headstone, William C. Levere's YMCA uniform from World War I, and the Deagan Tower Chimes player. The library contains an extensive collection of scrapbooks that document the unique history of each chapter, featuring photographs, newspaper clippings, composite photos and personal accounts from Chapter Brothers. If an SAE wrote a book, it is likely that the library holds a copy.



Objects Four and Five, while not directly related to the Levere Memorial Temple itself, have played a crucial role in sustaining both the SAE Foundation and the building over the years.

### 4. TO ESTABLISH AND GRANT SCHOLARSHIPS AND LOAN FUNDS TO WORTHY AND NEEDY STUDENTS IN VARIOUS UNIVERSITIES, COLLEGES, AND OTHER INSTITUTIONS OF LEARNING.

By providing scholarships and loan funds, the SAE Foundation has supported generations of students in their academic and leadership pursuits by helping to ease the financial burden of higher education. For example, some funds from the SAE Foundation ensure that students from Chapters across the country are able to attend Leadership School, frequently held at the LMT, ensuring that members are able to interact with the building and situate themselves within its history.



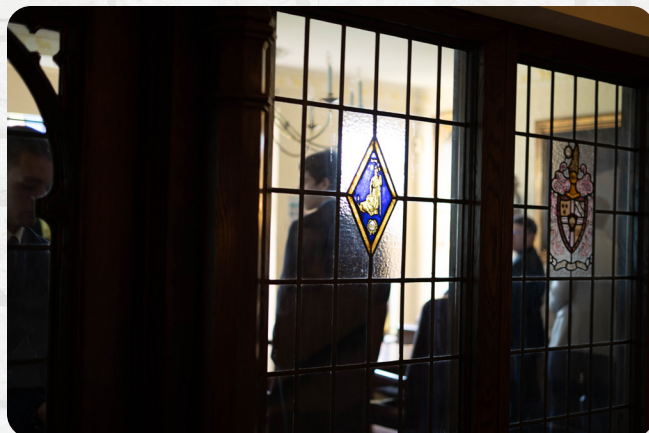
### 5. TO RECEIVE FUNDS, DONATIONS, BEQUESTS, LEGACIES, ENDOWMENTS, AND GIFTS, BOTH REAL AND PERSONAL FOR THE FURTHERANCE OF THE OBJECTS AND PURPOSES OF THE FOUNDATION.

The 64th Anniversary Convention held in St. Louis, Missouri, in December 1920 moved to professionalize the Fraternity, designating, among other things, the National Endowment Fund, which henceforth made it possible for the Fraternity to ask alumni for donations. As Americans all across the country entered a period of recovery coming out of World War I, donations began to pour in from

SAE members across the country. No part of the Levere Memorial Temple that exists today would be possible without the generosity of donors who recognize the importance of preserving and enhancing the legacy of Sigma Alpha Epsilon. Through endowments, gifts, and contributions, supporters help maintain the LMT's mission and ensure its halls continue inspiring and educating for years and years to come.

# THE ART OF APOLOGY

We all make mistakes. That is how we learn. So why is it that we cannot make a perfect apology? I thought I would offer up my belief of what makes a perfect apology.

A perfect apology, in my mind, has five required components:

1. Saying you are SORRY.
2. Acknowledging you made a mistake.
3. Asking for forgiveness.
4. Stating what YOU learned from YOUR mistake.
5. Asking, "Do you have anything that might add to what I learned from this mistake?"

## KEEP IT SINCERE, GENUINE, AND TO THE POINT

The more you try to explain the reasons for your mistake, the more it depreciates the value of the apology to the other person. Sorry means you're going to work damn hard at not letting it happen again.

## OWN YOUR MISTAKES

You are not a victim of circumstances or anything else, nor are you expected to be perfect. Like the first, acknowledge your mistake and keep it sincere, genuine, and to the point. Mistakes are different from failures. I read once: "A mistake is a wrong action, while failure is usually the result of a wrong/bad action. For example, you failed the test because you made mistakes on the test. While a mistake can be fixed, you cannot fix a failure; you can only learn from it."

Although they are different, it can be said a mistake, like a failure, is worse if no one learns from it. I like to think mistakes like failures are unplanned outcomes. Some can be epic. Good or Bad. I have heard the 3M Post-it note glue came from a failure to make a super strong

adhesive. Now, that is an unplanned outcome and good epic mistake! Many mistakes throughout our history have led to significant discoveries.

Being an entrepreneur is a never-ending battle of unplanned outcomes or, more succinctly, unplanned and unforeseen experiences. Making mistakes and failures is how we learn; some mistakes have excellent outcomes. Some do not, but many inevitably become notable examples and learning opportunities for others. This becomes wisdom we can glean from other people's mistakes and successes.

## ASK FOR FORGIVENESS

An apology is not truly complete or accepted if the receiver is still unwilling to forgive. Sometimes, it can take years for the apology to complete. That is the responsibility of giving them, so do not expect this to come easily or on your schedule. It could be a lifetime. Sometimes, it never comes. Still, an apology is the right thing to do. It is not a sign of weakness but of strength of character.

## STATE WHAT YOU LEARNED FROM YOUR MISTAKE

Think about it before you speak. Be succinct in delivery. Most importantly, do not try to tie it to an explanation of why it happened. Again, defending and explaining why you did what you did depreciates the quality.

## DID YOU MISS ANYTHING

Ask the party you believe you wronged if you missed anything in what you learned, or if they too have wisdom on the issue. Sometimes, this question prompts others to forgive faster as they feel you are giving them a voice and truly acknowledging the mistake. Most important is to listen genuinely to their perspective. Who knows, you might learn something very useful.





# LILY'S CLASSIC

## BOOT HOCKEY, BROTHERHOOD, AND A LEGACY ON ICE

By the time February arrives in Madison, Wisconsin, the city has transformed into a winter wonderland. Lake Mendota freezes solid, students bundle up in layers of red and white, and the anticipation mounts over at the Wisconsin Alpha Chapter house. For the past decade, SAE at the University of Wisconsin-Madison has proudly hosted Lily's Classic—a boot hockey tournament that brings hundreds onto the ice each winter, all for a cause close to their hearts.

Ten years ago, Lily's Classic began as a modest fundraiser in honor of Lily Giroux, a young woman with epilepsy. Her story resonated deeply within the chapter and the undergraduate population at University of Wisconsin, and it propelled people to act. An active brother at the time stepped up to honor her, organizing a small fundraiser to support Lily's Fund, her family's charity supporting epilepsy research at UW-Madison.

## THE ATMOSPHERE IS ELECTRIC; MUSIC BLASTS THROUGH SPEAKERS WHILE SPECTATORS CHEER LOUDLY FROM SNOWBANKS LINING EACH RINK.

SAE converts their backyard beach into two full-sized hockey rinks enclosed by chain-link fencing extending nearly 100 yards out onto frozen Lake Mendota. The atmosphere is electric; music blasts through speakers while spectators cheer loudly from snowbanks lining each rink. Teams from within the Chapter and other Greek organizations eagerly compete for bragging rights while raising money for a great cause.



Today, Lily's Classic is more than just another SAE event—it's become part of Madison's cultural fabric. Each year, hundreds of students and community members gather behind SAE's iconic lakeside house for an unforgettable afternoon of boot hockey and philanthropy, and one which exemplifies the power of brotherhood and the mission of SAE perfectly.

### BOOT HOCKEY: A CRASH COURSE

Boot hockey isn't your typical ice sport. Forget skates or pucks—participants play in boots with tennis balls instead, leveling the playing field so anyone can join in.

"It allows people that have never touched a hockey stick to be able to play and have fun," explained Chapter President Ben Huie.

### SETTING THE STAGE FOR THE CLASSIC

Months before the first tennis ball drops onto the ice, SAE brothers are already hard at work. Planning begins each summer as brothers work collaboratively with the university to ensure compliance to all health and safety guidelines. The brothers must also secure sponsors, vendors, merchandise, and donations from local businesses to fund the event. Younger fraternity members referee games on event day, while Chapter Leadership coordinates security logistics and vendor interactions—ensuring everything runs smoothly.

After last year's disappointing cancellation due to unsafe ice conditions, anticipation for Lily's Classic 2025 was at an all-time high. Philanthropy Chair Alex Orman admitted that missing last year was "a pretty big damper," affecting both morale and fundraising efforts significantly. But this year's triumphant return marked a welcome comeback.

### GETTING BACK TO TRADITION: LILY'S CLASSIC 2025

The event drew nearly 850 attendees inside SAE's fenced-in rink area alone—with hundreds more sprawling across frozen Lake Mendota beyond their property line. Through player fees from boot hockey teams, merchandise sales, sponsorships from local brands like Bubbler beverages, and generous GoFundMe contributions, Wisconsin Alpha raised more than \$12,000—a remarkable achievement by any measure. While the final tally on donations is still being determined, providing a five-figure donation to such a good cause fulfills the spirit of the event and demonstrates the benefit it brings to the UW Community.

Beyond fundraising numbers, there is something even more meaningful about this event: Lily's Classic has become woven into Madison's culture. It's not just another Greek-life event; it's become an integral part of campus culture—a tradition students look forward to each winter as much as football Saturdays or spring break trips.

"I can't name that many universities who can have a party on a lake for a good cause," said Philanthropy Chair Alex Orman.





campuses: "It would be amazing if we could spread it out all over—maybe collaborate with other SAE chapters like Minnesota or elsewhere—each putting their own unique twist on Lily's Classic."

This ambition underscores what makes Lily's Classic special: blending philanthropy seamlessly into social traditions unique to Wisconsin—and doing so in honor of someone whose legacy continues inspiring positive change.



Its widespread adoration may seem surprising to some, but not to the brothers of Wisconsin Alpha. For them, this is a tradition that combines the best aspects of fraternity life: Giving back to the community and having a great time with the brothers. Orman believes this dual-purpose approach motivates students across campus: "A lot of people are motivated to do something fun and give back to the community at the same time."

### PRESERVING A TRADITION: LILY'S CLASSIC GOING FORWARD

Looking ahead, the next phase for Lily's Classic will focus on maximizing fundraising potential while ensuring the event doesn't negatively impact UW or Madison at large. This partnership between fraternity, university, and the city of Madison is something the chapter remains committed to preserving. While the current system in Madison is working, Orman dreams ambitiously about collaborating with other SAE chapters across Midwestern

Ultimately though—as Orman sums up perfectly—the real victory isn't measured solely by dollars raised or tournament standings:



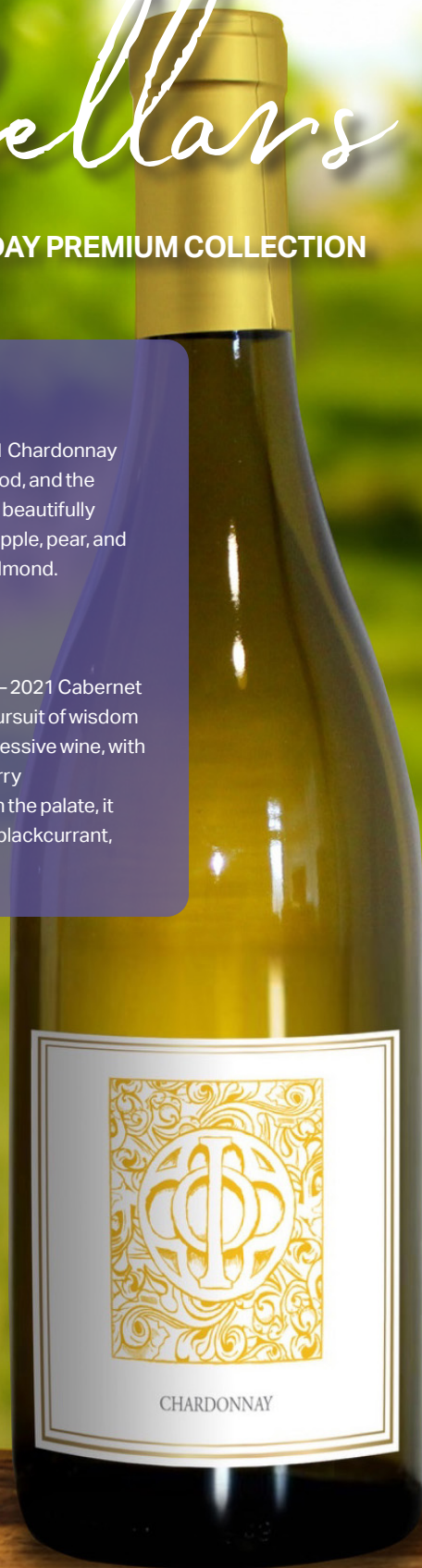

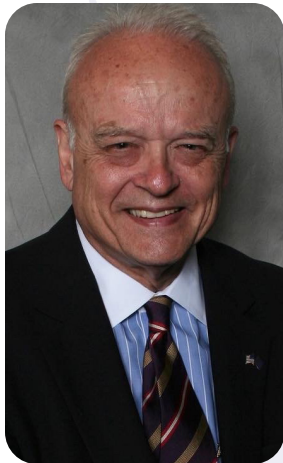

## DR. THOMAS "TOM" G. GOODALE (IOWA STATE '62)

Dr. Thomas "Tom" G. Goodale, Past Eminent Supreme Recorder, accomplished higher education administrator, and Loyal Son of Minerva, entered the Chapter Eternal on January 5, 2025, at the age of 84.

Brother Goodale joined SAE in 1960 at Iowa State University (Iowa Gamma), following in the footsteps of his brother, Bob Goodale (Iowa State '55). After graduating from Iowa State, he would earn a Master of Arts from Michigan State University and a Doctor of Philosophy from Iowa State. His higher education career would lead him to serve as the Director of Orientation at Michigan State University, Assistant and Associate Dean of Students at Iowa State University, and Dean of Students at the University of Florida before serving as Vice President/Chancellor at the University of Denver, Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, and American University. He served as the 10th Eminent Supreme Recorder from 2000 to 2007 and as Executive Director of Omicron Delta Kappa from 2009-2012.

The Fraternity recognized Dr. Goodale with the Order of Minerva, Merit Key Award, and its highest recognition, the Distinguished Service Award (#104), for his unwavering commitment and dedication. He was also recognized with the Gold Medal by the North American Interfraternity Conference in 2022 for his lifelong service to the interfraternal community.

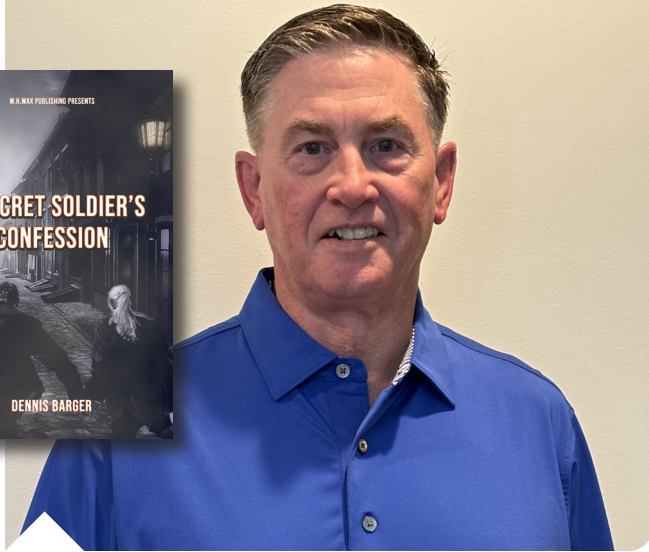

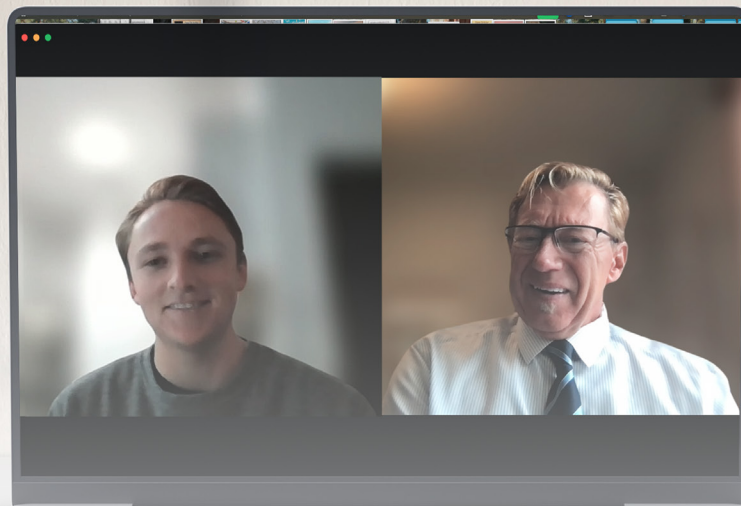

# SAE'S TRUE GENTLEMAN MENTOR PROGRAM

## FOSTERING CONNECTIONS AND GUIDING BROTHERS TO SUCCESS BEYOND THE CHAPTER

Slechta, a longtime educator and dedicated SAE member, first became involved with the True Gentleman Mentor Program after years of volunteering at Leadership School and other Fraternity educational initiatives.

Zukowski, a then senior finance student at the University of Florida navigating his entry into the workforce, benefited immensely from Slechta's practical support and career advice.

The True Gentleman Mentor Program continues to foster personal and professional growth for members within Sigma Alpha Epsilon.

Mentor Scott Slechta (Simpson '80) and Mentee Joey Zukowski (Florida '24) are prime examples of how the True Gentleman Mentor Program continues to cultivate meaningful relationships and provide valuable guidance during pivotal career transitions — beyond an individual's time as an undergraduate member.

The SAE Foundation contacted Slechta and asked him to participate in the endeavor. Though his first mentee was a no-show, fate quickly intervened, and he was paired with Zukowski, a then-senior at the University of Florida, seeking post-graduation opportunities.

Slechta's background in communication as an education ambassador in the U.S. and his many years as a teacher allowed him to individualize his guidance, offering help with resumes, interview

skills, cover letters, and more. His reason for getting involved with the program? "I wanted to give back to the Fraternity — a Fraternity that gave me so much."

"It was very resourceful to have Scott by my side the whole time and help me with anything I wanted — but not just with things I wanted help with — he also brought ideas and options that I hadn't thought of," Zukowski said of Slechta's mentorship method.

"I served more as a facilitator, using sort of a Socratic method," Slechta, who was the 2016 Iowa Teacher of the Year, explained, emphasizing how he helped Zukowski by asking questions and encouraging him to arrive at his own conclusions rather than taking his word for it. This approach highlights the True Gentleman Mentor Program's flexibility, which allows alumni like him to tailor their advice to the unique needs of each mentee. "I always wanted to make sure I got his voice into it," Slechta said, recalling how he helped Zukowski craft a resume that reflected his individuality while still making strategic, experience-based suggestions.

For Zukowski, it wasn't just the practical help he received from Slechta that made the program worthwhile — it was also the emotional support he received that helped him navigate the inevitable challenges and setbacks that come along with a job search.

"He faced a lot of rejection, and that's okay—it's part of being human. Sometimes I was just a sounding board for his frustrations," Slechta said, acknowledging the emotional toll that the job search can take on young students and professionals. Despite these setbacks, Zukowski's perseverance paid off, landing him his dream job in finance — a moment of triumph for both mentor and mentee.

"It came to, literally, graduation week, and I still didn't have a job I wanted. And finally, the day of graduation, actually, as I was walking over to my graduation, I get a phone call... They said, 'We're offering you a job!'"

Reflecting on their time working together, Slechta expressed pride in Zukowski's accomplishments.

"It was neat to work with him because of his enthusiasm and his self-motivation. He was set for success, except for those few setbacks," Slechta said. Zukowski's proactive approach to their meetings—whether scheduling regular check-ins or seeking advice when he faced challenges—demonstrated his drive to succeed.

While Zukowski's career success is a clear outcome, the relationship had a deeper, personal impact on both. "It made me feel good, like I was making a difference," Slechta said, noting their bond continues beyond the formal program, with Zukowski checking in periodically to share updates — a testament to the Fraternity's commitment to lifelong learning and meaningful connections.

For Slechta, mentoring Zukowski was rewarding, and he plans to continue with the Foundation. "If they get ahold of me, I'll say sure!" Slechta said about the program.

I obviously want to return what was given to me and help out people in the future."
